## Petition to reduce the speed limit and eliminate truck traffic on Route 612

Petition summary and background	Route 612 (Shepherds Mill Road) in Clarke County is a commuter shortcut from Route 340 to Route 7. There is high traffic volume from 5:00 AM to 8:00 AM and 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM. There is also a significant amount of truck traffic throughout the day. The speed limit on one end of Shepherds Mill Rd. is 35mph and on the other end it is 45mph. The speed limit on the remainder of the road is 55mph. Due to the traffic volume and the close proximity of many of the houses to the road, the 55mph speed limit poses a risk to the residents. There is also a passing lane in the area between Cannon Ball Road and Wickliffe Road which is a hazard for residents turning into their driveway. Three residents have experienced a near-collision when entering or leaving their driveway as a result of the speed limit and passing lane. A number of accidents have occurred in the 55mph section, including a fatality within the last year.  With this petition, we request the 55mph speed limit be reduced to 45mph; the passing lane between Cannon Ball Road and Wickliffe be eliminated; and that no through trucks be allowed on Route 612. This is essential for the safety of the residents.

#### **Study area:**

**Route** # 612

**Street name:** Shepherd's Mill Road

**Jurisdiction:** Clarke County

From: Highway 7 intersection (MP 1.39)

**To:** US-340 intersection near WV state line (MP 6.12)

**Length:** 4.73 miles

#### **AADT (2015)** is as follows

- 1,300 from Hwy 7 to Rte 608 (2.10 miles)
- 1,100 from Rte 608 to US-340 (2.63 miles)
- The sampled ADT (1,400 to 1,600 VPD) was higher than the published 2015 AADT. Therefore, an ADT of 1,500 was used for the crash analysis.


Functional Class: Rural major collector

#### **Speed limit for study roadway** is as follows:

- 35 MPH from Highway 7 (MP 1.39) to 0.38 mile N of Highway 7 (MP 1.77) (resolution 7/14/1978)
- Unposted (statutory 55 MPH) from MP 1.77 to MP 4.66
- 45 MPH from 1.46 mile N of US-340 (MP 4.66) to US-340 (MP 6.12) (resolution 4/18/2005 for MP 4.66 to MP 5.12 and resolution 8/2/2004 for MP 5.12 to MP 6.12)

<u>Origin and Nature of Request:</u> A concerned citizen requested an evaluation of the speed limits on this roadway.

Study Results and Recommendation: No changes to the speed limit are recommended. This is because the 85<sup>th</sup>-percentile speeds are indicating fairly good compliance in the existing 45 MPH speed zone and are somewhat over the speed limit in the existing 55 MPH speed zone. It is unknown how well drivers are complying with the existing 35 MPH speed zone in the southern section of the study area because the speed counter in that speed zone had been tampered with.

#### **B.** Road characteristics:

**Physical Roadway:** The roadway is two lanes wide, with the lanes about 10-11 feet wide, and no shoulders. Starting from the Highway 7 intersection, the roadway follows a tangent alignment with a few gentle sweeping curves in the 55 MPH section. In the 45 MPH section, there is a single-lane bridge at approximately milepost 5.20 and a 20 MPH sharp turn (with a 20 MPH advisory speed and with chevron alignment signs around the curve in both directions) at the West Virginia state line about 0.36 mile southeast of US-340.

**Traffic Control Devices:** The roadway has center lines, but no edge lines. This is the case except at the single-lane bridge, which has edge lines but no center lines. Most of the roadway is striped as double no-passing; however, there is a two-directional passing zone in the 55 MPH section and north of the all-way STOP sign at Route 608 from MP 3.95 to MP 4.63 for a total length of 0.68 miles. The roadway in that section is flat and straight.

There are STOP signs on either end of the study area at the intersections with US-340 and Highway 7; there is an all-way STOP sign at the intersection with Route 608. There are STOP AHEAD signs approaching the STOP signs in advance of all four stopped approaches on Route 612 (NB Route 612 at Route 608 and at US-340; SB Route 612 at Route 608 and Highway 7). The remaining intersections have STOP signs at their intersections with Route 612. The curves on the roadway have no curve warning signs or advisory speeds except for the 20 MPH sharp turn near the West Virginia state line. An analysis of these curves indicates that there is no need to install any

additional curve warning signs, advisory speeds, or chevrons. In the 45 MPH section and in the northbound direction only, there is a ROAD NARROWS sign with a 35 MPH advisory speed. Finally, within the vicinity of the one-lane bridge on both sides, there are ONE LANE BRIDGE warning signs, but the reduction in roadway width for the one-lane bridge is visible before the sign is visible.

- **C. Roadside development and environment:** The roadway passes by mostly open agricultural fields but interspersed with some woods and some large-lot residential properties, with a heavier concentration of residential properties near the Highway 7 intersection. The potential for conflicts with vehicles entering/exiting the roadway is light.
- **D. Parking practices and pedestrian activity:** No on-street parking or pedestrians were observed. However, there is some potential for some minor pedestrian activity due to the retrieval of mail from the roadside mailboxes. Most of the mailboxes are on the western side of the road south of the all-way stop at Route 608 and on the eastern side of the roadway north of that all-way stop, and some residents may have to cross the roadway to retrieve their mail.



**Discussion of crash experience and relevant information:** Of the 16 crashes, there were 5 fixed object off-road crashes (with 4 injuries), 4 deer crashes (with 2 injuries), 3 angle crashes (with no injuries), and one each of a head-on crash (which should have been classified as a fixed object off-road crash), a sideswipe same direction crash, a sideswipe opposite direction crash, and a non-collision event (all with no injuries). These crashes do not seem to follow any discernable pattern.



Dear Mr. Chairman,

For the past couple of months I have been working with you, County Administrator Mr. Ash and representatives from VACORP and VFIS to identify insurance options to meet the needs of the three Volunteer Fire-Rescue agencies within the county (Boyce VFD, Blue Ridge VFD and John H. Enders VFD). These insurance options include workers compensation and an accidental death and dismemberment (AD&D) policy.

In May 2017 a draft policy was created and a presentation was made to the Fire-EMS Commission. On May 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2017 the policy structure and purpose were discussed at the monthly Fire-Rescue Association meeting. At that meeting by unanimous vote a recommendation was made to move forward with the purchasing of this insurance policy. Additionally another meeting was scheduled for June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017 to further discuss the components of the policy.

On Monday May 5<sup>th</sup>, 2017 the Clarke County Chiefs group voted unanimously at their regular scheduled meeting to move forward with the purchase of the policy. On Thursday June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017 the Clarke County Fire-EMS Commission will further discussed the matter and make their recommendations.

Upon the conclusion of the Fire-EMS Commission Meeting I will make my final recommendation. I have however reviewed the policy and feel it meets the needs of our organization. Additionally, this policy addresses the changes to the Code of Virginia Line of Duty Act that takes place effective July 1, 2017.

Clif Balderson summarized the plan and construction budget. Highlights include:

- Major Projects:
  - Old Charlestown Road Bridge structure replacement. May start earlier than scheduled.
  - Old Winchester Road Route 723 Bridge
     – sits on line between Clarke and Frederick County. It is scheduled to start 2017.
- Construction Program
  - Unpaved Road fund discontinues in 2020 converting to the district grant program for unpaved roads.
  - The Staunton District will get its own unpaved road funds replacing the former Commonwealth Transportation Board unpaved road funds.
  - Cost per mile:
    - Rural rustic \$300,000
    - Two-lane road reconstruction \$800,000

- New Hard Surface Road Projects
  - Allen Road: Complete in FY2018. Transferred approximately ninety thousand dollars from the Lockes Mill project to finish Allen Road.
  - Lockes Mill Road Route 621: Currently projecting April 2022 but should start sooner.

#### Raymond & Michael Barbehennn

The property is located on the west side of Blue Ridge Mountain Road approximately 2.3 miles north of Route 50. The parcel is a portion of Cabin Properties previously owned by the Smalley family. The parcel is identified as Tax Map# 40-A-4M, consisting of 100.4 acres, with 2 DURs. The property is wooded and vacant. The parcel has over ½ mile of frontage on the Appalachian Trail corridor.

The parcel meets three of the four criteria, the score was 58.45 due to retiring both of the remaining DUR's, AT corridor frontage, and steep slopes. The owner would like to retire both of the remaining DURs.


The property is located on the east side of Bishop Meade Road approximately 1.2 miles south of the intersection with Lord Fairfax Highway (Route 34). The parcel is identified as Tax Map# 22-A-122A and consists of 30 acres, with 1 existing dwelling and 2 DURs. It is just south of the Westphal property.


The property resource score is 66.95. The applicant is retiring both of the remaining DUR's. The parcel is within the Chapel Rural Historic District and the house is a contributing structure. The parcel is adjacent to several eased properties and has 760' of frontage on Bishop Meade Rd. a state designated scenic byway.


#### Warrick and Andrea Elrod

The property is located on the south side of Harry Byrd Highway (Route 7) at 420 Rock Hall Farm Lane. The parcel also extends to Moose Road adjacent to the Moose Club. The parcel is identified as Tax Map# 6-A-27 and consists of 78.65 acres, with 1 existing dwelling and 1 DUR.

The parcel meets 2 of the 4 criteria. The property resource score is 37.5 and the parcel is over 40 acres. The community policy and management team to be <u>appointed by the local governing body</u> shall include, at a minimum, <u>at least one elected official or appointed official or his designee from the governing body of a locality that is a member of the team</u>, and the local agency heads or their designees of the following community agencies: community services board established pursuant to § 37.2-501, juvenile court services unit, department of health, department of social services and the local school division. The team shall also include a representative of a private organization or association of providers for children's or family services if such organizations or associations are located within the locality, and a parent representative. Parent representatives who are employed by a public or private program that receives funds pursuant to this chapter or agencies represented on a community policy and management team may serve as a parent representative provided that they do not, as a part of their employment, interact directly on a regular and daily basis with children or supervise employees who interact directly on a daily basis with children. Notwithstanding this provision, foster parents may serve as parent representatives. Those persons appointed to represent community agencies shall be authorized to make policy and funding decisions for their agencies.

The local governing body may appoint other members to the team including, but not limited to, a local government official, a local law-enforcement official and representatives of other public agencies.

When any combination of counties, cities or counties, and cities establishes a community policy and management team, the membership requirements previously set out shall be adhered to by the team as a whole.

Persons who serve on the team shall be immune from any civil liability for decisions made about the appropriate services for a family or the proper placement or treatment of a child who comes before the team, unless it is proven that such person acted with malicious intent. Any person serving on such team who does not represent a public agency shall file a statement of economic interests as set out in § 2.2-3117 of the State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act (§ 2.2-3100 et seq.). Persons representing public agencies shall file such statements if required to do so pursuant to the State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act.

Persons serving on the team who are parent representatives or who represent private organizations or associations of providers for children's or family services shall abstain from decision-making involving individual cases or agencies in which they have either a personal interest, as defined in § 2.2-3101 of the State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act, or a fiduciary interest.

Parent representatives who are employed by a public or private program that receives funds pursuant to this chapter or agencies represented on a family assessment and planning team may serve as a parent representative provided that they do not, as a part of their employment, interact directly on a regular and daily basis with children or supervise employees who interact directly on a regular basis with children. Notwithstanding this provision, foster parents may serve as parent representatives. The family assessment and planning team may include a representative of a private organization or association of providers for children's or family services and of other public agencies.

Persons who serve on a family assessment and planning team shall be immune from any civil liability for decisions made about the appropriate services for a family or the proper placement or treatment

of a child who comes before the team, unless it is proven that such person acted with malicious intent. Any person serving on such team who does not represent a public agency shall file a statement of economic interests as set out in § 2.2-3117 of the State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act (§ 2.2-3100 et seq.). Persons representing public agencies shall file such statements if required to do so pursuant to the State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act.

Persons serving on the team who are parent representatives or who represent private organizations or associations of providers for children's or family services shall abstain from decision-making involving individual cases or agencies in which they have either a personal interest, as defined in § 2.2-3101 of the State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act, or a fiduciary interest.

In accordance with the Office of Children's Services (OCS) Audit Plan for Fiscal Years 2016, the Clarke County Community Policy and Management Team (CPMT) has completed and submitted the results of the self-assessment audit of your local Children's Service Act (CSA) Program. An on-site visit was scheduled and conducted by OCS Program Auditors on March 29, 2016 to perform the independent validation phase of the process.

Based on the review and examination of the self-assessment workbook and supporting documentation provided by the Clarke County CSA program, our independent validation:

with the conclusion reported by the Clarke County CPMT that no significant observations of non-compliance or internal control weaknesses were found in the design or operation of the processes or services conducted on behalf of the Clarke County CSA program. The explanation for our assessment results are as follows:

Clarke County CPMT concluded that only non-significant compliance and/or internal control weakness observations were noted. However, validation procedures of the locally prepared CSA Self-Assessment Workbook identified major deficiencies <sup>1</sup>indicating non-compliance in the local CSA program. Non-compliance with the statutory requirements of CSA is considered significant because the local program is not operating fully in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth. Specifics pertaining to the Clarke County CSA Program are detailed on pages 2 - 4.

### SIGNIFICANT NON-COMPLIANCE

 Internal Controls established by the CSA statues were not effectively implemented by the CPMT in order to safeguard against conflicts of interest. Statements of Economic Interest Forms (SOEI) were not completed by members of the CPMT and Family Assessment Planning Teams (FAPT) that did not represent a public agency. The SOEI form was not completed by the parent representative on the CPMT and private provider representatives on FAPT.

The effectiveness of the controls to ensure accountability and appropriate use of CSA pool funds may have been significantly reduced since the required parties did not appropriately disclose personal interests.

CRITERIA: Code of Virginia (COV) §2.2-3100, §2.2-3101, §2.2.-5205, §2.2.-5207, §2.2.5210

2. The composition of members serving on Clarke County CPMT/FAPTs does not meet the membership requirements established by CSA statute and local policy. The government representative does not attend regularly scheduled CPMT meetings. The composition of the FAPT does not include a parent representative as required by the CSA. Due the absence of a government representative, parent representative, and/or named/designated alternates, CPMT/FAPT membership is not aligned with established statutory and/or local policy adopted by the Clarke County CPMT.

CRITERIA: COV § 2.2-5205, § 2.2-5207; Clarke County CPMT By-Laws Article III-Membership (E)

3. Adequate measures have not been established and/or implemented by the Clarke County CPMT to evaluate and ensure accountability and effectiveness of the locally managed CSA program. Opportunities for improvement were noted based on instances of non-compliance with CSA statutory requirements. The CPMT has established ongoing key performance goals; however, the evaluation of the achievements of stated goals were not being monitored.

The ability and likelihood of the CPMT to adequately monitor and provide oversight of the local CSA program is an essential component of the organizational governance. The absence of a formal planning, coordination and program evaluation to ensure that the goals and objectives of the program are met ultimately impacts the CPMT efforts to better serve the needs of the youth and families in the community to maximize the use of state and community resources.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- The Clarke County CPMT should ensure that the SOEI forms are completed immediately for all non-public
  participating members of the FAPT. Forms should be updated annually and retained in accordance with records
  retention procedures.
- The CPMT should obtain a parent representative to serve on the FAPT to comply with the statutory requirement. The CPMT should seek to obtain a new government representative that will be able to attend monthly meetings.
- The CPMT should monitor the achievement of its stated goals and objectives and report progress to all stakeholders at least annually.

#### CLIENT COMMENT

- "The first concern addressed the fact that the Statements of Economic Interest were not completed by members of the CPMT and FAPT that did not represent a public agency. The form was not completed by the parent representative on the CPMT and the private provider representative on the FAPT. This concern will be remedied by having the non-public agency representatives complete the SOEI forms as soon as possible."
- "The second concern states that the Clarke County CPMT and FAPT do not meet the membership requirements established by statute. Clarke County needs a parent representative on its FAPT and the school representative on the CPMT is exploring options within the school system. Also, the government representative does not attend the regularly scheduled CPMT meetings. The CPMT Chairperson will request a new government representative who has more availability to attend the CPMT monthly meetings."
- "The third concern in your letter states that adequate measures have not been established or implemented to
  evaluate and ensure accountability and effectiveness of the local CSA program. The CPMT agrees that we
  need a new Strategic Plan in place. I will schedule a strategic planning session within the next three
  months."

OCS will conduct a follow up validation to ensure the quality improvements have been implemented as reported.

We also would like to acknowledge the excellent assistance and cooperation that was provided by Ms. Ann Lamanna, CSA Coordinator during our on-site visit. Dear Mr. Clarke:

In October 2014, the Governor announced a budget shortfall of \$240 million dollars. From that, \$120 million was to be cut the first year and approximately 80% of those cuts were coming from the Department of Corrections. Facilities were closed and new ones that were ready to open were delayed indefinitely. At that time, this facility had around 50 state inmates who were out of compliance. During the following months, it was noted that statewide numbers of out of compliance inmates showed that approximately 5,600 state inmates were being held in regional and local facilities.

Since 2013, the Northern Shenandoah Valley has been hit as hard as any area in the state from opioid/heroin addiction. This region has recorded over 30 deaths from overdose each calendar year for the last four years and the problem continues. We have had a very large increase in medical costs that are related to this crisis.

We were informed recently that the statewide numbers for out of compliance state inmates in local facilities has dropped to 3,300-3,600. We have over 130 state inmates awaiting transport to DOC. The \$12 per day that we receive from the state does little for their upkeep when it costs nearly \$80 per day to keep them in our facility.

At their last meeting, held on April 20, 2017, the Northwestern Regional Jail Authority unanimously requested that we share these concerns with you and request that all state responsible inmates be removed from our facility. State inmates represent approximately 21% of our current jail population. For our member localities, on an annual basis, this equates to more than \$3.6 million in unfunded state mandates that are not sustainable within our individual locality budgets. By locality, these amounts are:

- 1. **FY 17 General Update.** The Committee reviewed the status of several General Fund budgets that may exceed their budget before year end, and discussed possible solutions.
- 2. General Discussion of Conservation Easement Funding. Attached are documents intended to provide an historical overview of Conservation Easement Funding in the County, as well as a statement of current resources. The Committee discussed the level of ongoing local tax funds (rollback and general taxes) that should be made available to the Easement Authority for the purchase of easements. There was a general recognition of the fact that delays in closing easement purchases can influence the funds received by VDACS. This discussion will continue next month.
- 3. Impact of Returning to 4 year assessment cycle. The cost of the last reassessment was \$194,915. If an assessment is done every four years the annual cost is \$48,729. If the reassessment is done every 6 years the annual cost \$32,486. It therefore costs \$16,243 annually to reassess with greater frequency. It cannot be determined whether additional tax revenue would result from a reassessment because the Board might choose the neutral rate. Instead, the purpose of greater frequency in reassessment is greater equity in assessment and collection. The committee was generally disposed to favor the four year cycle, but agreed that a review of sales ratios was a necessary step before making a recommendation to the full board.
- 4. FY 18 LODA Liability. That Commonwealth is requiring that localities assume the cost of liabilities existing before localities were required to pay for new claims. The County of Clarke has one such claim, and VaCorp is included the cost of this claim in the invoice for the FY 18 LODA premium (see attached email). This will require an additional payment of \$27,816. However, an supplemental appropriation action will await the actual billing, which may have other variances.

In addition, the Commonwealth is requiring that Clarke County pay its share of the implementation costs of transitioning claims from Treasury to VRS. Again, it is not known what the actual billing for this will be.

5. **FY 18 Commission on the Arts Grant.** The upcoming Arts Grant was approved for \$500 less than requested which, keeping the match ratio unchanged, reduces local tax funding \$500 for a total expenditure reduction of \$1,000. A proportional reduction to the two funding agencies would result in the following:

It is recommend that an appropriation adjustment be recommended: "Be it resolved that budget and appropriations for the Commission on the Arts be reduced \$1,000, and that revenue from that agency be reduced \$500, to correspond with actual expected funding from the Commonwealth."

- 6. Tax Relief for the Elderly and Disabled. During the FY 18 budget process it was decided that the tax relief program for the elderly and disabled would be reviewed and discussed. The Finance Committee requested that the Commissioner of the Revenue estimate the cost impact of the proposed changes attached.
- 7. Bills and Claims. The attached is recommended for approval.
- 8. **Standing Reports.** The following reports are attached: Reconciliation of Appropriations; Fund Balance; Expenditure Summary; Capital Projects Status.

### A brief summary of the VDACS PDR program

VDACS (Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services) provides funding for local PDR (Purchase of Development Rights). These funds require a local match of equal amounts.

There is a two-part certification process in order to be eligible to receive PDR funding from VDACS. The first part is a certification (Intergovernmental Agreement or IGA) of the amount of local matching funds that the locality has available for its PDR program (usually completed by the locality in Oct or Nov). The second part is an application to certify that the local PDR program meets established criteria.

Award notifications are usually received in January. The funds are available to use for two calendar years, beginning with the year awarded, and expiring in December of the second calendar year. As an example, funding made available with an award notification received in January 2016, will expire December 31, 2017. VDACS sometimes extends the time until June of the following year.

As of November 30, 2016, twenty-two local PDR programs existed in Virginia, six of which had some level of current local funding available. Clarke County is one of those six.

Localities that receive state-matching PDR funds have until December 31<sup>st</sup> of the first year of each IGA to notify VDACS if they do not plan to: (i) spend down at least 50% of their allocated state-matching funding or (ii) submit a completed claim for reimbursement within the timeframe stipulated in the IGA. Localities not meeting this criteria risk being ineligible to apply for the next allocation round.

When the state determines the total PDR funds available for a fiscal year, VDACS allocates equal shares (full shares) among the participating localities. If a locality cannot provide enough local funds to match their full share, then the difference is re-allocated among the remaining localities receiving a full share.

The award amount is based on the current fiscal year local funds the locality has to offer, plus the unexpended local funds available from previous years. Then the balance of VDACS PDR funding the county hasn't spent down from precious years allocations is subtracted to arrive at the new award amount (not to exceed the maximum share amount available).

A history of PDR VDACS funding is included on the following pages. This data was provided by the VDACS office. Additional notes at the bottom of each page, specific to Clarke County, were provided by the Clarke County Joint Administrative Office.

I just spoke with Stephanie from VACORP. The implementation costs in this letter, are the costs associated with passing the administration of LODA over to VRS and DHRM. All jurisdictions are required by law to pay a share of this implementation cost based on the number of eligible employees and volunteers they have. Our current numbers are different than the numbers in the letter. It should be 23 paid and part time employees, and 70 volunteers. As instructed, I will log in and make those changes to the numbers.

Even though we opted out of the state administered LODA program, we are still required to pay a portion of this implementation VACORP will still continue to pay all claims (past, present & future), however, VRS will make all eligibility determinations and invoice the county for any benefit payments (which will be forwarded to VACORP).

Bottom line- even though we opted out of the state managed LODA program, we still have to pay the implementation costs for them to switch everything from the DOA to VRS/DHRM.

## Dear Ms. Sheckels,

Thank you for your continued support of the Line of Duty Act (LODA) community. As you know, the General Assembly made changes to LODA. Effective July 1, 2017, the Virginia Retirement System (VRS) will begin making all LODA eligibility determinations and issuing benefit payments for employers that participate in the VRS-administered LODA Fund. The Department of Human Resource Management (DHRM) will begin administering LODA health insurance benefits through the LODA Health Benefits Plans.

# **Implementation Costs**

To enable the transition, the 2016 General Assembly included an enactment clause in the bill that states each LODA Fund non-participating employer shall pay its pro rata share of estimated implementation costs incurred by VRS and DHRM (Chapter 677 of the 2016 Acts of Assembly). Each LODA Fund participating employer will also share in the implementation costs through contribution rates paid to the LODA Fund.

The implementation effort has included, among other activities, establishing and administering the LODA Health Benefits Plans, implementing a new claims review process and benefit distribution process, developing new resources for employers and LODA-eligible employees and volunteers, establishing and maintaining a dedicated website, and developing a participant guide and training materials.

To cover the costs incurred by both agencies, employers will receive an invoice this summer for a one-time implementation fee.

### **Headcount Requested**

The invoice amount will be based on the number of LODA-eligible employees and volunteers at each employer. As VRS prepares invoices, please update your LODA-eligible employees and volunteers counts so that your costs accurately reflect your current population as closely as possible.

The final numbers have come in for the FY18 state budget for the Virginia Commission for the Arts. Since the final budget was approved, we have had to find additional savings.

Part of the Commission's original savings strategies included a contingency plan to cap the Local Government Challenge Grants at \$4,500. This morning, the Commission Board made the difficult decision to adopt that \$4,500 cap for FY18. We regret this painful but necessary step to address the funding shortfall we had hoped to avoid. We have not previously reduced our Local Government Challenge Grant funds, and we hope to avoid doing so in the future.

We hope that despite the reductions we have had to make to make, you and our local government partners can find a way to maintain your level of commitment to your community arts organizations and programs.

## **ZONING ORDINANCE TEXT AMENDMENT (TA-17-02)**

Wireless Communication Facilities (WCFs)
June 20, 2017 Board of Supervisors Meeting – PUBLIC HEARING
STAFF REPORT – Department of Planning

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The purpose of this staff report is to provide information to the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors to assist them in reviewing this proposed ordinance amendment. It may be useful to members of the general public interested in this proposed amendment.

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## **Description:**

Proposed text amendments to amend §3-A-1 (Agricultural-Open Space-Conservation District – AOC), §3-A-2 (Forestal-Open Space-Conservation District – FOC), §3-A-3 (Rural Residential District – RR), §3-A-12 (Neighborhood Commercial District – CN), §3-A-13 (Highway Commercial District – CH), §3-C-2-u (Monopoles for Telecommunication Antennae), §3-E-3 (Historic District), §3-E-4 (Historic Access Overlay District), §6-H-12 (Monopoles for Telecommunication Antennae), and Article 9 (Definitions) of the Zoning Ordinance. The purpose of the text amendments is to revise the requirements for the siting, construction, and modification of monopoles, towers, stealth structures, support structures, and associated equipment. Specific changes include but are not limited to:

- Maximum allowable height of a new WCF would be increased from 100 feet to 199 feet, subject to special use permit and site plan approval and compliance with new siting regulations.
- Use the County's Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study as a guide in locating WCFs to maximize telecommunications service to residents and businesses and to minimize adverse impact on the County's scenic and historic resources.
- New design requirements for stealth WCFs, including silos, flag poles, bell towers, and tree structures.
- New requirement for review of WCF applications by a third-party wireless telecommunications engineering consultant.
- New regulations for construction of amateur radio antennas consistent with State and Federal law.

#### **Requested Action:**

Conduct scheduled Public Hearing and take formal action on the proposed text amendment. Staff has no outstanding concerns with the adoption of this text amendment.

## **Update:**

At the Board's May 16, 2017 meeting, one minor change was requested to §3-C-2-u-1-b, Objectives:

4. To facilitate deployment of WCFs to provide coverage to all residents and businesses of Clarke County in a manner consistent with the County's character

Members expressed concern that inclusion of the word, "all," could create the expectation that the ordinance would ensure that county-wide telecommunications coverage would be

established. While such a goal is desired, the amended ordinance would help facilitate placement of WCFs to expand coverage – developing county-wide coverage, however, would be market-driven and heavily dependent upon the private sector to implement.

To avoid confusion, the word "all" has been removed from subsection 4 as shown above.

## **Background:**

This text amendment was developed by the Planning Commission as a follow-up to the July 2015 adoption of a text amendment to bring the County's monopole regulations into compliance with new Federal regulations regarding co-location of antennas on existing monopoles (TA-15-01).

In fall 2014, the County was contacted by attorney Frank Stearns (representing Verizon Wireless) regarding a possible project to add new antennas to an existing monopole ("colocation") and at that time made Staff aware of the new Federal co-location requirements. Mr. Stearns also advised of additional concerns with the County's monopole regulations including the maximum height requirement of 100 feet for all new monopoles and lack of clarity regarding the process for co-locating antennas on existing structures. He noted that the County's regulations have not been updated in many years and do not take into consideration new technologies for wireless telecommunications and broadband service. These additional concerns were later summarized by Mr. Stearns in a June 2015 letter to Planning Staff.

To address Mr. Stearns's concerns, the Planning Commission formed a Telecommunications Subcommittee in May 2015 consisting of three Commissioners (Robina Bouffault, Douglas Kruhm, and Jon Turkel) to evaluate these issues and recommend potential ordinance amendments. The Subcommittee held several meetings beginning in August 2015. County information technology staff assisted the process by developing a map depicting the location and heights of all existing towers and antenna support structures located within the County or in close proximity to its boundary. The Subcommittee also evaluated studies from Warren and Bedford Counties that were commissioned to help determine the location and heights of future towers in those localities. Mr. Stearns contributed provided a version of Bedford County's tower ordinance that he modified to address the specific concerns he had with Clarke County's regulations. The Subcommittee began their development of the text amendment with Mr. Stearns's draft. Also to help provide direction for a proposed text amendment, the Subcommittee developed a series of "Goals and Objectives" utilizing a similar approach found in Bedford County's study. The resultant Goals and Objectives are as follows:

## <u>Goals</u>

- 1. Encourage the location of wireless communication facilities to serve residential areas.
- 2. Protect residential areas and land uses from potential adverse impacts of wireless communication facilities.
- 3. Encourage users of wireless communication facilities to locate them, to the extent possible, in areas where the adverse impact on the County is minimal.
- 4. Encourage users of wireless communication facilities to configure them in a way that minimizes the adverse visual impact of the towers and antennas through careful design, siting, landscape screening, and innovative camouflaging techniques.

- 5. Enhance the ability of the providers of telecommunications services to provide such services to County residents quickly, effectively, efficiently, and unobtrusively.
- 6. Consider the public health and safety of wireless communication facilities.
- 7. Avoid potential damage to adjacent properties from tower failure through the engineering and careful siting of wireless communication facilities structures.

## **Objectives**

- 1. All homes and business have access to broadband services and wireless for communication, business, education, and entertainment applications.
- 2. Integrate technology into scenic landscapes so that the natural beauty and quality of life is not compromised.
- 3. Encourage the co-location of antennas and equipment on existing towers and structures as an alternative to the construction of new monopoles. Facilitate co-location projects through regulations that allow for by-right installations and administrative review by Staff.

By early 2016, the Subcommittee had developed a working draft of a text amendment that would propose, among several other items, increasing the maximum height of new monopoles to 199 feet. This is the maximum height that a tower can be constructed without mandatory safety lighting required by the Federal Aviation Administration. This would be a significant change from the County's current 100 foot maximum height requirement which helps to ensure that all new monopoles are predominantly concealed within tree coverage.

Planning Staff's primary concern with increasing the maximum height requirement was that the current special use permit requirements for monopoles do not include metrics that Staff, the Commission, and ultimately the Board of Supervisors could use to determine whether a new application should be approved or denied. Staff recommended that a third-party telecommunications engineering consultant be procured to establish these metrics through development of a County-wide study similar to those developed by Warren and Bedford Counties. The resultant study would ideally determine locations where new towers are preferred in order to maximize telecommunications and broadband services for County residents and businesses, and also would determine optimal heights and design features for new towers and support structures. The study then could be used to complete the development of the proposed text amendment and also be used as a guidance document in evaluating future applications to construct new towers. Staff further recommended that a telecommunications engineering consultant be retained on an as-needed basis to evaluate new tower applications including their proposed siting, necessity, capacity to serve County customers, and impacts on surrounding properties.

The Subcommittee's working text amendment draft and their Goals and Objectives statement were presented to the full Planning Commission on February 5, 2016 for discussion. Specific questions regarding the proposed increase in maximum tower height and the need for a telecommunications engineering study were also provided to aid the discussion:

## Maximum Height Increase

- What are the Commissioners' opinions of allowing 199 foot monopoles while retaining the prohibition on lighting?
- If the maximum height is increased to 199 feet, should more restrictive height requirements be imposed on areas such as the mountain ridge line? Other areas?
- If a maximum 199 foot height is not favored, is there support for a lesser maximum height that is higher than the current 100 foot limit?

## **Telecommunications Engineering Study**

- What are the Commissioners' opinions of conducting a telecommunications study as described by Staff?
- If a study is generally supported, how should it mesh with the consideration of the proposed text amendment? Should the text amendment be evaluated by the engineer as part of the study?
- Are Commissioners supportive of retaining a telecommunications engineer to review special use permit applications for new monopoles?

Commission members provided feedback to the Subcommittee and were generally supportive of the direction in which the members were proceeding with the text amendment and Staff's recommendation for a telecommunications engineering study. Following this meeting, the Subcommittee met on February 22 and agreed to proceed with the working draft text amendment recommending a maximum height of 199 feet. Planning Staff worked with the Board of Supervisors through the annual budget process to fund and select a telecommunications engineering consultant. The Board authorized the release of a request for proposals in April 2016 to conduct a telecommunications and broadband study and in July 2016 a contract was awarded to The Atlantic Group to complete the study within a 90-day time period.

Atlantic Staff worked with Planning Staff and also met with the Subcommittee through late summer and early fall. In addition to developing the study, Atlantic Staff also assisted with review and comment on the Subcommittee's text amendment working draft and suggested language that corresponded to the recommendations that were being developed in the study. Atlantic Staff ultimately completed the County's "Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study" in November 2016. The Study was presented to the Board of Supervisors on November 29 and accepted by the Board at their meeting on December 20. As part of their action to accept the Study, the Board's motion also requested the Planning Commission to use the Study as the basis for future recommendations that are advanced to the Board as well as for guidance in reviewing future applications for new telecommunications towers.

Of particular relevance to the Subcommittee's text amendment, the Study identified eleven potential locations where new towers in combination with existing towers could provide a potential County-wide network for wireless telecommunications and broadband service. These eleven locations are referred to as "Permitted Commercial Tower Development Areas" (PCTDAs) and are identified on a revised version of the County tower inventory map included in the Study. The PCTDA locations are typically plotted at or near a road intersection with acceptable sites for new towers to be located within a half-mile radius of the location. The Study also recommended a targeted height of 120 feet for each PCTDA but also noted that taller towers

up to 199 feet could be needed in some situations. Recommendations were included in the Study to help determine which types of situations warrant towers in excess of 120 feet.

The Subcommittee completed their work on the initial draft of this text amendment in January 2017 and presented it to the full Commission at their February 28 briefing meeting. The presentation included feedback from Mr. Stearns on the initial draft and the degree to which it addresses his original concerns.

## Staff Analysis - Proposed Text Amendment Language

The major changes proposed in this text amendment are described separately by topic below:

## Wireless Communication Facilities (WCFs) and Ordinance Objectives

The term "monopole" is currently used as the predominant term to describe telecommunications towers in Clarke County – a self-supporting, single-shaft structure as opposed to a tower with a lattice structure. While lattice towers will continue to be prohibited and "monopole" will still be used to describe the allowable antenna support structure, the term "wireless communication facility" or "WCF" will be used as the predominant descriptive term. As defined, "WCF" is a broader term that includes the antenna support structure (or "tower"), antennas, transmission cables, equipment shelters and cabinets, utility pedestals, ground equipment, fencing, signage, and all other infrastructure that makes up a tower site.

The text amendment also lists four objectives that the proposed WCF regulations attempt to accomplish:

- 1. To reduce the adverse impact of such facilities.
- 2. To encourage the placement of WCFs in locations with appropriate vegetative cover and screening, and encourage co-location of antennas as an alternative to construction of new WCFs.
- 3. To promote alternative stealth structure design.
- 4. To facilitate deployment of WCFs to provide coverage to all residents and businesses of Clarke County in a manner consistent with the County's character.

These four objectives are consistent with the original list of Goals and Objectives that were developed by the Subcommittee.

Coordination with the Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study

As requested by the Board of Supervisors, the proposed text amendment utilizes the recommendations of the Study both in terms of the regulations and in evaluating new proposed WCF applications. Language is included in §3-C-2-u to indicate that the text amendment is intended to be used in conjunction with the Study, and that the proposed locations for new WCFs referenced in the Study are a guide to maximize service and minimize impacts. For all new WCF's over 80 feet in height (Class 3 and Class 4 WCFs – see description below), the proposed location shall be consistent with the Study's guidance regarding PCTDAs. Furthermore, WCFs in excess of 120 feet in height also have to demonstrate one or more specific conditions that warrant the taller height (addressed in greater detail below).

## Maximum Height Requirements and "Class" System

The current maximum height of 100 feet for all new monopoles would be replaced with a system of WCF "Classes" that establish maximum height requirements, application and review requirements, design requirements, zoning district assignments, and permitted or special use designations based on the WCF height or type. The proposed classes are as follows:

## Class 1 WCFs

- o Maximum height 50 feet.
- Review/approval authority Site development plan application reviewed and approved administratively by Zoning Administrator.
- Zoning Districts
  - Permitted use in the AOC, FOC, CH, CN, RR, and Historic Access Overlay District.
  - Prohibited in the Historic Overlay District.
- Design Monopole or stealth structure with surface-mounted antennas

## • Class 2 WCFs

- o Maximum height -- 80 feet
- o Review/approval authority Site development plan application reviewed and approved by Planning Commission. Public hearing required per §6-E-3.
- Zoning Districts
  - Permitted use in the AOC, FOC, CH, CN, RR, and Historic Access Overlay District.
  - Prohibited in the Historic Overlay District.
- o Design Monopole or stealth structure with surface-mounted antennas

## • Class 3 WCFs

- o Maximum height -- 120 feet
- Review/approval authority -- Special use permit and site development plan applications reviewed and approved by Board of Supervisors (following Planning Commission review and required public hearings).
- Zoning Districts
  - Special use in the AOC, FOC, CH, and Historic Access Overlay Districts.
  - Prohibited in the CN, RR, and Historic Overlay Districts.
- o Design Monopole

## • Class 4 WCFs

- o Maximum height -- 199 feet
- Review/approval authority -- Special use permit and site development plan applications reviewed and approved by Board of Supervisors (following Planning Commission review and required public hearings).
- o Zoning Districts
  - Special use in the AOC, FOC, CH, and Historic Access Overlay Districts.
  - Prohibited in the CN, RR, and Historic Overlay Districts.
- o Design Monopole

• <u>Class 5 WCFs</u>. This class is designated for privately-owned amateur radio antennas. Maximum height of these structures is governed by State and Federal law and localities are pre-empted from establishing more stringent height requirements or requiring special use permits for their approval. Class 5 WCFs would be reviewed and approved administratively by the Zoning Administrator and are allowed by-right in all districts.

As referenced earlier in this report, applications for Class 4 WCFs (over 120 feet but no greater than 199 feet) are required to demonstrate that one of three situations exist that create the need for a height in excess of 120 feet. These situations are as follows:

- 1. The proposed site would provide a demonstrable coverage improvement over a Class 3 tower height and would be consistent with the guidance regarding the County's coverage goals in the Telecommunications and Broadband Study. An example of this situation would be data generated by an applicant that shows a taller WCF will provide greater coverage to an underserved area without providing redundant coverage or unnecessary overlap with other existing towers.
- 2. Need to ensure proper connectivity for microwave "point to point" systems. A path study and evidence of rejection from fiber optic providers shall be submitted with the application. As discussed in detail in the Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study, all communication towers need to be served by broadband internet access in order to operate. This can be accomplished either by wired broadband extended to the tower or by a wireless "point to point" connection from the proposed tower to an existing tower with microwave antennas. Wired broadband connectivity is the ideal approach but in some cases, it may be infeasible to bring wired broadband to a tower site. If a WCF has to rely on a "point to point" microwave connection, it may have to be constructed at a taller height to connect with the transmitting tower.
- 3. Proposed WCF is required by the property owner to be located in an area with a lower elevation in relation to the overall elevation of the subject property. Setback calculations with ground elevation profile diagrams and property owner requirements shall be submitted with the application. An example of this situation would be a landowner who agrees to lease a portion of their land for a new WCF site but selects a topographically lower area of the property for the site. This could be to avoid losing land that is in active agricultural production or simply to be as far away from the property owner's residence as possible. A taller height could be approved to accommodate elevation lost if the owner had allowed the WCF to be located on a topographically higher location on the property.

## Setbacks and Perimeter Buffers

<u>Setbacks</u>. The current ordinance requires setbacks of 100% of the monopole's height from property lines, 200% from public rights of way, and 400% from other natural or scenic features such as the Appalachian Trail, open space easements, scenic byways, Blandy Experimental Farm, and the Shenandoah River.

The new proposed setback from property lines and structures would be a distance equal to the engineered "fall zone," or the fall zone plus the required perimeter buffer area, whichever is greater. The "fall zone" is the maximum distance from the structure base that the WCF is designed to fall in the event of a structural failure and collapse. All WCF applications will be required to include a diagram from a licensed structural engineer certifying the fall zone for the proposed WCF.

For WCFs to be located on parcels adjacent to the Appalachian National Scenic Trail Corridor, a special setback of 400 feet from the footprint of the Appalachian Trail is required.

<u>Perimeter buffers</u>. Under current requirements, monopoles must be located within a wooded area of dense tree cover containing a minimum depth of 120 feet from the area to be cleared for the monopole site. All trees within this area must be preserved.

Under the proposed text amendment, a perimeter buffer would be required for all Class 3 and Class 4 WCFs. An area with a minimum depth of 50 feet from the facility compound fencing must be established and maintained as a buffer area. Within the first 25 feet closest to the compound fence, the buffer must preserve existing trees and include supplementary planting of evergreen trees to effectively screen the compound and WCF structure base from view. The Planning Commission would have the authority to require additional planting within the remaining 25 feet of the perimeter buffer on a case-by-case basis to ensure effective and appropriate screening. All vegetation within the perimeter buffer would be required to be maintained throughout the lifespan of the WCF.

## Co-Location of Antennas and Equipment

Current regulations allow the co-location of telecommunications antennas and equipment on existing monopoles, lattice towers, water tanks, and other structures as an amendment to the site development plan for that facility. Aside from language added recently to address the Federal co-location law change, the current ordinance does not outline a specific process to be followed for co-location applications or for the periodic addition, replacement, and maintenance of equipment and other WCF infrastructure.

The proposed text amendment now includes specific review processes, application requirements, and regulations for co-location of antennas and the addition/replacement/maintenance of WCF infrastructure and equipment. Language is included to clarify that co-location is a by-right activity and that the Zoning Administrator has the authority to waive certain site plan requirements if all additions and changes occur within the facility compound and do not produce a material change in appearance, height, or setbacks.

## Stealth Design

The County has long encouraged the use of stealth design techniques to reduce the visual impact of new monopoles and has one example of an effective "tree" stealth monopole located off Mt. Carmel Road.

To further encourage the use of stealth design techniques, new design requirements are included in four formats that are compatible with the agricultural character of the County – silos, bell

towers, tree structures, and flag poles. Stealth silo structures are noted as the County's "highest valued stealth technology" as the design has the greatest potential to blend with the agrarian nature of the County. Class 1 and Class 2 WCFs may employ silo and tree stealth designs, and bell tower and flag pole structures may be used for Class 1 WCFs. Other stealth designs in addition to these four models may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

## Third-Party Engineering Review

As recommended by the Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study, the text amendment also includes language to allow the County to use a third-party wireless telecommunications engineer or consultant to review and provide recommendations on new WCF applications. This is similar to the County's current practice of using engineering consultants to review site plans and subdivision plats for impacts such as erosion and sediment control, transportation, and Karst. Third-party engineering review would be required for all Class 2, 3, and 4 applications and would be required at the discretion of the Zoning Administrator for all Class 1 and Class 5 applications as well as co-location applications and applications to add/replace/or maintain equipment.

## **Planning Commission Recommendation:**

Following a duly advertised Public Hearing on May 5, 2017, the Planning Commission voted 9-0-2 (Kruhm, Lee absent) to recommend adoption of the proposed text amendment. Frank Stearns (Verizon Wireless) spoke in favor of the text amendment at the Public Hearing

## **Staff Recommendation:**

Staff has no outstanding concerns with the adoption of the text amendment.

Ordinance Amendment Text (Changes shown in bold italics with strikethroughs where necessary; changes since April 7 meeting shown in red):

- 3-C-2-u Monopoles for Telecommunication Antennae: Wireless Communication Facilities (WCFs):
- A site plan, in accord with Section 6 of this ordinance, shall be submitted for Monopoles for Telecommunication Antennae (note: Section 6-H-12, Standards for Monopoles for Telecommunication Antennae, contains additional specific regulations). A monopole is a self-supporting single shaft structure. It does not have guy wires and is not a lattice tower with multiple legs and cross-bracing structure
- 1. Purpose and objectives; Telecommunications Engineering Study.
  - a. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this section and the design standards in §6-H-12 is to provide for the siting of Wireless Communication Facilities (WCFs) by establishing requirements for the siting, construction and modification of monopoles, towers, stealth structures, support structures, and associated equipment.
  - b. <u>Objectives</u>. The objectives of this section are:
    - (1) To reduce the adverse visual impact of such facilities
    - (2) To encourage the placement of WCFs in locations with appropriate vegetative cover and screening, and encourage co-location of antennas as an alternative to construction of new WCFs
    - (3) To promote alternative stealth structure design
    - (4) To facilitate deployment of WCFs to provide coverage to all residents and businesses of Clarke County in a manner consistent with the County's character
  - c. <u>Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study</u>. This section is intended to be applied in conjunction with the County's Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study. The Study's proposed locations for new WCFs are a guide to maximize telecommunications service to residents and businesses and to minimize adverse impact on the County's scenic and historic resources.
- 2. Classes of Wireless Communication Facilities. WCFs shall be divided into the following classes:
  - a. <u>Class 1</u>. WCFs with a height not to exceed fifty (50) feet above ground level (AGL). Such design shall be limited to a monopole or "stealth" design.

    Antennas must be surface mounted on the monopole.

- b. <u>Class 2</u>. WCFs with a height not to exceed eighty (80) feet above ground level (AGL). Such facilities shall be limited to a monopole or "stealth" design.

  Antennas must be surface mounted on the monopole.
- c. <u>Class 3</u>. WCFs with a height not to exceed one hundred and twenty (120) feet above ground level (AGL). Such facilities shall be limited to a monopole design as the support structure.
- d. <u>Class 4</u>. WCFs with a height not to exceed one hundred and ninety nine (199) feet above ground level (AGL). Such facilities shall be limited to a monopole design as the support structure.
- e. <u>Class 5.</u> Amateur radio antennas subject to the limitations of Code of Virginia §15.2-2293.1 and Federal Communications Commission (FCC) provisions specified in the Code of Federal Regulations.

#### 3. General Use Standards.

- a. All WCFs must meet current standards and regulations of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), FCC, and any other agency of the county, state, or federal government with the authority to regulate WCFs. If regulations change and WCFs are required to comply with such changes, the owners of the WCFs governed by this ordinance shall bring WCFs into compliance within six (6) months of the effective date of such change in standards or regulations. Failure to comply shall constitute grounds for the removal of the WCFs at the owner's expense.
- b. WCFs shall be considered either a principal or accessory use.
- 4. By-right uses. The uses listed in this subsection are deemed to be by-right uses subject to review and approval of a site development plan demonstrating compliance with this section, §6-H-12, and other applicable sections of the Zoning Ordinance:
  - a. <u>Co-location</u>. Co-location of new antennas, electronics, cables, and ground support equipment to include cabinets, shelters, power supply transformers, generators, fuel tanks, power meters and other required support equipment on existing WCFs or other structures. The site development plan shall be subject to administrative review and approval by the Zoning Administrator. Third-party engineering review may be required if deemed necessary by the Zoning Administrator.
  - b. <u>Class 1 and Class 5 WCFs</u>. The site development plan shall be subject to administrative review and approval by the Zoning Administrator. Third-party engineering review may be required if deemed necessary by the Zoning Administrator.

- c. <u>Class 2 WCFs</u>. The site development plan shall be subject to administrative review and approval by the Planning Commission including third-party engineering review.
- d. <u>Distributed antenna systems (DAS)</u>. Installing a DAS (such as a cable microcell network) through the use of multiple low-powered transmitters/receivers attached to existing wireless systems, such as conventional cable or telephone equipment, or similar technology that does not require the use of WCFs. The site development plan shall be subject to administrative review and approval by the Zoning Administrator. Third-party engineering review may be required if deemed necessary by the Zoning Administrator.
- e. <u>WCF upgrades/equipment maintenance of an existing wireless provider on a WCF</u>. The site development plan shall be subject to administrative review and approval by the Zoning Administrator. Third-party engineering review may be required if deemed necessary by the Zoning Administrator.

# 5. Special Uses.

- a. The uses listed in this subsection require issuance of a Special Use Permit including review and approval of a site development plan demonstrating compliance with this section, §6-H-12, and other applicable sections of the Zoning Ordinance:
  - (1) Class 3 & 4 WCFs.
  - (2) Any Class 3 or Class 4 WCF which is being rebuilt on the same parcel to accommodate the co-location of an additional WCF. The rebuilt WCF shall meet all requirements of this section and §6-H-12. There shall only be one (1) WCF per Special Use Permit in the designated compound area.
- b. In granting a Special Use Permit, the Planning Commission may recommend and the Board of Supervisors may impose conditions to the extent that the Board concludes such conditions are necessary to minimize any adverse effect of the proposed WCF on adjoining properties.
- 6. <u>Co-location of antennas as required by Federal law.</u> Notwithstanding any provision of this Ordinance related to Special Use Permit requirements and procedures on any specific special use condition placed on an approved monopole WCF, the Zoning Administrator shall administratively approve an amendment to the previously approved site development plan for a monopole a site development plan to allow co-location, removal, or replacement of transmission equipment antennas, electronics, cables, and ground support equipment to include cabinets, shelters, power supply transformers, generators, fuel tanks, power meters and other required support equipment on existing Class 1, 2,

- 3, or 4 WCFs, as required by Federal law, that meets all of the following standards:
- a. The co-location, removal, or replacement of equipment does not result in the monopole *WCF* failing to meet the requirements of §6-H-12-b and §6-H-12-e §6-H-12-a-5 of this Ordinance.
- b. Installation of the proposed equipment does not increase the height of the monopole *WCF* by more than 10% of the original approved height or by the height needed to provide 20 feet of separation from the closest antenna array location on the monopole *WCF*, whichever is greater, except that the mounting of the proposed equipment may exceed these limits if necessary to avoid interference with equipment existing on the monopole *WCF*. For any request to exceed height limits to avoid interference with existing equipment on the monopole *WCF*, the applicant shall provide a report by a licensed engineer to justify the request. Such report shall be evaluated by the County's engineering consultant and the applicant shall be responsible for reimbursing the county for all costs associated with the consultant's review.
- c. Installation of the proposed equipment would not involve the installation of more than the standard number of new equipment cabinets for the technology involved, not to exceed four, or more than one new equipment shelter. New equipment shelters and cabinets shall be located within the existing approved compound.
- d. Installation of the proposed equipment would not involve the adding of any appurtenance that would protrude from the edge of the monopole more than 20 feet or protrude more than the width of the largest existing appurtenance, whichever is less. Mounting of the proposed equipment may exceed the foregoing size limits if necessary to provide shelter from inclement weather or to connect the equipment to the monopole via cable.
- **de**. Installation of the proposed equipment would not involve excavation outside the boundaries of the monopole *WCF* site depicted on the original approved site development plan.
- 78. <u>Compliance with Federal and State regulations required.</u> Compliance with all Federal Aviation Administration and Federal Communication Commission requirements, including review by the Virginia Department of Historic Resources of properties eligible for listing and listed on the National Register of Historic Places in accord with Section 106 procedures, shall be demonstrated in writing if required by statute.
- 89. <u>Commercial use of Class 5 WCFs prohibited</u>. There shall be no co-location of any commercial antennas or equipment on any Class 5 amateur radio WCF for service other than the owner/operator of the Class 5 structure. If any commercial service is located on the WCF, the Class 5 WCF shall lose its status as a Class 5 WCF and shall become a commercial facility and be treated as such under County, State and Federal regulations.

9. Existing monopoles and telecommunication towers. Monopoles in existence as of the adoption date of this ordinance shall be considered as WCFs with a Class that corresponds to the monopole's height. Existing telecommunication towers in excess of 199 feet in height or having a design other than a monopole shall not be considered WCFs for the purpose of this ordinance.

6-H-12 Monopoles for Telecommunication Antennae

Design Standards for Wireless Communication Facilities (WCFs)

# 6-H-12-a. **Design Standards**

- 1. All WCFs shall be a monopole or stealth design.
- 2. <u>Prohibition on lighted WCF</u>. A monopole WCF shall not trigger a requirement, public or private, that it be lighted nor shall it be lighted on a voluntary basis.


# 3. Height *requirements*.

- a. The maximum height for a Class 1 WCF shall be fifty (50) feet including any attachments.
- b. The maximum height of a Class 2 WCF shall be eighty (80) feet including any attachments.
- c. The maximum height of a Class 3 WCF shall be one hundred and twenty (120) feet including any attachments.
- d. The maximum height of a Class 4 WCF shall be one hundred and ninety nine (199) feet including any attachments.
- e. Class 5 WCFs shall conform to all Federal codes regulating amateur radio Licenses.
- f. Determination of monopole height shall include any attachments to the monopole WCF. Lightning rods shall be exempt from the maximum height calculation.
- 4. Aesthetic requirements. WCFs shall meet the following aesthetic requirements:
  - a. The visual impact of a monopole WCF and any associated facilities (including attachments, security fencing, utilities, and equipment shelters) shall blend with the natural and built environment of the surrounding area using mitigation measures such as: architecture, color, innovative design, landscaping, setbacks greater than the minimum required, materials, siting, topography, and visual screening. The number of existing monopoles readily apparent Class 2, 3, and 4 WCFs in an area shall also be considered when determining visual impact of a new monopole WCF. Monopoles Class 3 or 4 WCFs shall not ridge lines, but down slope from the top of ridge lines exceed the maximum height of the tree canopy on the topographic crest of the Blue Ridge Mountains.

Administrative Review of the site development plan, including third-party engineering review, will determine if stealth technology shall be used and what

- type of stealth technology is required if the WCF design and placement is determined not to meet the objectives stated within this Ordinance.
- b. The design of buildings and related structures within the WCF compound area shall, to the extent possible, use materials and colors that will blend into the natural setting and surrounding trees. Security fencing shall be six (6) feet tall, and dark green or black in color made of chain link.
- c. If various antennas, cables and electronics are installed on a structure other than another WCF (i.e., water tower, light pole, rooftop, sign or silo), the antenna and supporting electrical and mechanical equipment must be of a neutral color that is identical to, or closely compatible with, the color of the supporting structure so as to make the antenna and related equipment as visually unobtrusive as possible.
- d. The monopole shall have the minimum diameter necessary to accommodate the proposed attachments. Attachments to the monopole shall be the same color as the monopole. Attachments to the monopole shall have the minimum dimensions and protrusion for the monopole based on the best available technology or shall be enclosed within the pole. A lightening rod may be mounted as an extension of a monopole and shall be included in determining the height of the monopole. The Board of Supervisors may require attachments to the monopole to be flush-mounted as a means of reducing visibility of the monopole from surrounding properties.
- d. Stealth Technology. Stealth technology may be used on WCFs as set forth below. Because of the agrarian nature and beauty of the County, the silo structure will be the highest valued stealth technology. This technology of silo stealth structures should blend harmoniously with the existing farm structures.
  - (1) The design standards for the "Silo" stealth structure shall be:
    - (a) All equipment except for local commercial power service shall be placed inside of the silo. This provision shall not apply to the colocation of antennas on existing silos.
    - (b) The silo shall not exceed eighty (80) feet at ground level (AGL).
    - (c) The silo shall match any existing silo on the property in architectural design and colors.
    - (d) Silo compounds must match existing fencing located on the agricultural property.


- (e) Renderings prepared by a licensed landscape architect shall be provided for all stealth silo applications.
- (f) The WCF shall be a Class 1 or Class 2.

- (2) The design standards for the bell tower stealth structure shall be:
  - (a) All bell tower stealth WCFs shall match architecturally to the existing building's architecture.
  - (b) All bell tower stealth WCFs shall be no more than a 2:1 ratio from height of the bell tower to roof line of existing structure not to exceed fifty (50) feet AGL.
  - (c) All bell tower stealth WCFs shall be located within twenty (20) feet of the existing match structure.
  - (d) Renderings prepared by a licensed landscape architect shall be provided for all bell tower stealth structure applications.
  - (e) The WCF shall be a Class 1.

- (3) The design standards for a tree stealth structure shall be:
  - (a) Must not be higher than twenty (20) feet above the existing tree line measured from trees within a 200 foot radius of the proposed site.
  - (b) The tree structure must be designed to resemble an evergreen species native to Clarke County.
  - (c) The tree structure must have textured bark, branches and foliage that encapsulate the cables, electronics and antennas.
  - (d) The colors of the tree structure must blend with existing trees of that species and variety.
  - (e) The structure must meet all design standards for stability and must be maintained for accuracy of the colors and foliage.
  - (f) Renderings prepared by a licensed landscape architect shall be provided for all tree stealth structure applications.
  - (g) The WCF shall be a Class 1 or 2. May be a Class 3 WCF depending upon topography of site and surrounding properties and the height of surrounding tree coverage.

- (4) The Design standards for the flag pole stealth structure shall be:
  - (a) All antennas, cables, electronics and devices must fit within the designed enclosure of the flag pole.
  - (b) The flag pole shall be used as a flag pole and fly a flag accordingly. If the flag is flown at night adequate lighting shall be installed.
  - (c) The flag pole shall not have reflective paint.
  - (d) Renderings prepared by a licensed landscape architect shall be provided for all flag pole stealth structure applications.
  - (e) The WCF shall be a Class 1.

# 5. Setbacks and Buffering

a. <u>Setback requirements from property lines and structures</u>. Class 1, 2, 3, and 4 WCFs shall be set back from all property lines and structures a distance equivalent to the WCF's fall zone, or the WCF's fall zone and required perimeter buffer area, whichever distance is greater. The WCF's designed fall zone shall be described in the applicant's site development plan. For parcels located adjacent to the Appalachian National Scenic Trail Corridor, WCFs shall be set back a minimum of 400 feet from the footprint of the Appalachian Trail.

A monopole shall be set back a distance equal to at least 100% of its height from any property line. A monopole shall be set back a distance equal to at least twice its height from any public right of way (except as noted below). A monopole shall not be located on and shall be set back a distance equal to at least four times its height from the following:

- (1) Parcels comprising the Appalachian National Scenic Trail corridor
- (2) Parcels under permanent open space easement
- (3) The State Arboretum of Virginia portion of the University of Virginia's Blandy Farm
- (4) State designated Scenic Byways
- (5) The Shenandoah River (a state designated scenic river)
- (6) State Parks and Wildlife Management Areas.
- b. <u>Setback requirements for buildings and support equipment</u>. For any building or structure associated with a WCF and inclusive of required perimeter buffer areas per subsection (d), the minimum setback from any property line abutting a public road or shared private access easement right of way shall be fifty (50) feet and in all other instances shall be no less than twenty-five (25) feet. No setback shall be required for private access easements or portions thereof designed exclusively to provide ingress and egress from the WCF compound to a public road.
- c. <u>Method for measuring setback distances</u>. Setbacks shall be measured from the closest structural member on the WCF. Guy lines shall be exempt from the minimum setback requirements in side and rear yards for the respective zoning district but shall comply with the front yard setback requirements.
- d. <u>Perimeter buffer</u>. The monopole Class 3 and 4 WCFs shall be located in a wooded area of dense tree cover referred to as the perimeter buffer. This dense tree cover The perimeter buffer shall have a minimum depth of 50 feet from the compound fencing as a radius around the perimeter of the area to be cleared for the monopole WCF. All trees within 120 feet of the perimeter of the area to be cleared the perimeter buffer for the monopole Class 3 or 4 WCF must be retained, unless specifically approved for removal on the site development plan.

Within 25 feet of the compound fencing, the perimeter buffer shall be supplemented with evergreen trees planted in a double-staggered row and shrubs as necessary to effectively screen the compound and WCF structure base from view. The Planning Commission may request additional planting within the remaining 25 feet of the perimeter buffer on a case-by case basis to ensure effective and appropriate screening. All vegetation within the perimeter buffer shall be maintained throughout the lifespan of the WCF.

e. <u>Setbacks for co-location on other support structure</u>. For co-location of antennas and equipment on a support structure other than a WCF (e.g., building, water tower, silo), the governing setbacks shall be the support structure's current setback requirements as enumerated in the Ordinance.

# 6. Other Design Requirements

a. <u>Compound design requirements</u>. The area to be cleared for the compound containing a the monopole Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 WCF and support facilities shall be the minimum necessary to accommodate the facilities and shall not exceed 2,500 square feet. The driveways accessing the compound shall be gated.

# b. <u>Design requirements for buildings and support equipment.</u>

- (1) Equipment cabinets shall not be more than twelve (12) feet in height. Structures designed to house equipment shall not exceed the maximum building height for the zoning district in which the subject property is located.
- (2) If the equipment cabinet or structure is located on the roof of a building, the area of the equipment structure and related equipment shall not occupy more than 25% of the roof area. The equipment cabinet or structure and related equipment shall also be completely screened from view on all sides of the building.
- (3) Equipment cabinets or structures shall comply with all applicable building codes.
- c. Advertisement signs are prohibited. Signs compliant to FCC requirements containing ownership, operational, and name plate data shall be allowed.
- d. All WCFs shall have appropriate FCC signage and contact information for emergency communications.

# 6-H-12-b. Application Requirements

- 1. <u>Requirements for Class 1 and Class 2 WCF applications</u>. Applicants requesting approval of a Class 1 or Class 2 WCFs shall submit the following information to the Zoning Administrator for review:
  - a. A site development plan consisting of a scaled plan and a scaled elevation view and other supporting drawings, calculations, and other documentation, signed and sealed by a licensed Professional Engineer, Surveyor, Landscape Architect or Architect, showing the following information:
    - (1) Legal description of subject property and proposed lease area (if applicable)
    - (2) Design and height of the proposed WCF,
    - (3) Proposed means of access from the public road to the WCF site
    - (4) Setbacks from the property lines, existing structures on the subject property, and existing private access easements
    - (5) Distances to uses and structures on adjacent properties
    - (6) Elevation of the proposed WCF site and surrounding topography
    - (7) Location of all improvements including but not limited to compound location, equipment cabinets, structures, fencing, and signage
    - (8) Existing tree coverage and vegetation
    - (9) Zoning of subject property and adjacent properties
    - (10) General location of all residences and structures within two-thousand (2,000) feet of the proposed WCF
    - (11) Any other information deemed by the Zoning Administrator to be necessary to assess compliance with this ordinance
  - b. A cover letter that outlines what the applicant is proposing to do on-site.
  - c. Any fees associated with the review of the application by the County and/or its consultant shall be paid by the applicant at submittal.
  - d. Structural engineering documentation shall be provided demonstrating compliance with all applicable building codes and regulations. A diagram and statement certified and sealed by a licensed structural engineer shall also be provided that describes the fall zone for the proposed WCF.
  - e. The Zoning Administrator may request additional information if needed while reviewing an application for administrative approval. Failure to provide the requested information shall result in the denial of the application.
  - f. A Karst plan per §6-H-15 shall be provided.

- g. A statement justifying the need for the project by a licensed telecommunications provider. In the event that none of the applicants are a telecommunications provider, a letter of intent from a licensed telecommunications provider to operate on the proposed WCF upon its completion shall be provided. This statement shall include the following:
  - (1) A description of how the location of the proposed WCF is consistent with the guidance provided in the County's Telecommunications Engineering Study.
  - (2) The unsuitability of the use of existing WCFs, other structures or alternative technology not requiring the use of WCFs or structures to provide the services under consideration.
  - (3) A map depicting all co-location candidates in the search area, along with the RF analysis documentation as to their suitability. These include propagation modeling for the network before the applicant's request and after if approved.
- h. A description of compliance with all applicable Federal, State, or local laws including the following actual documents addressing the historic site impact review Section 106 Historical Review portion of the approved National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) statement, and the TOWAIR determination results for FAA registration.
- i. A landscape plan showing specific landscape materials including proposed plantings to comply with perimeter buffer requirements.
- j. If required, a method of security fencing (no less than six (6) feet in height) with anti-climbing device and finished color and, if applicable, the method of camouflage and illumination.
- k. At least 2 (two) actual photographs of the site that include simulated photographic images of the proposed WCF at the proposed construction height and at a height 10% greater than the proposed construction height to simulate future co-location. The photographs with the simulated image shall illustrate how the facility will look from adjacent roadways, nearby residential areas, or public buildings such as a school, church, etc. The Zoning Administrator reserves the right to select the location for the photographic images and require additional images. The applicant at the Zoning Administrator's request shall conduct a balloon test to demonstrate the height of a proposed monopole WCF with a potential 10% height increase to simulate future co-location and provide adjoining property owners with a 48-hour notice of the test.
- I. The applicant shall identify the type of construction of the existing WCF(s) and the owner/operator of the existing WCF(s), if known.

- m. A statement by the applicant as to whether construction of the WCF will accommodate co-location of antennas including the number and dimensions of available co-location positions.
- n. Identification of the entities providing the backhaul network for the WCF(s) described in the application and other cellular sites owned or operated by the applicant in the County.
- o. A description, including mapping at an appropriate scale, of the search area and coverage objective. A figure depicting the radio frequency coverage (or propagation map) of the proposed facility and all nearby facilities shall also be provided. Propagation maps shall show a minimum of three (3) signal intensities in milliwatts.
- p. A cost estimate for removal of the WCF and facilities from the site.
- q. An application for a site development plan review shall be signed by the owner(s) of the property on which the WCF is to be sited and by the telecommunications provider or developer of the WCF site.
- 2. <u>Requirements for Class 3 and 4 WCF applications</u>. In addition to the application requirements for Class 1 and Class 2 WCF applications, applicants requesting a Special Use Permit to construct a new monopole Class 3 or 4 WCF shall submit the following information to the Zoning Administrator for review and action by the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors:
  - a. Applications for new proposed Class 3 WCFs shall depict a location that is consistent with the guidance regarding the Permitted Commercial Tower Development Areas (PCTDA) depicted in the County's Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study.
  - b. Applications for new proposed Class 4 WCFs shall demonstrate the following:
    - (1) A location that is consistent with the guidance regarding the Permitted Commercial Tower Development Areas (PCTDA) depicted in the County's Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study.
    - (2) In order to justify a maximum height in excess of 120 feet, the applicant shall demonstrate one or more of the following conditions:
      - (a) The proposed site would provide a demonstrable coverage improvement over a Class 3 tower height and would be consistent with the guidance regarding the County's coverage goals in the Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study.

- (b) Need to ensure proper connectivity for microwave "point to point" systems. A Path Study and evidence of rejection from fiber optic providers shall be submitted with the application.
- (c) Proposed WCF is required by the property owner to be located in an area with a lower elevation in relation to the overall elevation of the subject property. Setback calculations with ground elevation profile diagrams and property owner requirements shall be submitted with the application.
- cf. An application for a monopole Special Use Permit and site *development* plan *review* application shall be signed by the owner(s) of the property on which the monopole *WCF* is to be sited and by the telecommunications provider or developer of the monopole *WCF* site.
- At time of submission of a monopole special use permit and site development plan application, the applicant shall document that it considered at least two alternative sites a new WCF is required because there is no existing structure of sufficient height within the Applicant's search ring available for possible colocation, and set forth its reasons for selecting the site proposed. After a public hearing on an application, an applicant may be requested to consider alternate sites that in the opinion of the reviewing body will better comply with the objectives and regulations for monopole siting of new WCFs.
- **eh.** Verifiable evidence shall be provided in writing showing the lack of antenna space on existing towers, buildings, or other structures suitable for antenna location, or evidence of the unsuitability of existing tower locations for colocation.
- and other supporting drawings, calculations, and other documentation showing the location and dimensions of all improvements, including topography; existing zoning; existing tree coverage and vegetation; height requirements; setbacks from property line; access drives; fencing; distances to adjacent uses and adjacent buildings, and the general location of all residences and structures within two thousand (2,000) feet of the proposed monopole.
- e. A figure depicting the radio frequency coverage (or propagation map) of the proposed facility and all nearby facilities. Propagation maps shall show a minimum of three (3) signal intensities in milliwatts.
- d. At least 2 (two) actual photographs of the site that include simulated photographic images of the proposed monopole. The photographs with the simulated image shall illustrate how the facility will look from adjacent roadways, nearby residential areas, or public buildings such as a school, church, etc. The zoning administrator reserves the right to select the location for the photographic images

and require additional images. The applicant at the zoning administrator's request shall conduct a balloon test to demonstrate the height of a proposed monopole and provide adjoining property owners with a 48-hour notice of the test.

- e. The zoning administrator may require other information deemed necessary to assess compliance with this ordinance.
- i. To ensure the structural integrity and wind load capacity of monopole, the monopole owner shall ensure that it is designed and maintained in compliance with standards contained in applicable building codes and regulations.

# 3. Requirements for amateur radio antennas (Class 5 WCFs).

- a. A site development plan to be reviewed and acted upon administratively by the Zoning Administrator shall be provided for all Class 5 WCFs. The site development plan shall depict the antenna design, height, and setbacks from property lines, public rights of way, private access easements, and existing structures on the subject property.
- b. Maximum height. The maximum height of a Class 5 WCF shall be the lowest height limitation permitted by Code of Virginia §15.2-2293.1.
- c. Setback requirements. Class 5 WCFs shall be set back a minimum distance of 100% of the antenna's height from all property lines and private access easements.

#### 4. Requirements for co-location applications.

- a. This section shall apply to all applications to co-locate new antennas and required support equipment on existing WCFs and structures, including the installation of distributed antenna systems (DAS).
- b. A site development plan consisting of a scaled plan and a scaled elevation view and other supporting drawings, calculations, and other documentation, signed and sealed by a licensed Professional Engineer, Surveyor, Landscape Architect or Architect, shall be provided by the Applicant showing the following information:
  - (1) Legal description of subject property and proposed lease area (if applicable)
  - (2) Sketch showing the existing WCF or structure, the dimensions and location of the antenna and equipment to be co-located, and the proposed change in the height of the structure as a result of the co-location if applicable

- (3) Sketch showing dimensions and location of all proposed equipment, cabinets, and structures to be added to the WCF compound. For colocation on structures other than a WCF, setback distances from property lines and adjacent structures shall be shown.
- (4) All proposed changes to existing landscaping, buffering, fencing, signage, and other material site features.
- (5) Any other information deemed by the Zoning Administrator to be necessary to assess compliance with this ordinance
- c. Co-location applications shall be signed by the property owner or by the owner or lessee of the WCF or structure.
- d. Applications to co-locate a new antenna and equipment on an existing WCF shall be considered an amendment of the existing site development plan for the WCF and shall be acted upon administratively by the Zoning Administrator. For co-location on Class 3 or Class 4 WCFs, such applications shall demonstrate compliance with any special conditions imposed in conjunction with the special use permit.

# 5. Requirements for applications to upgrade/maintain existing equipment.

- a. This section shall apply to all applications to upgrade, change, modify, or maintain existing equipment on a WCF or a structure containing antennas for telecommunications. This section shall also apply to applications to upgrade, change, modify, or maintain structural elements of existing WCFs or structures containing antennas for telecommunications.
- b. A site development plan consisting of a scaled plan and a scaled elevation view and other supporting drawings, calculations, and other documentation, signed and sealed by a licensed Professional Engineer, Surveyor, Landscape Architect or Architect, shall be provided by the Applicant showing the following information:
  - (1) Legal description of subject property and proposed lease area (if applicable)
  - (2) Sketch showing dimensions and location of all proposed equipment, cabinets, and structures to be added, changed, or otherwise altered and their position on the WCF compound. For changes to existing equipment on structures other than a WCF, changes to setback distances from property lines and adjacent structures shall be shown.
  - (3) All proposed changes to existing landscaping, buffering, fencing, signage, and other material site features.
  - (4) Any other information deemed by the Zoning Administrator to be necessary to assess compliance with this ordinance

- c. Applications to upgrade/maintain existing equipment shall be signed by the property owner or by the owner or lessee of the WCF or structure.
- d. Applications to replace equipment on an existing WCF shall be considered an amendment of the existing site plan for the WCF and shall be acted upon administratively by the Zoning Administrator. For co-location on Class 3 or Class 4 WCFs, such applications shall demonstrate compliance with any special conditions imposed in conjunction with the special use permit.

#### 6-H-12-c. Inactive WCFs; Removal Bond Required

- 1. <u>Inactive WCFs.</u> The owner of the monopole an inactive WCF shall dismantle the monopole support structure, antennas, and all associated structures if no functioning privately owned telecommunication antenna is attached to the monopole for 12 consecutive months WCF is operated for a continuous period of six (6) months, and restore the site as nearly as possible to preexisting site conditions. The owner of the WCF shall remove the same within ninety (90) days of receipt of notice from the County notifying the owner of the inactive WCF. If there are two or more users of a single WCF, then this provision shall not become effective until all users cease using the WCF.
- 2. <u>Annual user reports</u>. The owner of a Class 1, 2, 3 or Class 4 WCF shall provide, by July 1 annually to the Zoning Administrator, an inventory of all active and inactive users on the WCF.
- 3. A bond *or letter of credit* must *shall* be posted at the time of monopole *WCF* approval, in the event the County must remove the monopole *WCF* upon abandonment. This bond *or letter of credit* shall be equal to the cost to remove the monopole *WCF*, all monopole *WCF* and fence footers, underground cables, and support buildings, plus 25%. The bond *or letter of credit* shall be renewed every five years *remain in effect* for the life of the monopole *WCF*.

# 6-H-12-d. Third-Party Engineering Review

The County reserves the right to employ the services of a third-party wireless telecommunications engineer or consultant to review all WCF applications. All applicable costs for the third-party review shall be the responsibility of the applicant.

# 6-H-12-e. Engineering Information Provided by Applicant

Any information of an engineering nature that the applicant submits, whether civil, mechanical, or electrical, shall be certified by a licensed professional engineer.

6-H-12-f Monopoles, antennas, and equipment mounted to or located at the base of the monopole shall either maintain a flat, non-glossy, non-reflective galvanized steel finish or be painted a neutral color so as to reduce visual obtrusiveness.

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# PROPOSED NEW DEFINITIONS (ARTICLE 9)

<u>Compound area</u> – The area located at the base of the WCF, defined by a fenced boundary, that contains support structures, generators, equipment cabinets or shelters, and other accessory items necessary to the function of the WCF and the antennas located on it.

<u>Co-location</u> -- The shared use of an antenna support structure by two or more wireless service providers or other entities that operate antennas. Co-location may occur on structures other than wireless communication facilities (WCFs) including but not limited to water tanks, lattice towers, rooftops, utility poles, silos, and similar structures. The use of a non-WCF structure by one wireless service provider or other entity that operates antennas shall also be considered co-location.

<u>Distributed Antenna System (DAS)</u> – A network of spatially separated antenna nodes connected to a common source via a transport medium that provides wireless service within a geographic area or structure.

<u>Fall zone</u> – The maximum distance from the structure base of a wireless communications facility (WCF) that the WCF is designed to fall in the event of a structural failure and collapse.

<u>Monopole</u> -- A hollow or solid, cylindrical self-supporting structure which is made of steel, wood or concrete.

<u>Permitted Commercial Tower Development Area (PCTDA)</u> – Pre-planned location areas where it is recommended that WCFs be constructed to provide for commercial wireless carriers. PCTDAs are designated in the County's Telecommunications Infrastructure and Broadband Study and are plotted at road intersections with a ½ mile radius for proposed WCF locations.

<u>Stealth technology</u> — A design method to conceal or disguise antenna structures and antennas associated with wireless communication facilities including, but not limited to, tree poles, flag poles, bell towers, silos, and lookout towers.

<u>Wireless Communication Facility (WCF)</u> – All infrastructures and equipment including, but not limited to, antenna support structures, antennas, transmission cables, equipment shelters, equipment cabinets, utility pedestals, ground equipment, fencing, signage, and other ancillary equipment associated with the transmission or reception of wireless communications.

#### 4. Economic Development and Tourism Update

Highlights of update by Len Capelli, Clarke County Economic Development Director, include:

- Attended agri-tourism conference in Richmond followed by a Go-Virginia Initiative event.
- Go Virginia Initiative very frustrating and a confusing environment.
- Facility Construction:
  - Could build on land by the business park.
  - Explore public private partnership
  - Facility could include offices, warehouse space, and rooms for use as a manufacturing incubator.
  - To address current regional labor shortages, consider using facility for training.
- Visited a farm-based brewery.
- Farm Tour:
  - Agri-tourism initiative
  - Well attended
  - May structure differently next year.
  - Each farm had items for sell.
- Hosted Virginia Department of Economic Development in conjunction with local jurisdictions over the past two days,.
- Value-added farming:
  - Distributed survey
  - Met with LFCC this week.
- Spirit Trail: Do not have final approval.
  - Tourism Partnership: Joint marketing of region. Kicking off a major event at the regional airport next week.

At 1:20 pm, Betsy Pritchard joined the meeting.

#### 5. Old Business

#### Equine / Livestock Survey Discussion

#### Highlights include:

- Questions: What is EDAC's mission? Is it being asked to endorse the survey?
- Len Capelli:
  - Does not endorse a survey and has never endorsed a survey.
  - Willing to work with people that are willing to do it.
  - Has offered to work with Dr. Myer and Equine Alliance on a survey.
  - He has never gotten anyone telling him what questions they want and what they are going to do with the answers.
  - The County hasn't changed that much in the ten to twelve years since the last survey.
  - He can see Equine Alliance's point that they want to come together and form a strong, leverage organization that can help promote more equine operations and improvements.
  - Market to have Clarke recognized as one of the top equine places in the state.

#### Dr. Meyer:

- Equine alliance does promote a survey.
- Several studies available that provide good information but are not specific to the area.
- Want to see what the activity level is in Clarke County, which he opined had changed since the 2004 survey.
- Can re-evaluate when more member feedback is available.
- Marketing leverage seems a good direction.
- Could enlarge the scope of the survey to include all farm animals, which would also get greater participation.

#### Betsy Pritchard:

- Dynamic has changed in the County over the years.
- Agree with the marketing approach.
- What will the survey do? Is there some monetary gain? Is it just the facts? What does
  the Alliance hope to gain beside statistics? Would there be more funding?

#### Jim Barb:

- Equine Alliance needs to evaluate activity and create an inventory to establish a base to aid in determining what will be marketed.
- Could check tax records how much has been invested in riding rinks and other equine businesses.

 Could check permits in the Building Department as to what may have been built over the last ten to fifteen years.

#### John Milleson:

- There are times caution is required for the results may not be as hoped.
- The Board of Supervisors member did not appear enthusiastic about the proposed survey. Christina Kraybill concurred.

#### In conclusion, Chairman Milleson summarized:

- Economic Development Advisory Committee will not take actionat this time.
- It will wait for Len Capelli to help with any marketing.
- It will wait for the Equine Alliance to get more information.

#### Real Estate Seminar Planning

#### Highlights of discussion include:

- Over the next few years, four to five thousand jobs will be added in Winchester not including those being added in Loudoun and Berkeley Counties.
- To prepare for this influx, the Board of Supervisors and the Planning Commission should review demographics.
- By consensus, the Committee agreed to develop a seminar to be presented to the Industrial Development Authority, Clarke County School Board, Berryville Town Council, Boyce Town Council, Clarke County Planning Commission, and the Clarke County Board of Supervisors.
- The Committee asked staff to research contact information for Housing Virginia.

## <u>Len Capelli Response to Statement in April 19, 2017, EDAC Minutes Equine Alliance Presentation</u> by Chris Bates

Mr. Capelli stated that he wanted to go on the record and say that two statements that were purportedly made by him were not.

Lora Walburn noted that Mr. Capelli's April report reflected that he had written "and I will write a grant request to the Virginia Tourism Corporation." She opined that Mr. Bates might have misunderstood; and, Mr. Capelli, at the May 17 meeting, was clarifying that his intent was not to write a grant for a survey as believed by Mr. Bates.

Mr. Capelli responded that it was a marketing grant. He added that he had written a grant for the studio tour, The Gathering, The Barns, and offered to write one for equine marketing. He stated that it was always a Virginia Tourism marketing grant.

#### New Business

#### Industrial Development Authority and Economic Development Advisory Committee

Highlights of discussion include:

- Previously, the two public bodies had a cross-over member, David Juday, who now serves as the IDA Chair.
- In 1999 when the Economic Development Advisory Committee was established, it was tasked with review of a bi-annual financial report to review revenue to identify potential revenue shortfalls and make recommendations. Staff will research this report.
- Jim Barb provided historic information on reviews performed by the EDAC.
- Len Capelli commented:
  - Outside his presentation, there is very little discussion at the IDA meetings, which is why the content is similar.
  - The IDA issues bonds but is more reactive than proactive.
  - IDA is looking at changing its investments but the Treasurer has not attended the last two quarterly meetings.
  - It takes a long time to get things done there.
  - The IDA provides funding to the SBDC and Dale Maza, SBDC, gave a presentation at its April meeting.
- Christina Kraybill put forth that the EDAC was to be a proactive, visionary group; and the IDA is the reactive group.
- Lora Walburn provided the following:
  - Alton Echols requested information specific to the 2011 Industrial Development Authority of the Clarke County \$4,300,000 bond to Berryville United Methodist Housing, L.P., to finance the costs of acquiring, rehabilitating, equipping, and furnishing Mary Hardesty House, a multifamily rental residential facility consisting of 60 dwelling units for persons and families of low and moderate incomes.
  - Berryville Clarke County Industrial Development Corporation stock has no value.
  - David Weiss is the BoS liaison to both the IDA and the EDAC.
- By consensus, the Board agreed to include IDA minutes in future packets.

Library's Public Relations Committee helps increase use of libraries

The Public Relations Committee was formed over three years ago with the "small" task of growing the library's social media presence and better utilizing the platforms. Members are drawn from every branch and every library department. Since then, the scope has grown to include monthly messages with print and digital signage, national campaigns (Library Card Sign-Up Month), and special projects such as planning the Bowman Library anniversary party and making a Libraries Transform video. The current purpose of the Public Relations Committee is to strategically utilize all available marketing tools to connect and engage with our community, to be a source of information, and to increase awareness of our library branches and library services. These tools include social media platforms, our website, and print and digital signage. The committee's ultimate goal is increase usage of all our products—from meeting rooms and programs to music CDs and eBooks and more.

### Who is Covered Under the Accident and Sickness Program?

Coverage is provided for all membership classes including auxiliary members, junior members, members-in-training, officers, directors, trustees and administrative personnel.

Non-member volunteers asked by the organization to help in nonemergency events (e.g. fundraising) are also covered.

Deputized bystanders are covered at the time of the emergency while participating in the emergency.

Benefits do not change based on membership class. For example, junior members are entitled to the same benefits as fully trained emergency response volunteers.

Benefits are also available for career members for an additional premium.

Insured Person(s) – means any officially designated member of the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization while acting as:

- a volunteer member for the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization;
- (2) any junior member or member in training;
- (3) any commissioner, director, trustee or other similar position associated with the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization;
- (4) any bystander deputized at the time of the emergency by an official of the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization to assist in an emergency, but only during the actual emergency;
- (5) any auxiliary member;
- (6) any non-member who is requested to participate by the auxiliary or Policyholder and/or Participating Organization;
- (7) any member who receives remuneration for on-call duty or out of pocket expenses and
- (8) Administrative Personnel;

Subject to the following:

An **Insured Person** will not include a **Paid Employee** while acting within the scope of his or her employment unless the policy is specifically endorsed to provide coverage for career members, except for **Administrative Personnel**.

Paid Employee(s) – means a person who receives compensation and works an average of 25 hours or more per week for the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization. The time frame used to determine the average hours or the salaried schedule will be the same time frame used to calculate the Average Weekly Wage. Paid Employee does not include Administrative Personnel.

### When Does Coverage Apply?

Coverage is provided when a member performs any normal duty of the emergency service organization when under the direction of an officer, whether it is an emergency or non-emergency duty.

Travel to and from these duties is covered.

Good Samaritan Acts are also covered.

Most non-league sport activities held on behalf of and for the benefit of the department are covered. We do not provide benefits for football, hockey, lacrosse, soccer, boxing events, rugby or martial arts.

League Sports can be covered but will require a separate rider purchased in addition to the base policy.

**Covered** Activity – means any activity, including travel directly to and from such activity, which is a normal duty of an **Insured Person**, including any:

- emergency response for fire suppression and rescue or emergency medical activity;
- (2) training exercise which simulates an emergency and where active physical participation is required;
- (3) Firematic Events or Contests;
- (4) class room training;
- (5) fund-raising activities including athletic activities solely for the purpose of raising funds for the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization or other non-profit organization when such fund-raising is performed as an activity of the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization, except any form of football, hockey, lacrosse, soccer, boxing, rugby or martial arts:
- (6) official functions attended primarily by members of the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization for which the purpose is to further the business of the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization (i.e. installation dinners, banquets, etc.);
- (7) official conventions, conferences or meetings of emergency fire, rescue or medical personnel attended by the Insured Person on behalf of the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization including personal travel and activities related to attending such convention, conference or meeting;
- participation in pre-approved covered athletic events or programs conducted on the premises of the Policyholder and/or Participating Organization;
- (9) authorized public safety education events; and
- (10) administrative or maintenance duties.

Under no circumstances is there coverage for participation in the athletic events listed in Exclusion number 9.

The **Covered Activity** must be performed at the direction, or with the knowledge, of an officer of the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization**, unless immediate action is required of the **Insured Person** at the scene of an emergency not on behalf of the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization** or any other organization.



#### **DEATH BENEFITS**

#### Accidental Death or Illness Loss of Life

We will pay a Death Benefit when a member dies as a result of an Injury or Illness that occurs:

- a. during a specific Covered Activity; or
- b. due to a covered Injury or Illness; or
- due to a heart attack or stroke within 48 hours of an emergency response or training exercise requiring active physical participation.

Injury(ies) - means accidental bodily injury sustained by the Insured
Person:

- during and resulting from an Insured Person's participation in a specific Covered Activity while coverage under this policy is in force as to the Insured Person;
- (2) which directly (independent of sickness, disease, mental incapacity or any other cause) causes a loss to the **Insured Person**; and
- (3) which is not otherwise defined as an Illness.

The term **Injury**, for the purposes of this policy, will not include human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) or AIDS related complex (ARC), or any heart or circulatory malfunction.

Illness(es) – means any disease, sickness, or infection of an Insured Person while coverage under this policy is in force as to the Insured Person. The Illness must:

- manifest itself during a specific Covered Activity with the result that the Insured Person interrupts his or her participation in such Covered Activity in order to receive immediate Medical Treatment; or
- (2) directly result from participation in a Covered Activity and also result in the Insured Person receiving Medical Treatment within 48 hours of participation in such Covered Activity. The requirement that Medical Treatment be received within 48 hours is waived for Infectious Diseases; or
- (3) Illness also includes the Mandatory Quarantine of an Insured Person.

No Illness Loss of Life Benefit will be payable if an Accidental Death Benefit is payable under the policy, or if, as a direct result of participation in the same Covered Activity, an HIV Positive Benefit was paid to the member under the policy.

#### Seat Belt Benefit

We will pay an additional amount if a member was wearing a properly fastened seat belt at the time of a motor vehicle accident which caused death.

#### Safety Vest Benefit

We will pay an additional amount if a member was wearing an approved safety vest and death occurs when struck as a pedestrian at a motor vehicle accident or while directing traffic.

### Military Death Benefit

We will pay a Death Benefit if a Covered Person's death occurs due to bodily injury while serving in the United States Military or their respective Guard or Reserve units. Death must occur within 12 months.

**Covered Person** - means all members who are listed on the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization's** roster. The roster will be maintained and periodically updated by the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization**. The roster will be kept on file by the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization**.

#### **Dependent Child And Education Benefit**

If a Death Benefit is payable, We will pay an additional benefit for each surviving Dependent Child which can be used for anything at the payee's discretion, including costs for education, living expenses, grief counseling, etc.

**Dependent Child** - means any unmarried child of the **Insured Person** who was dependent upon the **Insured Person** and either claimed on the **Insured Person's** most recent or final federal tax return, or was dependent as a result of a legally enforceable agreement filed with a court or other administrative body.

### **Spousal Support And Education Benefit**

If a Death Benefit is payable, We will pay an additional benefit to the surviving spouse of a married member. This benefit can be used for anything at the spouse's discretion including education, final expenses, grief counseling, etc.



#### **Memorial Benefit**

If a Death Benefit is payable, then the deceased member's department will receive an additional lump sum benefit. This benefit can be used for anything at the department's discretion, such as final expenses incurred by the department, establishing a memorial or trust fund or financial assistance to beneficiaries. This benefit is payable for each such death.

### **Dependent Elder Benefit**

If a Death Benefit is payable, We will pay a benefit for each surviving Dependent Elder.

**Dependent Elder** - means any parent, parent-in-law, grandparent, grandparent-in-law, great grandparent or great grandparent-in-law of the **Insured Person** who was dependent upon the **Insured Person** and claimed on the **Insured Person**'s final federal tax return.

#### Repatriation Benefit

If a Death Benefit is payable, We will pay the expense to transport the deceased member when their body is beyond a 30 mile radius from their current primary residence at the time of death resulting from a Covered Activity.

#### **LUMP SUM LIVING BENEFITS**

### **Accidental Dismemberment And Paralysis Benefit**

If a member sustains a covered Injury and suffers dismemberment or paralysis, a lump sum benefit will be payable based on the extent of the Injury.

### **Vision Impairment Benefit**

If a member sustains a covered Injury which causes permanent vision impairment, a lump sum will be payable to the member based on the extent of the Injury. This chart shall apply separately to each eye.

In no event will benefits be paid for both Vision Impairment Benefit and Accidental Dismemberment and Paralysis Benefit for an Injury to the same eye sustained while participating in the same Covered Activity.

**Permanent Damage** - means with reference to the eyes, irreparable **Injury** which results in permanently impaired vision, but not in total and irrecoverable loss of sight.

### **Injury Permanent Impairment Benefit**

A lump sum benefit will be paid to any member who suffers a Permanent Impairment as a result of an Injury. An impairment value is assigned after the member has reached maximum medical rehabilitation, and the member's medical condition is considered stable or non-progressive.

To calculate the benefit paid, the Physician uses the "Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment" published by the American Medical Association to determine the impairment rating.

If a member has an Injury resulting in Quadriplegia, Paraplegia or Hemiplegia, 200% of the Principal Sum is payable. Uniplegia will be paid at 100% of the Principal Sum.

Benefits for an Injury due to a Permanent Impairment paid under this provision will be in addition to any Accidental Dismemberment Benefit or Vision Impairment Benefit paid or payable under the policy. However, in no event will the total amount of benefits payable as a result of any one accident exceed 100% of the largest Principal Sum shown in the Schedule for these benefits, unless:

- (1) the Permanent Impairment rating for an Injury is 90% or higher in which case 125% of the Principal Sum is payable, or
- (2) an Injury resulting in Quadriplegia, Paraplegia or Hemiplegia, in which case 200% of the Principal Sum is payable.

**Permanent Impairment** - means a medical condition which is a physical or functional abnormality or loss, which remains after the maximum medical rehabilitation has been achieved, and which is considered stable or non-progressive by the **Physician** at the time an evaluation is made.

Physician(s) - means any duly licensed medical practitioner:

- (1) who is acting within the scope of his or her license; and
- (2) who is not the Insured Person or an Immediate Family Member.



### **Heart Permanent Impairment Benefit**

This lump sum benefit is payable if a member suffers a Heart Permanent Impairment which results in at least 26 weeks of Total Disability.

#### **Heart Permanent Impairment Benefit Chart**

Left Ventricular Ejection Fraction	New York Heart Association Functional Classification	Heart Permanent Impairment Benefit Due
26 to 30% function	Class II	25%
26 to 30% function	Class III or IV	50%
21 to 25% function	Class II or III	50%
21 to 25% function	Class IV	75%
Less than 21% function	Class II or III	75%
Less than 21% function	Class IV	100%

The benefit due is calculated by multiplying the benefit percentage due and the Principal Sum. The benefit is further modified by the member's age on the date of the heart impairment, according to the following table:

Age 40 or less
 Age 41 to 65
 Age 66 or over
 Age 66 or over
 Age 66 or over

No benefit is payable if a member had a pre-existing Left Ventricular Ejection Fraction of 35% or lower prior to the Covered Activity causing the Heart Permanent Impairment.

**Heart Permanent Impairment** - means a medical condition which is a physical and functional abnormality or loss as a consequence of an **Insured Person** sustaining a heart impairment as a result of a **Covered Activity**, resulting in:

- (1) a "Left Ventricular Ejection Fraction" of 30% or less; and
- a "New York Heart Association Functional Classification" of II, III, or IV; and
- (3) at least 26 weeks of Total Disability.

**Left Ventricular Ejection Fraction** - means a clinically used measure of the percentage of blood the heart is able to eject from the left ventricle.

**New York Heart Association Functional Classification** is a standard measurement of how heart function affects activities of daily living. Below is a summary of the New York Heart Association Classification:

- I. No symptoms and no limitation in ordinary physical activity.
- Mild symptoms and slight limitation during ordinary activity. Comfortable at rest.
- III. Marked limitation in activity due to symptoms, even during less-thanordinary activity. Comfortable only at rest.
- IV. Severe limitations. Experiences symptoms even while at rest.

#### **Illness Permanent Impairment Benefit**

If an Illness to a member results in 260 weeks of Total Disability Benefits, the following percentage of the Illness Permanent Impairment Benefit shown in the schedule will be payable:

- 50% If the member is unable to return to their occupation.
- 75% If the member is unable to return to any Gainful Occupation.
- 125% If the member has been approved or, if not eligible, otherwise meets the eligibility criteria for Social Security disability benefits.

If a member has received a Heart Permanent Impairment Benefit and later becomes eligible for payment under this benefit for the same condition, the amount payable under this benefit is reduced by the amount previously paid under the Heart Permanent Impairment Benefit. The percentages shown above will also apply to the total amount payable.



### Cosmetic Disfigurement Resulting from Burns Benefit

If a member suffers a cosmetic disfigurement due to a burn classified as a full thickness or third degree burn, as a result of an Injury, We will provide a lump sum benefit to the member.

The payment amount is based on the amount of surface area and body part burned. Burns to body parts that are more visible will result in a higher benefit than burns occurring to less visible body parts.

### **Cosmetic Burn Chart**

Body Part	Area Classification	Maximum Allowable % for Area Surface Burned	Maximum % of Cosmetic Disfigurement from Burns Principal Sum
Face, Neck, Head	11	9.0%	100%
Hand and Forearm (Right or Left)	5	4.5%	22.5%
Upper Arm (Right or Left)	3	4.5%	13.5%
Torso (Front or back)	2	18.0%	36.0%
Thigh (Right or Left)	1	9.0%	9.0%
Lower Leg (Below Knee) (Right or Left)	3	9.0%	27.0%

#### Example using the Cosmetic Burn Chart

- (a) if 100% of the surface of the right hand and forearm were burned the benefit would be  $5 \times 4.5\% = 22.5\%$  of the Cosmetic Disfigurement Resulting from Burns Principal Sum payable; or
- (b) if 50% of surface of the right hand and forearm were burned the benefit would be 5 x 2.25% (which is 50% of 4.5) = 11.25% of the Cosmetic Disfigurement Resulting from Burns Principal Sum payable.

If the **Insured Person** suffers burns in more than one area as a result of any one accident, benefits will not exceed more than 100% of the Cosmetic Disfigurement Resulting from Burns Principal Sum.

Any Cosmetic Disfigurement Resulting from Burns Benefit paid or payable under this policy will be in addition to any Accidental Dismemberment Benefit, Injury Permanent Impairment, Heart Permanent Impairment, or Illness Permanent Impairment Benefit paid or payable under this policy. However, in no event will the total amount of benefits payable as a result of any one accident exceed 100% of the largest Principal Sum shown in the **Schedule** for these benefits.

### **HIV Positive Lump Sum Living Benefit**

If a member contracts Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) as a direct result of participation in a specific Covered Activity a lump sum benefit is payable to the member.

If either the Illness Loss of Life Benefit or the Illness Permanent Impairment Benefit is payable and the HIV Positive Lump Sum Living Benefit is also payable, only the largest lump sum amount will be paid.

**HIV Positive** - means the presence of **HIV** antibodies in the blood of an **Insured Person** as substantiated through both a positive screening test (enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay, ELISA) and a positive supplemental test such as Western Blot. All such tests must be approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) with the interpretation of positivity as specified by the manufacturer(s).

#### **WEEKLY INCOME BENEFITS**

### Total Disability Benefit/Weekly Income Benefit

If a member is unable to perform all of the material and substantial duties of their <u>own occupation</u> because of an Injury or Illness, We will pay the Total Disability Weekly Income Benefit.

#### Total Disability, Totally Disabled - means,

- (1) For an Insured Person with an occupation producing wages as described in the definition of Average Weekly Wage, the inability to perform all of the material and substantial duties of his or her own occupation.
- (2) If the Insured Person does not have an occupation producing wages as described in the definition of Average Weekly Wage, Total Disability, Totally Disabled means:
  - (a) the inability to perform all of the material and substantial duties of an occupation for which the **Insured Person** is qualified by reason of education, training, or experience; or
  - (b) the inability to perform all of the regular activities of the Insured Person prior to the covered Injury or Illness.

The Insured Person must be under the regular care of a Physician during Total Disability.



### First 28 Days of Total Disability

For the first 28 days of Total Disability, the Total Disability Benefit Amount selected will be paid regardless of the amount of lost income and is not coordinated with income from other sources (e.g. Workers' Compensation).

### After 28 Days of Total Disability

We will pay up to 100% of the member's pre-disability average income not to exceed the weekly benefit amount shown in the Schedule. The amount payable will be offset by Other Valid and Collectible Insurance or payable Workers' Compensation.

#### Other Valid and Collectible Insurance - means any:

- (1) group plan, program, or insurance policy;
- (2) other group hospital, surgical or medical benefit plan;
- (3) union welfare plans or group employer or employee benefit programs;
- (4) no-fault automobile insurance plan or similar law; or
- (5) regular or disability benefits paid under a Retirement Program after the commencement of Partial Disability or Total Disability benefits under this policy.

Other Valid and Collectible Insurance will not include benefits provided by the United States Social Security Act or any individual disability insurance plans.

**Retirement Program** - means any normal, early, or disability retirement benefit, provided by the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization**, state, union or other entity where eligibility and/or benefits are based on employment with the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization**.

After 52 weeks of Total Disability, on July  $1^{\rm st}$  disability benefits will increase a minimum of 5% up to 10% maximum based on the Consumer Price Index.

#### Payment Example for the Fifth Week of Disability:

Amount on Schedule after 28 days
Member's Average Weekly Wage: \$1,000
Workers' Compensation Payment: \$400
We will pay: \$400

Based on your benefit selection, Total Disability is payable

- (1) up to two hundred sixty (260) weeks, or
- (2) up to 520 weeks under Extended Total Disability, or
- (3) up to age 70 under Long-Term Total Disability.

#### Partial Disability Benefit/Weekly Income Benefit

If a member is unable to perform one or more, but not all, of the duties of their <u>own occupation</u> because of an Injury or Illness, We will pay the Partial Disability Weekly Income Benefit shown in the Schedule for the first 28 days of Partial Disability. The calculation will be similar to the Total Disability Benefit after 28 days.

The benefit for Partial Disability is payable for up to 52 weeks.

#### Partial Disability, Partially Disabled - means

- For an Insured Person with an occupation producing wages as described in the definition of Average Weekly Wage, the inability to perform one or more, but not all, of the material and substantial duties of his or her own occupation.
- (2) If the Insured Person does not have an occupation producing wages as described in the definition of Average Weekly Wage, Partial Disability, Partially Disabled means:
  - (a) the inability to perform one or more, but not all, of the material and substantial duties of an occupation for which the **Insured Person** is qualified by reason of education, training, or experience; or
  - (b) the inability to perform one or more, but not all, of the regular activities of the Insured Person.

The **Insured Person** must be under the regular care of a **Physician** during **Partial Disability**.

If 52 weeks of Total Disability has been paid and the Consumer Price Index applied to the benefit, should the member become Partial/Partially Disabled, the Consumer Price Index will be applied on July 1<sup>st</sup> to the Partial Disability Benefit at a minimum of 5% up to 10% maximum.

The definition of Illness is expanded to include Mandatory Quarantine, which allows Us to reimburse wages lost due to a government mandated quarantine intended to contain an Infectious Disease.

Mandatory Quarantine - means period of isolation intended to limit the spread of an Infectious Disease. The Mandatory Quarantine of an Insured Person must be ordered by appropriate medical officials while acting under the authority of the local, state or federal government.



#### OCCUPATIONAL RETRAINING BENEFIT

If an Injury or an Illness prevents a member from holding a Gainful Occupation, We will pay Covered Retraining Expenses. This benefit is paid if the member enrolls in an institution of higher learning or a professional or trade training program. The objective of any professional or trade training program must be to return the member to a job for which he or she is suited. The professional or trade training program must be agreed upon by Us and the member.

**Gainful Occupation -** means a job for which an **Insured Person** is qualified by reason of education, training or experience, which has a reasonable expectation to provide more than 85% of pre-disability earnings.

**Covered Retraining Expenses** includes, but is not limited to, expenses for tuition, books, and any other training materials required by the institution of higher learning or professional or trade training program.

#### WEEKLY INJURY PERMANENT IMPAIRMENT (LIFETIME) BENEFIT

We will pay a weekly benefit if a member suffers a Permanent Impairment of 50% or greater due to a covered Injury. The benefit is payable:

- · weekly for life
- · even if the member returns to work in any job
- · in addition to any benefit paid or payable under the policy.

Payments begin on the 261st week of disability or 521st week if the Extended Total Disability is selected. The weekly payment is calculated by applying the impairment rating percentage to the Weekly Income Benefit received by the member on the 29th day of Total Disability.

Subsequent changes in the Permanent Impairment rating due to an Injury will not affect the Weekly Injury Permanent Impairment Benefits paid or payable.

**Permanent Impairment** - means a medical condition which is a physical or functional abnormality or loss, which remains after the maximum medical rehabilitation has been achieved, and which is considered stable or non-progressive by the **Physician** at the time an evaluation is made.

### Example:

If the <u>Total Disability Weekly Income Benefit</u> payable on the 29th day of Total Disability is \$600.00 and the member's Permanent Impairment rating is 70%, the lifetime Weekly Injury Permanent Impairment Benefit would be \$420 per week ( $$600 \times 70\% = $420$ ).



#### MEDICAL EXPENSE BENEFITS

Reasonable and Customary Expense - means an expense which:

- is charged for treatment, supplies or medical services medically necessary to treat the **Insured Person's** condition;
- (2) does not exceed the usual level of charges for similar treatment, supplies or medical services in the locality where the expense is incurred; and
- (3) does not include charges that would not have been made if no insurance existed.

### **Medical Expense Benefits**

If Injury or Illness causes a member to incur expenses for medical care, We will pay the cost of any Reasonable and Customary Expenses. Medical expenses include items such as:

- medical, Hospital, or surgical treatment
- · Home Health Care
- · nursing services prescribed and monitored by a Physician
- Post-exposure Prophylaxis Protocol (PEP) treatment, when such treatment is advised by the attending Physician
- · Infectious Disease screening tests
- Post-exposure preventive inoculations as a result of participation in a Covered Activity

#### Cosmetic Plastic Surgery Benefit

If a member needs skin grafting or plastic surgery because of an Injury for which Medical Expense Benefits are paid or payable, We will pay for the Reasonable and Customary Expenses of the surgery, up to the policy limit

#### Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder Benefit

We will pay Reasonable and Customary Expenses when a member suffers from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder as a result of participation in a specific Covered Activity in which a Traumatic Incident occurred.

**Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder** - means emotional stress resulting from a **Traumatic Incident** experienced by an **Insured Person** which adversely affects the psychological and physical well-being of the **Insured Person**.

#### **Critical Incident Stress Management Benefit**

When the department requires the services of a Critical Incident Stress Management Team, We will pay the expenses incurred by the team. These expenses include meals, lodging and necessary travel.

The team must be requested and authorized by the Policyholder and needed due to a specific Covered Activity where a Traumatic Incident occurred.

**Critical Incident Stress Management Team (CISMT)** - means a formally organized group of mental health professionals and peer support individuals trained to provide support services to emergency service personnel. Such support services include stress debriefing, defusing, demobilization, stress education, spousal support, one-on-one interviews or on the scene support.

**Traumatic Incident** – means an abnormal experience, outside the range of usual human experiences and includes, but is not limited to:

- (1) line-of-duty death or serious injury to other Insured Persons;
- (2) a single incident having multiple casualties;
- (3) death or serious injury of a child; and
- (4) dealing with victims known to the Insured Person.

### Family Expense Benefit

When a member is admitted as an inpatient to a Hospital for a covered Injury or Illness, We will pay a daily benefit to the member.

After such Hospital confinement, We will provide 50% of the scheduled daily benefit for each day the member participates in Out-Patient Physical Therapy. This benefit is payable for a combined maximum of 26 weeks for any one accidental Injury or Illness regardless of whether it is paid at 100% or 50%.

### Family Bereavement and Trauma Counseling Benefit

We will pay this benefit if an Accidental Death or Illness Loss of Life Benefit is payable, or if a member's participation in a Covered Activity in which a Traumatic Incident occurred, requires a member's spouse, Dependent Child, or resident Immediate Family Member to require counseling.



#### TRANSITION BENEFIT

We will pay a weekly Transition Benefit equivalent to the last Total Weekly Disability Benefit if, while a member is receiving Total Disability benefits, they are involuntarily terminated from their regular employment and remain unemployed after Total Disability ends under this plan. This benefit is payable as long as the member remains unemployed up to a maximum of 26 weeks.

#### **FELONIOUS ASSAULT BENEFIT**

This benefit is payable if a member suffers an Injury or Illness as the result of a Felonious Assault that is directed at the member while participating in a Covered Activity.

Only one benefit is payable for all losses as a result of the same Felonious Assault.

Felonious Assault - means any willful or unlawful use of force upon the Insured Person:

- (1) with the intent to cause bodily injury to the Insured Person; and
- (2) that results in bodily harm to the Insured Person; and
- (3) that is a felony or a misdemeanor in the jurisdiction in which it occurs.

#### HOME ALTERATION AND VEHICLE MODIFICATION BENEFIT

We will pay for home alteration and vehicle modification expenses incurred within three years of the date of Injury or Illness, if a member requires alterations to their home and/or modifications to their vehicle as a direct result of a covered permanent and irrevocable loss. This benefit is payable in excess of benefits paid or payable under any Workers' Compensation act, no fault automobile insurance plan, and any Other Valid and Collectible Insurance.

**Home Alteration and Vehicle Modification Expenses** - means one-time expenses that:

- (1) are charged for:
  - (a) alterations to the Insured Person's residence that are necessary to make the residence accessible and habitable for an impaired individual; and
  - (b) modifications to a motor vehicle owned or leased by the Insured Person or modifications to a motor vehicle newly purchased for the Insured Person that are necessary to make the vehicle accessible to and/or drivable by the Insured Person; and
- (2) do not include charges that would not have been made if no insurance existed; and
- (3) do not exceed the usual level of charges for similar alterations and modifications in the locality where the expense is incurred;

but only if the alterations to the **Insured Person's** residence and the modifications to his or her motor vehicle are:

- (1) made on behalf of the Insured Person;
- in compliance with any applicable laws or requirements for approval by the appropriate government authorities; and
- (3) agreed to and approved by Us.



#### **OPTIONAL BENEFITS**

#### **Weekly Hospital Benefit**

When a member requires inpatient hospitalization or outpatient physical therapy for either an Injury or Illness, We will pay this benefit in addition to the Weekly Income Benefit.

This benefit is payable for a maximum period of 104 weeks.

If the member is in an intensive, cardiac or critical care unit, the Weekly Hospital Benefit Amount shown in the Schedule is doubled.

### First Week Total Disability Benefit

A member will receive an additional payment for the first week of Total Disability as a result of an Injury or Illness. If the member is Totally Disabled for less than one full week, We will pay a daily benefit for each day of disability. This daily benefit will be 1/7 of the scheduled weekly benefit.

This benefit is paid in addition to other weekly income benefits.

### Coordinated 28 Day Total Disability Benefit

A member will receive 100% of the difference between their Average Weekly Wage, and the Total Disability Weekly Amount (first 28 days) payable under the policy plus any disability income benefits received from Workers' Compensation or similar law during the first 28 Days of Total Disability. If the member is Totally Disabled for less than one full week, We will pay a daily benefit for each day of disability. This daily benefit will be 1/7 of the scheduled weekly benefit.

### **Extended Total Disability Benefit**

If the Extended Total Disability is shown on the Schedule the maximum Total Disability Benefit period is increased from five years (260 weeks) to 10 years (520 weeks). This benefit is payable if the member is Totally Disabled due to an Injury or Illness. Total Disability Definition continues to apply to your own occupation.

### **Long-Term Total Disability Benefit**

If the Long-Term Total Disability Benefit is shown on the Schedule the Total Disability Benefit is payable to age 70. This benefit is payable if a member is Totally Disabled due to an Injury or Illness.

#### Long-Term Total Disability - means

- (1) For an Insured Person with an occupation producing wages as described in the definition of Average Weekly Wage at the time Total Disability benefits become payable, Long-Term Total Disability means the inability to perform all of the material and substantial duties of any Gainful Occupation.
- (2) For an Insured Person who did not have an occupation producing wages as described in the definition of Average Weekly Wage at the time Total Disability benefits become payable, Long-Term Total Disability means:
  - (a) the inability to perform all of the material and substantial duties of an occupation for which the **Insured Person** is qualified by reason of education, training, or experience; or
  - (b) the inability to perform any two of six activities of daily living of the Insured Person. Activities of daily living include mobility, eating, elimination, cognition, personal hygiene and dressing.

After 10 years of Total Disability the definition of disability will be based on any Gainful Occupation when the Long-Term Total Disability Benefit is provided.

**Gainful Occupation** - means a job for which an **Insured Person** is qualified by reason of education, training or experience, which has a reasonable expectation to provide more than 85% of pre-disability earnings.

### Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) Benefits

If Weekly Injury Permanent Impairment COLA or Long-Term Total Disability COLA is shown on the Schedule, the amount payable will be increased after benefits have been paid for at least 52 consecutive weeks. The percentage of increase, a minimum of 5% up to 10% maximum, is based on the increase in the Consumer Price Index.

**Consumer Price Index** - means the consumer price index published by the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics for All Urban Consumers, All Items (CPI-U).



#### Extra Expense Benefit

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After 26 weeks of a member's Total Disability due to a covered Injury or Illness, the member will receive the Extra Expense Benefit Monthly Amount. This benefit will cease when the member is no longer Totally Disabled, or the maximum amount shown in the schedule is paid.

### Organized Team Sports Rider

This benefit provides accidental death, accidental dismemberment, total disability, or medical expense benefits if death or Injury to a member results from participation in (including travel directly to and from) a specific organized team league event, including a game or practice.

#### **OPTIONAL 24-HOUR or OFF-DUTY ACCIDENT BENEFITS**

For 24-Hour and Off-Duty Accident Benefits, Covered Person means:

**Covered Person** - means all members who are listed on the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization's** roster. The roster will be maintained and periodically updated by the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization**. The roster will be kept on file by the **Policyholder** and/or **Participating Organization**.

### 24-Hour Accident Benefit - Injury Only

This benefit provides a lump sum amount if a Covered Person dies or suffers dismemberment, vision loss or paralysis due to bodily injury. This benefit is paid if death, dismemberment, vision loss or paralysis occurs during a Covered Activity or an off-duty activity.

### Off-Duty Accident Benefit - Injury Only

This benefit provides a lump sum amount if a Covered Person dies or suffers dismemberment, vision loss or paralysis due to bodily injury. This benefit is paid only if death, dismemberment, vision loss or paralysis does not occur during a Covered Activity.

Please note: Coverage provided under the optional 24-Hour or Off-Duty Benefits cannot be issued until a roster listing the covered members is submitted.

### **EXCLUSIONS**

We will not cover any loss caused by or resulting from:

- suicide or any attempt at it; or intentionally self-inflicted injuries;
- (2) injuries that happen while flying except:
  - (a) as a passenger on a commercial aircraft;
  - (b) as a passenger on any aircraft while taking part in a Covered Activity;
- injuries that happen while flying as a crew member or during parachute jumps from the aircraft;
- (4) war or any act of war, whether declared or undeclared;
- (5) mental or emotional disorders, except as specifically provided for covered Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder;
- (6) treatment of alcoholism or drug addiction and any complications arising from it, except loss caused by Injury sustained during and resulting from a Covered Activity;
- (7) illness, except as provided by the policy;
- (8) military service of any state or country;
- (9) any form of football, hockey, lacrosse, soccer, boxing, rugby and martial arts;
- (10) any league sports event, except as covered under the Organized Team Sports Rider; or
- (11) Cancer.

This is only a brief description of the coverage(s) available under policy series V50000. The policy contains reductions, limitations, exclusions and termination provisions. Full details of the coverage are contained in the policy. If there are any conflicts between this document and the policy, the policy shall govern. # Step 1

### MAKE THE CALL BEFORE SEEKING TREATMENT

- Notify supervisor of the injury/incident
  - In a quiet place, employee and/or supervisor call Company Nurse at: 888-770-0925
- You will be asked to provide the following information during the call:
  - 1. Search Code (located on posters helpful but not required for call)
  - 2. Employer name and/or worksite
  - 3. Employee personal information
  - 4. Injury details: Who? What? When? Where?
- Possible Outcomes as a result of the Call:
  - Self-care or basic first aid, OR
  - Referral to one of your panel facilities by a Nurse Occ Health or Urgent Care or ER

### IMPORTANT!

- Translators are available for more than 170 different languages
- Be prepared to write down a Call Confirmation Number

# Step 2

## REPORT DISTRIBUTION AFTER THE CALL

- Report of Injury is emailed or faxed to key stakeholders at the employer

# June 15, 2017 NSVRC Staff Report

### **Program and Project Updates**

This report is provided in order to highlight the status of projects and update the Commissioners on "The State of the Commission".

### **Housing and Community Development**

### Continuum of Care for Homelessness (CoC):

The Continuum of Care (CoC) continues to finalize the strategic plan to address homelessness in the Shenandoah Valley and all participants, especially those outside of service provision, are encouraged to inform the process during two upcoming group discussions. As part of the plan, CoC-partner Harrisonburg Redevelopment Housing Authority released a Request for Proposals soliciting agencies to evaluate the efficiency of the CoC and strengthen fiscal competitiveness. Proposals are due no later than June 16th. For more details, contact Suzi Armstrong at (540) 434-7386 or sarmstrong@harrisonburgrha.com.

In May, the CoC requested a renewal of \$992,620 in Virginia Dept. of Housing and Community Development funds. This represents level-funding from year one of the two year grant and would support shelter operations, motel vouchers, rental assistance, and planning activities in the region. Potential grantees span from Winchester to Harrisonburg.

### Regional Housing Market Analysis:

NSVRC staff executed a Memorandum of Agreement for the Regional Housing Market Analysis, and the project has begun as a collaborative arrangement among NSVRC, VCU, Housing Virginia, and VHDA. NSVRC staff and VCU staff have already met to delineate what each party will be responsible for contributing to the project. Much of the demographic information, background, and context will be generated by NSVRC staff, while VCU will be responsible for the synthesis, analysis, projections, and policy takeaway points. Once this study is completed, VCU will visit our region and deliver presentations of this study's findings. Right now, the tentative completion date is January 31st, 2018.

### Toms Brook Staffing:

NSVRC continues to provide contracted staff support for the Town of Toms Brook. Recent work has focused on reviewing the existing zoning code to ensure compliance with state requirements. This work is expected to continue throughout the fiscal year 2018.

### **HOME Program:**

Staff is evaluating potential projects for the 2017 Annual Action Plan, to be delivered to HUD by mid-August. We have not received our 2017 funding allocation from HUD as of yet, as the formula is dependent on the federal budget process. Staff is working with the City of Winchester, the lead agency for the HOME program, on a plan to advertise to the public as transparently as possible the course of action for projects should the budget not be approved before this Action Plan is due. Several partner agencies have submitted proposals for the use of HOME funds. Staff will work closely with the Housing and Community Services Policy board to determine the proposed course of action for the region's HOME funds before the projects are recommended by the full Commission board to the Winchester City Council for final approval.

Soon staff will advertise for public comment amendments to several years' Annual Action Plans to reallocate several years' allocations of development funds to Tenant Based Rental Assistance. This process was approved to begin by this board at the May NSVRC meeting.

### Neighborhood Stabilization Program

Community Housing Partners and NSVRC staff are working together to close out the NSP program. Originally funded through ARRA, this program was tasked with mitigating the housing foreclosure crisis. Since 2009, the program has funded the acquisition, rehabilitation, and resale of 22 homes to homeowners in the Northern Shenandoah Valley.

### Worlds of Work (WoW) 2017:

Staff continues to serve on the planning committee for WoW. This includes attending meetings, promoting and attending the event, and requesting grant funds through Wells Fargo for a financial donation.

### **Economic Development**

### Page County Broadband Authority:

The Page County Broadband Authority's (PCBA) network is a fiber optic network. What this means to customers is that they receive 100% of the full purchased speed in both directions, both uploading and downloading, whereas DSL and Cable often offer significantly diminished upload speeds in comparison to download speeds. Also with Cable and DSL, bandwidth is often shared by multiple users, especially at peak usage times. So for a business which requires dedicated access to the full speed and bandwidth that is purchased, a fiber optic connection is the only tool in our community's toolbox that can meet the need.

Page County Broadband Authority is a middle-mile provider, which means that it exists to help extend broadband into an area where the free-market business case wouldn't likely allow for expansion. However, it requires a last-mile partner to actually provide end-users with access. That partner, since the PCBA's inception, has been Shentel. Although the fiber optic access provided by the PCBA and its partner Shentel is of significant value to those users with the most advanced data needs, I would estimate that the existence of the broadband authority has played an even more significant role in influencing the service provision decisions of private sector internet service providers to offer more competitive options for rural broadband access in Page County. Without the competition provided by the PCBA, and the resulting potential for capturing market share, today Page County could have had access to fewer, and less competitive broadband options.

Broadband access through the PCBA's fiber network will almost always cost more than a competing DSL or Cable connection of similar published speed. However, the actual connection speed, two-way communication, and dedicated bandwidth provided by fiber create a scenario in which two products that appear on the surface to be the same, are often actually very different.

That said, the Broadband Authority has an interest in providing competitive pricing that allows those businesses which could benefit from a high-speed fiber optic connection to feasibly access the technology. Therefore, the (PCBA) has continued its work over the last several months to increase competitiveness in its pricing structure. Project activity has increased since the price structure was adjusted earlier this year, and we are hopeful that new businesses will soon be online.

### Building Collaborative Communities (BCC):

Staff has been working to showcase a web tool featuring many strategic and user-friendly interactive maps. The new maps will continue to be expanded even after the BCC Grant comes to a close at the end of the month. The site can be used as both a trip building tool for visitors as well as a tool for local economic development authorities, planners, tourism offices, chambers of commerce, and the small business development authority to illustrate gaps in the region that future business owners can fill. A re-direct was created, <a href="www.shenandoahvalleyoutdoors.com">www.shenandoahvalleyoutdoors.com</a>, and localities have been sending in update requests to the various web apps. As data is being collected for the Hazard Mitigation Plan update, it is cross referenced for this purpose and is used to expand on the detail of the web apps. So far, the web page has been very well received.

### (Stronger Economies Together) SET Seed Grant:

On May 11, NSVRC staff received word that USDA-Rural Development seed grant application had been approved for continued work to implement a strategy identified in our region's first regional economic development plan developed and approved earlier this fiscal year. The \$5,000 grant will fund additional work over the next 45 days to further develop <a href="www.shenandoahvalleyoutdoors.com">www.shenandoahvalleyoutdoors.com</a>, and to complete a search engine optimization process that will help the site rise to the top of Google searches.

### Business District Revitalization:

NSVRC Staff is working with the Towns of Edinburg and Front Royal to wrap up their Business District Revitalization Planning Grant projects. The key deliverables were completed in March, when the Towns submitted competitive applications to the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development. The applications request Community Development Block Grant implementation funding to support downtown revitalization projects, including façade improvements, street enhancements, and wayfinding signage. Award announcements are made at the Governor's discretion and typically occur during the summer.

### R.I.S.E. (Regional Initiative Supporting Entrepreneurship):

The RISE Competition, sponsored by LFFC Small Business Development Center, took place on April 18, 2017. NSVRC again served as the fiscal agent. The winner of both the Judge's Choice award and the People's Choice award was a young entrepreneur from Clarke County, Ali Haney. She and her husband are organic farmers and their business is called Shenandoah Seasonal. They will

use the award money to purchase a custom barn structure and gravel pad site to be used for selling their produce from. A total of \$5,690 was awarded to Mrs. Haney along with a marketing and promotions package worth several thousand dollars.

The goal of the RISE program is to discover regional entrepreneurial assets, to develop business assistance and educational programs in support of those assets.

### <u>D.M.O. Support – (Destination Marketing Organizations):</u>

The Commission continues to serve as the fiscal agent and provide limited administrative support for the region's DMOs. The DMO group has recently branded itself as the Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership (SVTP), and is an organization made up primarily of Tourism Directors working to promote the Shenandoah Valley as a tourism destination. SVTP was recently awarded a Virginia Tourism Grant for \$25,000 for web development, regional branding, and marketing work. NSVRC serves as the fiscal agent and grant recipient of these pass-through funds, and will be partnering with SVTP to promote outdoor recreation entrepreneurship and visitation in the valley. More details to come.

### GO Virginia:

In collaboration with partner organizations, NSVRC has been named fiscal agent for the Region 8 GO Virginia effort. Capacity building and planning funds will be passed through NSVRC to partner organizations and consultants as directed by the GO Virginia regional council. NSVRC expects to receive compensation for fiscal management activities that will be sufficient to cover the costs of providing the service.

### Strasburg Wayfinding:

The NSVRC has entered into a contract with the Town of Strasburg to develop a wayfinding signage plan designed to help the town identify the location, size, content, and character of a directional signage program to be implemented in phases over the coming years.

### Transportation

### RideSmart - Transportation Demand Management (TDM):

Staff continues to serve on the I-66 Transit/TDM Working Group in regards to working with the VDOT NoVA District on the commuter bus that will originate from the Front Royal/Linden Park and Ride lots and travel into the NoVA/DC areas. Over the next few months staff will be working closely with VDOT to launch the bus service and marketing campaign.

Over the past several months, staff has been working with Warren County, the Regional Jail and businesses along the Route 522 Corridor to gauge interest in expanding a transit route in that area. Several stakeholder meetings were held in which NSVRC staff participated. Several businesses along the corridor made a financial commitment in order for Warren County to submit a grant to DRPT requesting funds to expand transit service on the corridor. On January 17, 2017 staff attended the Warren County BOS meeting in which a Resolution authorizing the Warren County Administrator, Doug Stanley, to work with the Northern Shenandoah Valley Regional Commission to execute and file application for funding to the VA Department of Rail and Public Transportation to provide regular trolley service to the corridor. The application was submitted on February 1, 2017. The grant request has been approved and staff will work with Warren County and VRT on start up.

### Winchester/Frederick County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO):

During its May 17th meeting the WinFred MPO Policy Board adopted a 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), prepared by staff, following a 20-day public comment period. Adoption of a 20-year MTP at least every five years is a core MPO function required by federal law. Central to the plan

is a list of projects that could reasonably be implemented with funds projected to become available. Staff held its second and final public open house on the plan on May 11 in Winchester. The draft plan is posted on the MPO website; the final plan, incorporating comments received, will be posted by July 1.

Staff attended the annual Virginia Association of Metropolitan Transportation Organizations' (VAMPO) annual training conference June 9th. Attendees learned about the work of the Virginia Transportation Research Center; which hosted the meeting, and engaged in an exercise to think about how emerging technologies might be addressed in long-range transportation plans.

### Rural Transportation Planning Program:

The Transportation Planning Technical Committee held a quarterly meeting on April 13. Attendees heard a presentation by Champe Burnley, President, Virginia Bicycle Federation, and John Bolecek, VDOT Central Office, on the status of efforts to designate US Bike Route 11, a proposed touring route from Canada into North Carolina, through the northern Shenandoah Valley. Also on the agenda was a roundtable discussion of a rejected Smart Scale application and strategies the applicant may undertake to secure funding for its project. The roundtable critique, a form of peer-to-peer help for localities to prepare for the next Smart Scale application cycle, may become a regular agenda item. The next meeting is scheduled for July 13.

Staff attended the one-day Virginia Transportation Safety Planning Workshop in Charlottesville on April 27th. As a follow-up, VDOT intends to provide contracted technical assistance to MPOs and PDCs in the development of regional action plans to reduce crashes.

Staff participated in the May 22nd meeting of the Virginia Freight Transportation Technical Committee representing the Virginia Association of Planning District Commissions (VAPDC). The committee reviewed and provided input into the freight component of the draft Virginia Multimodal Transportation Plan.

#### **Natural Resources**

### Regional Tire Operations Program (RTOP):

The new tire grinder has been delivered and set up at the Frederick County Landfill. The old machine was traded in for a value of \$100,000, making the total purchase price of the new equipment \$535,830. This amount was paid in cash and leaves the RTOP program in very good financial condition with \$457,830 in combined cash accounts.

The RTOP program has a Mack truck, four box trailers, a flat-bed trailer, a 1994 Ford truck along with various tools that it no longer needs since the new machine is not a mobile unit. The Solid Waste Management Technical Committee would like to sell these items at a public auction, an action which was authorized at the May Commission meeting.

### Solid Wasted Management:

NSVRC Staff is working with the Solid Waste Management Technical Committee (SWMTC) to prepare the five-year update to the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan. This plan addresses the region's waste source reduction and reuse, recycling, and landfilling, and fulfills the comprehensive planning requirements of the Virginia Code, as administered by the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality

(DEQ). The Plan also outlines how the region will continue to meet the Commonwealth's 25% recycling mandate, which is accomplished each year through a Recycling Rate Report submitted to the DEQ by NSVRC staff on behalf of the Committee. (The region submitted a recycling rate of 48% for 2016!) The Solid Waste Management Plan's update is due in late July 2017.

### On-Call Consultant Program:

During December 2016 staff prepared an RFP seeking proposals from qualified firms interested in being included on an on-call list for professional and non-professional consulting services. We received 27 proposals. Staff reviewed and scored proposals to narrow down the list for the interview phase. The interview panel consisted of Doug Stanley, Christy Dunkle and staff from the NSVRC. Interviews were held on Friday, March 3rd. Staff will move forward with securing contracts with a number of selected firms, all of which demonstrated high levels of expertise in their fields. Staff is securing contracts from member localities and is working with VDOT in regards to the pre-award audit process. Firms working on any transportation project that receives federal funds must have a VDOT pre-award audit. The program is anticipated to begin July 1, 2017.

### Water Supply Planning:

NSVRC staff is gearing up to prepare the five-year update to the Regional Water Supply Plan. The steering committee reconvened last year and met with the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality's Senior Water Supply Planner to review the status of statewide planning efforts and to discuss the items that are required for the region's updates due by November 2018. Plan updates will include drought stage triggers and responses, conservation strategies, and changes to local circumstances in demand and use.

### **Hazard Mitigation**

### Hazard Mitigation Plan Update:

NSVRC has executed a grant contract for the Hazard Mitigation Plan update. Staff has reviewed the existing hazard mitigation plan, successful plans exhibited by FEMA, completed FEMA online independent study course IS-00318 - "Mitigation Planning for Local and Tribal Communities," began collection and review of GIS data, along with performing an initial assessment of risks and identification of vulnerabilities.

A large portion of the plan is centered on the analysis of FEMA's ArcGIS plugin, HAZUS. HAZUS analysis involves collection of very specific data related to hazard mitigation. Staff has derived a final list of the necessary data and has begun collection from the GIS departments across the region. As the data is collected, it is cleaned and input into the HAZUS software. Staff expects HAZUS analysis to be complete by next quarter.

A conference call was held recently with NSVRC staff and state officials to glean guidance and best practices for moving forward with completion of the planning process. A formal kickoff meeting with many stakeholders is the next step, once background data analysis is complete.
