**Briefing Paper** 

Appalachian Trail Parking Lot Expansion Project Clarke County, Virginia

The Appalachian Trail is a popular hiking destination for locals and persons living outside of Clarke County. A particularly popular hike is the Appalachian Trail north from Rt 7 to Raven Rocks. The parking at the trail head is just off Route 7 on Pine Grove Road (Rt 679) see attached map and photo. The current parking area holds approximately 8-10 cars. In recent years demand for parking, particularly on the weekends has exceeded the space at the lot causing motorists to park along Pine Grove Road or along Route 7. Illegal parking is hazardous and vehicles have been towed. The County Sheriff's office has been proactive at having no parking signs placed along the road in addition to information for motorists to park at Snickers Gap. However the need for additional parking persists.

The Town of Berryville and Clarke County were designated an Appalachian Trail Community in 2015. In addition, the County's Recreation Plan, a component of the Comprehensive Plan, states as a primary strategy to "Facilitate more effective public use of the Appalachian Trail while simultaneously protecting it as a critical resource."

In an effort to provide additional parking, staff met with personnel from law enforcement, the Appalachian Trail Conservancy and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) to determine if there is potential to enlarge the current parking area. The property is owned by VDOT as it was the original roadbed of Route 7. The site has been reviewed by VDOT personnel and permits have been approved for the expansion to accommodate between 30-40 passenger vehicle parking spaces.

Current efforts are to seek funding for the expansion. Initial work involves brush clearing and tree removal. Jerry McDonald has given an estimate of \$3,800 to clear and chip brush and small trees. A quote was obtained from Pittman, a VDOT contractor, 2 remove 2 large ash trees for \$3,400. Once the area of expansion has been cleared Mr. McDonald with give us an estimate to conduct the grading and gravel.





# 2018 Legislative Priorities and Positions for Clarke County 10/31/2017 Draft

Issue: Broadband Internet and Cellular Telecommunications Widespread deployment of broadband should be a top priority for the Commonwealth to ensure economic advantages, educational opportunities, the expansion of telemedicine and other modern initiatives. It is clear that Verizon Wireless, AT&T and the other internet, broadband and cellular providers will not provide broadband internet service to rural areas unless they are given incentives or a mandate to do so. Clarke County asks that the Commonwealth take steps to encourage or require rural access to broadband internet and cellular telecommunications to rural areas just as was done years ago when electrical and telephone service became important technologies.

The extremely high response rate in the statewide broadband survey RUOnline demonstrates the extreme need for services in rural areas, making Clarke County an ideal candidate for any demonstration or pilot programs contemplated by the General Assembly.

Issue: Drug Courts

Clarke County urges the General Assembly to continue and expand the use of Drug Courts and substance abuse assistance in an effort to provide a more complete and less costly alternative to employing only the criminal justice system to resolve the issues surrounding substance abuse.

Issue: Education

Clarke County supports full funding of Virginia's Standards of Quality as recommended by the Board of Education. The Commonwealth should shoulder its share of the true cost of K-12 public education without reducing other parts of the budget affecting local government or shifting costs from the Commonwealth to localities.

In addition to meeting its obligations to fund fully instructional staff, Clarke County believes the Commonwealth should meet its obligation to fund fully the support side of K-12. Full restoration should be make of the cuts made in since 2009 in areas related to support staff funding including the elimination of the funding cap on support positions, reinstatement of the Cost of Competing funds for support staff, etc.

Clarke County supports legislation to adjust the calculation of the local Composite Index to base its Real Estate value calculations on use-value instead of true value in localities that have adopted use-value taxation.

Issue: Ethics Rules

Clarke welcomes a review of the Commonwealth's Ethics Rules but believes that the rules that affect local jurisdictions and their Boards, Commissions, Authorities and Committees are strong enough today. Clarke cautions that any increase to the ethics rules affecting localities could prove detrimental to getting

people to serve in local government positions. On the State level, Clarke supports the idea of recording the votes of individual members of the General Assembly at all subcommittee meetings.

Issue: Funding for State Mandated Positions and Jails Clarke County urges the Commonwealth to meet its full funding obligations for Constitutional Officers and their state mandated positions. In addition, Clarke requests that the FY2015 state budget be amended to fund local and regional jails based on actual costs as determined by the Annual Jail Cost Report, published by the Compensation Board.

Issue: Land Conservation

Clarke County supports the Purchase of Development Rights program, the Tax Credit program for the donation of easements, the transferability of tax credits.

Issue: Sanitary Districts

Clarke County supports changes to Chapter 21 of the Code of Virginia that would move the authority to create Sanitary Districts from the Circuit Courts to the Board of Supervisors and further establish that any petition to create a sanitary district be subject to minimum standards regarding timeliness, that the petitioning process be opened to the owners of real estate proposed to be within the district and that Boards of Supervisors make a finding of fact that the establishment of a sanitary district is supported by a majority of the real estate owners of land proposed to be included in the district and that such district is necessary, practical, and fiscally responsible.

Issue: State Tax Reform, Cost and Revenue Shifting and State Year-end Surplus Funds Clarke County calls upon the Commonwealth to restructure state income, sales and use taxes to address anachronistic tax policies. Tax reform is required to help buttress the Commonwealth's General Fund that finances most core government functions and must be stabilized to meet current and foreseeable core service demands. Failure to address this need has resulted in the unfair gradual shifting of costs and the outright reduction in aid to localities to balance the state budget. With each passing year Clarke County has been required to raise real estate taxes in order to incrementally subsidize a variety of traditionally state funded (or state shared) costs (Compensation Board, Registrar, Cooperative Extension, Line of Duty, Social Services and the court system for example). This cost shifting places a tremendous burden on a regressive real estate tax system. Cost shifting must stop and the tax system must be reformed to reduce the burden on the real estate tax. Action must be taken to restore "Aid to Localities".

At a minimum tax reform should meet the following criteria:

- Reduction of local dependence on the real estate tax.
- Address fairness in taxing structures and "level the playing field" to eliminate unequal treatment; for example, ensuring the collection of sales tax from internet sales thereby promoting uniformity and fairness in the tax treatment of businesses selling goods in the Commonwealth.

- Offset any change that reduces or eliminates an existing local funding source by a new or expanded source. Clarke County opposes repeal of the machinery and tools tax or the BPOL tax unless such offset is guaranteed.
- Ensure equal taxing authority to towns, cities and counties. Clarke County's support for equal taxing authority is broad and includes requesting and supporting action by the General Assembly for partial measures such as authorizing the imposition of meals tax and cigarette and tobacco tax without need for referendum.
- Protection of the commonwealth's general fund and preservation for core government functions such as public education, health and human services, public safety, natural resources and environmental services.
   Transportation maintenance and improvements should be paid by user fees.

Issue: Water Availability

Clarke County supports proactive state action in reviewing and establishing regulations and programs to ensure that localities water sources are protected and that water quantity, as well as quality be protected.

Issue: Water Quality

Clarke County supports cost effective measures aimed at reducing loadings of pollutants in state waters from both point and non-point sources but urges the Commonwealth to consider the impacts of such measures will have on both local governments and agriculture. Further, Clarke believes reliable forms of financial and technical assistance will be required to help localities and agriculture meet the Commonwealth's goals with regard to water quality.

The Finance Committee met October 24 to consider matters relating to the closing of the FY 17 Fiscal Year:

1. **FY 17 Supplemental Appropriations.** See the attached actions to cover remaining approval of appropriations for FY 17.

"Be it resolved that General Fund budget transfer be made between accounts and in the amounts listed on the attached, and be it further resolved that estimated revenue be reduced in the accounts and amounts listed on the attached."

### 2. FY 17 Year End.

a. FY 17 Capital Projects Carryover.

"Be it resolved that FY 18 budgeted expenditure, appropriation, and estimated revenue be adjusted according to the carryforward column on the two attached documents."

b. FY 17 Conservation Easement Fund Carryover.

"Be it resolved that FY 18 budgeted expenditure and appropriation be increased \$30,160, that revenue from the Commonwealth be recognized in the amount of \$15,080, and that existing local funds in the Conservation Easement funds be utilized in the amount of \$15,080, all for the purpose of continuing appropriations for the Johnston easement purchase".

c. FY 17 Year End General Fund Balance Designations.

"Be it resolved that FY 17 year-end fund balance designations be established as presented on the attached document."

### 3. FY 18 Supplemental Appropriations.

a. Social Services. The Department of Social Services requests to purchase two vehicles. These models are available on State Contract, but do not have vinyl seating as an option. The Department is currently considering what models provide vinyl seating. In the meantime the following action is proposed, which is expected to be sufficient pending the Department's final decision on model:

"Be it resolved that FY 18 budgeted expenditure and appropriations be increased \$38,000, and the Designation for Government Savings decreased in the same amount, all for the purpose of purchasing two vehicles for the Department of Social Services."

- b. **Schools.** A list of proposed projects is attached. The setting of a public hearing for the following action is recommended:
  - "Be it resolved that FY 18 School Capital Projects budgeted expenditure and appropriation be increased \$682,253, and that the General Fund Designation for School Carryover be decreased in the same amount, all for the purpose of funding certain capital expenditures proposed by the Clarke County School Board."
- c. Lord Fairfax Health District. Carry \$25,000 from the FY 2017 fund balance forward into our FY2018 Clarke County operating budget to offset the cost for Environmental Health records scanning project and much-needed phone system and network upgrades.
