At a regular meeting of the Berryville-Clarke County Joint Committee on Economic Development and Tourism held on Friday, May 24, 2024, at 10:00 am in the Main Meeting Room, Berryville Clarke County Government Center, 101 Chalmers Court, 2nd Floor, Berryville, Virginia.

Call to Order

At 10:00 am, Chairman Lawrence called the meeting to order.

2. Adoption of Agenda

3. Approval of Minutes

4. FY2024-FY2026 Town of Berryville Financial Contribution

- Diane Harrison stated that a \$1500 increase for the town's financial contribution was included in the budget.
 - o Chairman Lawrence asked if the increase was for the 3-year period.
 - Diane Harrison responded that it was not, and suggested discussing this with Jay Arnold, as she is no longer on the budget committee. A review of the MOU should be done at the next meeting.

5. Economic Development & Tourism Update by Michelle Ridings

Michelle Ridings gave the following update:

- The following marketing items from the approved 2024-2025 task list are complete:
 - Fall and Winter Itineraries
 - Holiday Gift Guide
 - Love Local and Restaurant Week Campaign's ARPA funded
 - Spring Itinerary active
 - Mother's Day video
 - Memorial Day video active
- The Love Local and Restaurant Week campaign flipbooks and social media metrics reports were reviewed and feedback provided:
 - O Diane Harrison stated the Love Local stickers created for businesses to use should not say "crafted in Clarke County" as not all items sold are made in Clarke County.
 - Michelle Ridings added that the design can be changed next year.
 - O Chairman Lawrence stated that Restaurant Week appeared to be a success and referenced the Winchester Star article.
 - Michelle Ridings responded that all 14 participating establishments completed a post campaign survey, which indicated an overall increase in food and drink sales during Restaurant Week. The majority of participating establishments agreed that Restaurant Week should be held annually.
 - o Committee members agreed that Restaurant Week should be an annual event.
 - o Chairman Lawrence asked if meals tax can be tracked during Restaurant Week.
 - Michelle Ridings responded that the county does not currently track their meals or transient tax, however, the town does; Christy Dunkle suggested that the town's data be used.
 - Christy Dunkle added that county marketing efforts have improved and complimented Michelle Ridings and Indea Ford on the content and design of marketing materials.
- Work on the new tourism brand is on track as follows:
 - RFP complete Imagine Design has been hired.
 - Discovery and research is complete.
 - Tagline and logo design is in progress. Logo feedback was collected from Clarke County high school students, local businesses, the Economic Development Advisory Committee, stakeholders, and marketing specialists.

- Website development has started; two homepage designs will be complete for selection by July. The new website will be launched in the fall.
- Visitor Center renovations are scheduled to be complete by June.
- ARPA funds have been expended for:
 - Restaurant Week and Love Local campaigns.
 - Visitor Center renovations reimbursements to be submitted by July 31.
 - Fairgrounds signage
- Received a \$16,000 VTC grant (out of \$20,000 requested). These funds will be used to develop
 the new tourism website.
- VA250 grant support letters were written to Clarke County Historical Association for Heritage Day on November 2 and Colonial Kids Day on July 13. They were also awarded \$850,000 for renovations to the waterway.
- Currently building an image inventory for use on social media and other marketing efforts.
 Indea Ford does a lot of the photography and video already; additional photography and video footage will be purchased using a portion of the VTC grant money.
- Economic Development efforts continue:
 - Double Tollgate Water and Sewer discussions with businesses are ongoing about hookups and sharing costs.
 - Camp 7 the State has accepted our offer; boundary Line adjustments, VDOT road easements discussions are ongoing. The property will be transferred to the Industrial Development Authority for rezoning, infrastructure, marketing, and site development.
 - There has been no interest yet in the old McDonalds space at Waterloo.
 - Battletown Inn renovations are underway; no further updates at this time.
 - VEDP continue to provide site leads for new businesses. Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) visits took place at Berryville Graphics and C2 Management.
- Regional Program updates:
 - Attending monthly meetings with the Shenandoah Valley Travel Partnership. They are
 currently transitioning to new leadership, but efforts continue with hiring a new
 website host and developing a marketing strategy for the regional program.
 - The Shenandoah Valley Partnership Association received a large grant for marketing their 100-bucket list items campaign.
 - Regional talent events continue:
 - Clarke County won the Widget Cup on April 11 for the third consecutive year.
 - The Employer Expo was held on May 8; several Clarke County businesses participated, and overall was a successful event.
 - World of Works (WOW) will be held on October 11.
 - Set up events booths with regional partners to increase visibility.
 - Top of Virginia \$1,500 sponsorship for Arising Leadership Program
 - Continue to work with Laurel Ridge Small Business Development Center. The Industrial Development Authority contributes \$6,000 annually.
- Workforce development updates:
 - Continue to work with Shane Coleman at the Clarke County high school on student apprenticeships and summer job placements.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Between The Town of Berryville and Clarke County Regarding Economic Development and Tourism

- WHEREAS, the Town of Berryville and Clarke County have previously entered into a MOU regarding economic development and tourism and now wish to update that document; and
- WHEREAS, the Town of Berryville and Clarke County over the past four decades have worked cooperatively to promote a unique and highly successful land use philosophy that focuses growth and development within the Town while preserving the County's natural, historical, and agricultural resources; and
- WHEREAS, the County's small land area, close proximity to four surrounding urban growth areas, and limited access to public water and sewer capacity make the sharing of Economic Development resources a necessity; and
- WHEREAS, the future of economic development including business, retail, industry, agriculture, and Tourism in Clarke County is dependent upon effective collaboration and cooperation between the Town and County;
- AND WHEREAS, the Town and the County recognize that combining resources and creating unified points of contact for Economic Development and Tourism will enable our communities to more efficiently address the needs of new and existing businesses, streamline regulations and regulatory processes, and more effectively market our unique assets.
- **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Town of Berryville and Clarke County agree to work cooperatively to implement the following action items:
- Joint Management of Economic Development and Tourism. The Town and County shall jointly manage the Economic Development and Tourism efforts in Clarke County and the Town of Berryville on an ongoing basis.
- 2. Single Points of Contact for Economic Development and Tourism. Both the Town and County agree that it would be best if the business community dealt with a single point of contact for Economic Development and Tourism. The point of contact will be the Clarke County Director of Economic Development & Tourism. The Town Director of Community Development will serve as the primary liaison to the County Director of Economic Development & Tourism for economic and tourism activities in the Town.
- 3. Joint Committee for Economic Development and Tourism. The Berryville/Clarke County Joint Committee for Economic Development and Tourism shall consist of two members of the Board of Supervisors and two members of the Town Council. The Committee shall elect a Chair and Vice Chair annually, rotating between the Town and County. For example, when the Chair position is held by an elected representative of the Town, the Vice Chair position shall be held by an elected official of the County. In the following year the Chair position would be held by an elected official of the County and the Vice Chair position held by an elected official of the Town. The Committee shall

meet as it determines necessary to conduct the business of the Committee as described in this MOU. The County Administrator and Town Manager (or designee) shall provide staff support to the Committee.

- 4. <u>Economic & Tourism Development Director.</u> The County will employ the director of economic development and tourism. This position will report to the County Administrator. A job description is attached as an appendix to this MOU. The funding for this position will be shared between the Town and County with the Town providing \$17,500 in FY 21, \$18,500 in FY 22, and \$19,500 in FY 23.
- 5. <u>Goals.</u> The Committee will annually set goals and priorities for economic development and tourism with clear direction on who is responsible for those goals and priorities. A status report on the progress of those goals will be provided annually to the Committee by those responsible for the achievement of the goals.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT it is expected that this Memorandum of Understanding will be modified as the Town and County learn from their experiences. This MOU shall renew automatically on July 1, 2021 and annually on July 1 thereafter, however either the Town or County may choose to request the opportunity to review or modify this MOU with provision of 60 days of notice to the other party. Either party may cancel this MOU with provision of written notice to the other party no later than May 1 of each year.
