I. CALL TO ORDER

V. INBODEN REPORT

Mark Inboden reported the following:

- The ongoing issue with Memcor units 2 and 3 going down, Instralogic was contacted to come on site to try and identify the issue. They found that the PLC's had lost their

memory. They were able to upload the lost memory back into the memcor units.

- o Note: With the new Inboden contract in place, Valley Automation will be looking into upgrading the panels and this will become a maintenance item.
- Memcor unit 1 is still not able to perform a pressure decay. Valley Automation replaced the pneumatic valve and the AV4 valve due to it leaking water and failing. After valves were changed, pressure decay is still not working and showing negative pressures.
- Virginia Ave lift station reported a high wet well. Once on site, it was found that they
 high-level float had gotten stuck.
- On 7/7, the WWTP had an influent flow control valve stuck open causing bioreactor to overflow. Replacing valve FCV-7636-2 did not fix the issue. Valley Automation is scheduled to take a look on 7/11.

VI. OLD BUSINESS

A. 1804 Millwood Rd. - Yard Hydrant

Mr. Legge states that he believes that it is the Sanitary Authorities responsibility to take care of the yard hydrant since the hydrant is adjacent to the meter. Years ago the yard hydrant was installed due to LMI. We will continue to take care of maintenance on the yard hydrant. The Board would like to know how many yard hydrants the county monitors and discuss adding a policy to our Rules and Regulations if we monitor multiple yard hydrants.

VII. NEW BUSINESS

A. DEQ Issued Drought

Mark Inboden commented on the DEQ Issued Drought Plan that was issued on July 1st which states that we are in an emergency state for ground water levels. The board would like to send out a drought warning to all customers stating water conservation efforts until the warning is lifted.

B. Boyce Water Tower Fence/Clean – Up

The board would like to contact County Maintenance about cleaning up the tree rows and the trimming of branches along the fence row. It has also been found that a hole has been cut in the fence at the Boyce Water Tower which allows access in. We have clamped the hole off until the fencing company we hired can come out and repair the fence damages.

C. Extraction Fan Quote

Riddleberger provided the Sanitary Authority with a quote for the replacement of (4) exhaust fans currently non operable. The quote they provided identifies they would install (2) Upblast fans and (2) explosion proof fans. Mr. Wayne Armbrust questioned the fact that nothing currently in the Waste Water Plant is explosion proof. The board would like to have Hurt and Profit come onsite and provide an analysis of what needs to be repaired before moving any further.

D. Term Process/Delinquent Accounts

The Sanitary Board would like to review our termination process and see if we can shorten the time frame for disconnections or eliminating one of the delinquent notices being sent out to customers.

The board has asked that we contact the County Administrator for assistance with the process on receiving past due amounts for our delinquent accounts.
