Call to Order

At 9:32 am, Chairman Dodson called the meeting to order.

Approval of Agenda

Services Report

Sarah Mitchell resigned effective March 13, 2023. Before leaving she closed most of her cases leaving only 2 CPS investigations. Mr. Austin informed the Board of a former foster child who would be getting released from prison in April who would hopefully be eligible to receive a small amount of state funding. This could help the soon to be 21 year told purchase food, clothing, and other basic maintenance supplies. Sarita Emmons was promoted to a Family Services Specialist III and it would be taking effect April 1, 2023.

Benefits Reports

Tiffany Lee presented a breakdown of all caseloads for each benefit worker in February. Each worker's caseload was broken into program so the Board could see exact case counts. Ms. Lee also informed the Board that 2,232 Clarke County residents currently receive Medicaid. The benefits department is currently undergoing staffing changes and preparing for the unwinding. Ms. Parker thanked Ms. Lee for her and the rest of the benefit team's continuous dedication to assisting Clarke County residents.

Director's Update

The Child Abuse Prevention event will be held on April 27th at Rose Hill Park from 4:00-6:30.

The agency will be posting and interviewing for a new Benefit Programs Supervisor, Family Services Specialist II and Benefit Programs Specialist II beginning in mid-March. They would also be searching for a new Fraud worker.

Child Abuse Prevention Month, 2023 Resolution of Recognition

WHEREAS, every child has the right to safe, healthy, and nurturing environments, with equitable access to resources and opportunities to thrive in their communities; and

WHEREAS, during child Abuse Prevention Month, the State Board of Social Services, and the Local Board of Clarke County Department of Social Services, recognizes the courage it takes to raise a child and that all parents and families have the right to be treated with dignity, to have economic stability and to receive the support and knowledge that child rearing demands; and

WHEREAS, child abuse is considered to be one of our nation's most serious public health problems, with scientific studies documenting the correlation between the abuse and neglect of children and a wide range of medical, emotional, and psychological, and behavioral disorders; and

WHEREAS, child abuse affects 133,775 families in Virginia, documented through reports to local departments of social services. During SFY2022, there were 110 completed reports of child abuse accepted by Clarke County Department of Social Services involving 164 children; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Social Services and local department of social services play an integral role in child abuse prevention, keeping children with their families in their communities, and supporting parents and families to successfully thrive in their communities and prevent entry into foster care; and

WHEREAS, Virginia's child welfare stakeholders, through pass through funding to Clarke County Social Services, deliver critical services and supports to strengthen familial protective factors to prevent child abuse through programs such as: home visiting services, primary prevention programs, parent support programs, and other evidenced-based strategies;




