#### Call to Order

Chairman Hobert called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

#### Adoption of Agenda

Chairman Hobert requested that the agenda be modified to include approval of 2013-04R Resolution in Recognition of Service of Helen Victoria Butts.

By consensus, the Board approved the agenda as modified.

#### Clarke County Public School FY2014 Budget Presentation

Dr. Beth Leffel, Chair Clarke County School Board, provided the opening comments on behalf of the Clarke County School Board. Highlights include:

- Thanked the Board of Supervisors for their participation in the joint Finance Committee meetings during the FY2014 budget process.
- Participation in the joint meetings provided the School Board good consideration of the fiscal challenges facing the Supervisors.
- Improvements made following these meetings included providing an explanation of the requested textbook fund, better justification for the new positions requested and the School Board's \$850,000 cut from the original Superintendent's Budget.
- Dr. Leffel stated that she did not vote to approve the budget being presented to the Board of Supervisors. She explained that after attending several Board of Supervisors FY2014 Budget Finance Committee meetings and working together on the joint Finance Committee she believed that it was the responsibility of the School Board to review the budget one more time to make more cuts before presenting its budget to the Supervisors. She stated that while she believed it was a needs-based request it was a great deal of money and should be reviewed again. Dr. Leffel said that her colleagues believed that it was their responsibility to bring the entire needs-based budget to the Supervisors; and her colleagues believed that if the cuts were made before the budget was presented to the Supervisors the community might not be aware of all the Schools' needs.

#### FY2014 Budget includes:

- The proposed salary increase is fully justified particularly in consideration of the regional salary competition. A 4% increase was contemplated; however, after careful consideration, it was reduced to 3%. The State may compensate some portion of the salary increase.
- Additional staff requests focus on science and math curriculum improvements.
   Currently, the high school is understaffed and asking to hire a science teacher. A math specialist is requested to improve curriculum, improve student preparedness to increase SOL scores, and to bring the division into compliance with the Standards of Quality.
- Science textbooks are needed to keep students current in that subject.
- The Schools are dedicated to continuing career technical education.
  - Health: Partnering with Valley Health Systems will allow the Schools to offer another course in the Certified Nursing Assistant Program.
  - Science, Technology, Engineering, Math, Health: requesting the addition of a STEM H Coordinator responsible for coordinating short-term and long-term strategic plans for increasing STEM H education in Clarke County for students

and teachers, as well as curriculum alignment with other areas of technical education.

Highlights of Superintendent Murphy's comments include:

- Joint meetings with the School Board and Board of Supervisors Finance Committees were helpful and he would like to continue these joint budget meetings in future.
- Budget process started early for this fiscal year.
- The Schools developed a need-based budget.
- The Schools have made substantial cuts from the initial budget request.
- Believes that a dedicated textbook fund is needed.
- The Schools wish to retain a competitive status in the region.
- Budget request includes:
  - 3% raise \$438,000; this request is less than the 5% initially proposed by the Clarke County Teachers' Association. The Governor proposes to partially offset the cost of a 2% increase for SOQ funded instructional personnel.
  - Budget includes the following new positions:
    - Science; CCHS; 1.0; \$59,748
    - Custodian (rotating); CCHS; 1.0; \$27,384
    - Special Education; Division Wide; .5; \$29,874
    - Response to Intervention Teacher; Division Wide; 1.0; \$59,748
    - Records Retention/Secretarial; Division Wide; 1.0; \$20,880
    - Health Science Pathway Teacher; CCHS; .5; \$33,909
    - Health Science Pathway Instr. Asst.; CCHS; 1.0; \$20,880
    - STEM-H Partnership Coordinator; Division Wide; 1.0; \$59,748
    - Math Specialist; Division Wide; 1.0; \$59,748
    - Totals: 8.0 new positions at \$377,919
  - New position justifications:
    - Career and technical positions to aid children to pursue careers in specified fields.
    - Additional staff in math and science is needed to improve scores, enhance curriculum and to improve teaching skills.

- Believes health occupation careers will continue to grow and the Schools want to expand the current Certified Nursing Assistant program to offer an additional 10 slots.
- A custodian is needed to maintain cleanliness and to protect the community investment.
- Records retention secretarial support is needed to organize and transition records to electronic media.
- STEM H; this position has been discussed for a long time and the Schools believe it is time to move forward.
- Special Ed numbers continue to rise. The Schools need to invest the time and resources to identify needs. Special Ed comprises approximately 11% of the student body.

Highlights of Joint Administrative Services Director Tom Judge's comments and discussion include:

- Proposed budget requests a total expenditure increase of \$1.274MM.
- School debt service is decreasing.
- New position justifications are included beginning on page 46 of the Schools' proposed budget document.
- ADM: no change in total of 2,040 is projected.
- Approximately 237 home schooled children in the county of which approximately 66 have a religious exemption and are not tracked.
- Textbook expenditures are proposed and listed as a separate line item in the FY2014 budget. The Schools have developed a textbook Adoption Schedule.
- Budget includes \$200,000 for a portion of the School Districts' share of the cost of an ERP System. It is requested to be transferred from the General Fund Balance.
- Proposed Salary Increase:
  - The State proposes compensation [\$86,000] for a subset of school employees if locality gives a 2% salary increase to those employees funded by the standards of quality. The State proposal represents 29%, a fraction of what would be necessary to give salary increases to all employees.
  - The State contribution is subject to availability of funds left at the end of the current fiscal year. This delay conflicts with the Schools need to award contracts in early May therefore the School Board will need to know what allocations will come from the Board of Supervisors.
  - The State share is budgeted for 11 months and based on an effective date of August 1.

- The Schools are proposing a salary increase for all staff because the District questions the fairness of giving raises to only a portion of its staff.
- The locality can delay the salary increase until January 1. If a locality chose this
  option, it would spend only half of the proposed increase in the current fiscal year;
  however, it would be built into the FY2015 budget base.
- Benefits rates: no change except health insurance. The proposed budget included a 12% estimate however the actual increase of 7% is now known but has not yet been ratified by the Board of Supervisors. This adjustment will reduce the budget by \$68,008.

Highlights of comments by Rick Catlett, Assistant Superintendent:

- He participated in joint Finance Committee meetings.
- Some of the new positions requested directly address increased caseloads.
- The requested positions can be found in other jurisdictions and need to be added in Clarke.
- Hiring a math specialist is necessary to bring Clarke County into compliance. It would also address the division initiative to target math.
- While the student population remains stable, the needs of those children change.
- The Schools are receiving more medically fragile students.
- The Schools increased needs are a community issue.

#### Supervisor Comments:

Supervisor McKay opined that the Schools request for a pay raise indicated that they had lost sight of the reality of many citizens who have not gotten raises in years and are just hoping their pay will not be cut. He asked how the County could ask citizens who are struggling to give its employees a raise. Mr. McKay also asked why, with a stagnant or declining enrollment, the Schools needed to expand its workforce opining that in hard times industry lays off staff.

Vice Chairman Weiss restated that the 3% salary increase would be \$438,000, less State funding; and the eight new positions would be \$377,000.

Supervisor Byrd put forth that the Schools did need help in science and math and with the beginning children. She stated that the relationship between the boards had improved over the years and she applauded the efforts of the joint Finance Committee members. She commented that the economic environment was not showing significant improvement. She concluded by expressing her gratitude for living in a community that supports its youth.

Supervisor Staelin said that he found the presentation helpful. He put forth that he believed the Schools understood the Supervisors position noting that the Schools had mentioned earlier that parents could not afford pre-school programs. He stated that the Supervisors face the same pressures as those parents. He concluded his remarks by stating that we all want things and we must work together to do what we can.

Chairman Hobert said that he appreciated the opportunity to start the budget process earlier this year and his appreciation for the joint meeting with the Schools Finance Committee. He said that he felt confident that it was good for the School Board to assist with its prioritization and addressing more needs with fewer resources. He opined that it was unfortunate that this spirit of cooperation was coming at a time when the County was so short on funds. He stated that the revenue wasn't there and he reminded that the County had given a 2% salary increase last year that many communities did not do. Chairman Hobert explained that he had worked with representatives in Richmond that attempted to explain to the Governor and the General Assembly that the pay increase proposal for just a portion of school employees was the State's attempt to micromanage local funds. He said that the County was being penalized and not being given credit for the 2% increase last year, which he knew the teachers appreciated being given last year and not being forced to wait.

Chairman Hobert stated that it was very helpful to hear Ms. Lasky and Mr. Catlett talk about the challenges they face; but while the Board of Supervisors understood these challenges, it was very limited in what it could do. Further, there was a general consensus among the Supervisors against raising taxes this year. He further commented that the citizens were looking at a potentially dramatic impact on Virginia that would ripple out in many ways though sales tax, property values, through lack of employment, etc., which could be the beginning of a very challenging time. Mr. Hobert stated that it would be very challenging to have a budget that includes any kind of significant increase for the School district

Chairman Hobert expressed his hope that the Schools might capitalize on its partnership with Valley Health and expressed his appreciation and respect for the Schools performance and dedication. He concluded his comments by stating that he was glad to see the potential for having an ERP program noting that it had been added to the Schools budget. He opined that he believed an ERP would make the County more efficient while recognizing that it would be a relatively significant challenge to implement.

Following the 1968 election, James H. Wood, Jr. assumed the duties of Circuit Court Clerk with Mrs. Butts joining to assist him as Deputy Clerk for the next 28 years; and,
- Whereas, Mrs. Butts was elected Circuit Court Clerk at a special election held on November 4, 1997 to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Wood and she successfully prevailed in two subsequent elections in 2000 and 2008. Her current term extends through 2015; and,
- **Whereas**, during her tenure as Clerk, she faithfully served Judges James L. Berry, John R. Prosser, and John E. Wetsel, Jr, and was the first Clerk in the Commonwealth to place land records online, ensuring all land records, judgments, wills are scanned and readily available to the public; and
- **Whereas**, Mrs. Butts has served with distinction and grace, characteristically providing professional services with great care, dedication and sensitivity to the citizens of the County and the Commonwealth.
- **Now Therefore Be It Resolved**, by the Clarke County Board of Supervisors that the Honorable Helen V. Butts be recognized and congratulated on achieving 50 years of exemplary service to the citizens of Clarke County and that we gratefully express our admiration for her successful career; and,
- **Be It Further Resolved**, that her dedication, loyalty, and service to the citizens of Clarke County be hereby memorialized and presented to this extraordinary public servant as a token of the respect and high esteem in which she is held by the Clarke County Board of Supervisors, County staff, and most assuredly, her fellow citizens.

#### Did You Know?

#### Power of Parents®

Parental influence is the most important factor in helping keep teens safe. A GfK Roper Youth Report showed that 74 percent of kids (8-17) said their parents are the leading influence on their decisions about drinking. *PowerTalk 21*, April 21<sup>st</sup>, is the annual day for parents to talk with their kids about underage drinking, using the *Power of Parents* parent handbook as the guide. Each year, MADD and participating program partners and sponsors focus on reaching as many parents as possible, with the vision that April 21<sup>st</sup> will become widely known as the day to talk about kids and alcohol.

In partnership with other national organizations focused on the welfare and safety of America's youth, MADD promotes *PowerTalk 21* day annually by engaging parents and teens with the resources to start talking about alcohol, spearheaded through strategic national events. Local MADD Affiliates, working with schools and program partners, participate in significant outreach to parents to conduct workshops, distribute parent handbooks and promote *PowerTalk 21* day. #### A. VDOT Review by Ed Carter

1. Preliminary review of the Secondary Six-Year Plan

Ed Carter appeared before the Board to provide an update on potential funding for the 2014 Secondary Six-Year Plan. Mr. Carter apologized for a lack of written information noting that he had received the information on Friday, April 5.

According to Mr. Carter, it is possible that as much as \$375,000 may be available for secondary roads over the next six years.

He stated that the reconstruction of the bridge on Route 723 would be advertised in 2014 and would be funded separately from the SSYP.

He also noted that approximately \$400,000 remained from the Mosby Boulevard project; however, federal regulations may require that all or a part of those funds be spent on "eligible" projects.

It was also noted that a significant portion of that project intended for Westwood Road had been eliminated due to budget concerns.

Mr. Carter also indicated that the new transportation funding package, recently approved by the General Assembly, was projected to provide additional revenue beginning in 2017.

He reported that five of the County's unpaved roads were eligible for rural rustic paving and funding and that it would be up to the Board to determine which road or roads were selected.

He also agreed to provide the Board with written information and recommendations prior to the regular Board meeting and requested the Board set public hearing for the regular meeting in May 2013 provided an acceptable plan was developed at the April meeting.

Chairman Hobert requested that Board members email the County Administrators with any priorities or recommendations for inclusion.

#### 2. Route 612 Bridge

Mr. Carter reported that VDOT had developed a plan to replace the Route 612 bridge and to

incorporate the historic components of the bridge in a nearby monument and historical marker. Members of the Board noted that the bridge was acting as a traffic calm device and recommended the bridge not be replaced unless or until other effective means of slowing traffic had been developed and constructed.

#### B. White Post Dairy Update on March 2013 Manure Spill

4/08/2013 Summary: DEQ's Gary Flory, made a presentation to the Board in response to the April 3, 2013 letter from the Chair to Bob Peer, DEQ, who was also in attendance. Mr. Flory stressed that DEQ was working with the White Post Dairy to resolve the most recent release of untreated manure onto adjacent property owners and to identity the cause of the spike in nitrate concentrations appearing in nearby wells.

Mr. Flory indicated that a no-discharge permit was first issued in 1976; the permit allowing more than 300 cows and requiring the first lagoon was issued in 1998; and the first lagoon was completed in 2004.

Board members responded with concerns of frequent violations during this period and DEQ's apparent inability or unwillingness to mandate and enforce an acceptable operations program.

One Board member expressed grave concern that this facility had been operating for 13 years with numerous permit and operational problems. He asked when, if ever, DEQ would require compliance or revoke the facility's permit? Mr. Flory responded that not all facets of the operation were subject to the DEQ regulatory process at this time; but that most, if not all, of the regulatory process would be shifted to DEQ this coming July. Both Mr. Flory and Mr. Donnelly, Farm Manager - White Post Dairy, promised to rectify the current situation and to make every effort to ensure that the facility remains in compliance in future.

#### C. Participation in 2013 Volunteer Recruitment Assistance Program

4/08/2013 Summary: Following review, Supervisor McKay moved to authorize participation in the 2013 Volunteer Recruitment Assistance[VWS] program in conjunction with The Virginia Fire Chiefs Association and the Virginia Volunteer Workforce Solutions [VWS] program and the Chairman to execute the document. SUBJECT: Summary meeting with DEQ, White Post Dairy, April 8, 2013

At the request of the Board of Supervisors, staff from the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) was present to provide an update and answer questions as to the current compliance status of the White Post Dairy. Gary Flory, Water Compliance Manager, provided background and responded to Board questions. Other DEQ personnel in attendance were Bob Peer, Agricultural Program Coordinator, and Laura Stuart, Groundwater Specialist. Also attending were Scott Donnelly, Farm Manager for the White Post Dairy, and Caroline Roberts, adjacent property owner.

Mr. Flory began the discussion with a history of DEQ's involvement with the Dairy which initiated in 1976, at which time DEQ issued no discharge permits. In 1998, DEQ issued a Virginia Pollution Abatement Permit as the dairy exceeded 200 animals. He then detailed the construction of the original manure storage lagoon highlighting the liner system which consisted of 12 inches of compacted clay with two liners. The liners create an interstitial space which is designed to trap any leachate from the lagoon. The lagoon also has a system of 4 monitoring wells which are approximately 20 feet deep and a vault to capture escaped leachate. Mr. Flory stated that this construction is similar to that of municipal sewage lagoons and landfill cells. The required maintenance consists of periodic removal of solids to prevent capacity reduction. He said that DEQ does not regulate the setback of any dairy facilities including the lagoon to adjacent property lines.

Mr. Weiss questioned Mr. Flory on the inspection and enforcement by DEQ after numerous incidents, most recently the March 3, 2013 manure spill. Mr. Flory responded that DEQ is required to conduct an annual inspection of the dairy under the general permit, but that inspections have been conducted on average monthly, in order to determine progress toward compliance on several issues. He stated that there have been significant improvements made to protect the environment including construction of the second manure lagoon, compost facility, and manure separator system. Since the most recent spill the area where the spill occurred has been scraped, covered with top soil and reseeded. In addition a catchment basin has been constructed to capture any future overflows from the reception pit. Mr. Flory stated that so long as progress is being made toward compliance that DEQ allows for extensions in implementation of the required actions.

Mr. Staelin argued that the issues regarding groundwater contamination and lack of enforcement have been going on at the dairy for the past 13 years; he expressed frustration and the lack of oversight by DEQ.

The discussion then turned to the water quality data collected quarterly from the 4 monitoring wells. Mr. Weiss questioned why monitoring well #1 had consistent spikes in nitrate levels. Mr. Flory responded that the County in general has a history of high nitrates, based on the 1986

USGS groundwater study. He stated that DEQ wasn't sure where the nitrates were coming from but that potential sources include septic systems, and other farming operations. He reiterated that he did not think that there was a leak in the lagoon. He stated that DEQ would continue to monitor the water quality results and try to determine what was causing the elevated levels. In addition he stated that there was an overall downward trend of the nitrate levels and none of the other monitoring wells showed high readings.

Mr. Flory stated that DEQ will require additional actions from the dairy to further reduce the threat of groundwater contamination these steps will include:

- 1) Development of a spill response plan
- 2) Moving the solid/liquid manure separator to the compost area
- 3) Development of a training program for all employees
- 4) Reconstruction of the stormwater management system to eliminate the existing detention pond

Mr. Donnelly stated that the dairy has completed numerous improvements including curb and guttering the compost containment facility, adding the second lagoon, the manure separation unit, and composting. He stated that he wasn't sure what else needed to be completed and was waiting for direction from DEQ. Mr. Weiss opined that DEQ has been playing catch-up on enforcement with the dairy and limits should have been placed on the number of cows permitted at the dairy until past problems were repaired.

Mr. Hobert thanked DEQ personal for their time and requested that staff be kept informed as to the implementation of these requirements.

Re: Questions Concerning White Post Dairy Operation

Dear Mr. Peer:

The Clarke County Board of Supervisors has been concerned about the size, management, and operation of the White Post Dairy since its inception in 2000. We have consistently sought your assistance over the years to address the potential for serious damage to the County's groundwater, which as you know, is especially vulnerable due to our karst topography. Initial concerns related to the negative impact upon groundwater from the original manure storage lagoon. Subsequent issues have involved improper mortality disposal, overflow of liquid manure, and high nitrate level readings in the monitoring wells.

The current matters we would like addressed at the April 8th meeting are as follow:

#### 1) Cleanup of the spill and design of a catchment basin to prevent future spills

The latest spill occurred March 3, 2013. The dairy was given until March 15<sup>th</sup> to cleanup the spill. DEQ correspondence shows the following direction given to the Dairy:

March 15, 2013 – meeting with Bob Peer, DEQ, Scott Donnelly, Farm Manager, and Jeff Rezin, Environmental Consultant hired by Caroline Roberts; the following actions should be taken to **address immediate environmental and health risks** (emphasis added):

- 1) The manure solids in the ditch on Ms. Roberts' property will be removed and transported to the bunker silo at the dairy. You will then close the ditch and reseed that area.
- 2) The manure solids will be removed from the low area where it has accumulated more than 1 inch deep and transported to the bunker silo at the dairy. You will spread at least 2 inches of topsoil from the dairy on that area and reseed.
- 3) You timetable was to at least remove the manure solids today. Jeff Rezin will come by the site later this morning to check on the progress. I will be at the site after 4 pm today.

The proposed cleanup was to remove manure material down 2-3" and replace with topsoil. A site visit was conducted by County staff March 28th. Ms. Teetor observed one area that had been scrapped and filled, no seeding was observed. The area adjacent to the manure lagoon and areas at the lower reaches of the spill had not been touched. The ditch was not closed or seeded.

- a) Do you consider the cleanup complete? If so why was only one area addressed? If not, why has two additional weeks passed without action from the dairy or DEQ.?
- b) Will there be any penalties imposed on the dairy as a result of the spill or delayed response?
- c) How many extensions are given for cleanup efforts in these types of situations before penalties are imposed?

#### 2) Identification of contamination levels in area wells and springs

After previously identified leaks in the original manure lagoon were documented, our Board of Supervisors requested that area wells and springs be tested to determine if there were high nitrate or coliform levels. DEQ declined to conduct any sampling.

- a) Please explain DEQ's policy with regard to protection of adjacent property owner water supplies when VPDES systems fail and release contamination into the environment particularly when there are "...immediate environmental and health risks".
- b) Why has DEQ failed to document base line water quality where a historic pattern of threats to groundwater has been identified by state and local monitoring officials?

#### 3) Review monitoring well data for the original manure lagoon

The County has requested and received the water quality data sampled quarterly from the monitoring wells surrounding the original manure storage lagoon. Based on data collected, a leak was detected in 2011 caused by a broken pipe subsequently repaired by Mr. Donnelly. Of particular concern is the graph of the NO3-N concentration in MW-1.

Groundwater Specialist Laura Stuart reviewed the monitoring data and provided the following summary in a February 28, 2013 memorandum.

"In reviewing the data table provided in the report, the concentrations of nitrate have historically exceeded the MCL. During my file review, these exceedances may correspond to the line leak documented in 2010. I have prepared graphical charts with concentrations of pH, conductivity, Nitrate and Ammonia of each monitoring point to show the concentrations over time.

- The sample results for nitrate & ammonia were somewhat sporadic in the monitoring wells during the quarterly sampling events but could be attributed to site conditions or sampling methods, but the ammonia concentrations from the vault sample increased significantly. This could be geochemical changes related to increased nitrification (atmospheric nitrogen converted to ammonia) with the vault lid being open.
- No significant laboratory qualifiers were evident to suggest that the data is unreliable.
- The nitrate-N results were transposed on the nitrite-N row on Attachment C Form for the 4t h quarter report.

I would recommend that the vault be cleaned out & the cover re-installed to prevent further rainwater and air entering the system. If concentrations of ammonia and/or nitrate continue to increase, the facility may want to evaluate the integrity of the system. "

Our staff contacted DEQ to determine if the vault had been cleaned. You responded in a March 22<sup>nd</sup> email that "The cleanout of the monitoring vault has not been completed (we have been dealing with the manure spill cleanup). We will be discussing the timeline for completion at our meeting on March 28."

- a) What was the outcome of the March 28th meeting?
- b) How many quarters of monitoring are necessary before a trend can be identified?
- c) Could the erratic results of the monitoring be related to the level of liquids in the lagoon, i.e. could higher levels exert more pressure on the liner causing a leak or could higher levels reach an area where the liner is compromised?
- d) Would it be prudent to drain the contents of the original lagoon into the new lagoon in order to determine the integrity of the liner?
- e) Are there alternative, better ways to test the integrity of the liner?

#### 4) Facilities built on adjacent property

A recent survey shows a portion of the original manure storage lagoon and one of the monitoring wells is located on the adjoining property.

- a) Why did DEQ permit this?
- b) What action does DEQ propose to rectify this situation?
- 5) Proposed action and inspection schedule
  - a) In light of continued operational, training, and management issues at the Dairy, what are the required corrective actions?
  - b) What is the proposed inspection schedule for the coming year to ensure the issues are appropriately addressed?

The Clarke County Board of Supervisors remains concerned about the opertaion and oversight of the White Post Dairy. Ongoing system failures and monitoring well contamination appear to be observed by DEQ with suggested remediation carried out if and when management at the dairy has time. The patterns of failure in karst geology can only negatively impact groundwater in area wells and springs. Water quality testing since the spill has shown elevated levels of nitrates and coliform in exceedence of levels found elsewhere in agricultural areas of the County. We appreciate your willingness to attend the Board worksession and expect a clear explanation of necessary remediation efforts.

    - "Be it resolved that the FY 13 General Government Capital Projects Fund budgeted expenditure and appropriation be increased \$55,350, and revenue from the Commonwealth recognized in the same amount."
  - b. *Parks Donations*. See the Parks Director Request attached. Funds raised for swimming are proposed for purchase of lap lane flags and picnic tables.
    - "Be it resolved that the FY 13 General Fund Capital Projects Fund budgeted expenditure and appropriation be increased \$2,686, and revenue from the Parks Construction Fund recognized in the same amount."
- 2. **Historic Preservation Commission Driving Tour Brochure.** Please find a request from the Historic Preservation Commission for funding of a Driving Tour Brochure. The Finance Committee directed the Planning Director to: 1) Provide more detailed information on the adequacy of the current brochure and the proposed improvements of the new brochure, and 2) To make progress on the new brochure only to the extent that funds remain available in the \$6,000 annual allocation to the Historic Preservation Commission for ad hoc professional services.

Tour Brochure project

At their February 7, 2013 meeting, the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) agreed by consensus to request additional funding for their historic driving tour brochure project.

The HPC is responsible in part for providing information on the County's historic resources to the general public. One means of accomplishing this is the development of driving tour brochures that describe historic properties within the County's Rural Historic Districts. In years past these brochures were developed for individual districts, one for Greenway and one for Long Marsh. Since those publications, the County has added the Bear's Den District on the mountain and is soon to submit for nomination the Chapel Historic District.

In discussing an update to the brochures the HPC decided to combine the tours and create one map for the entire County which would highlight historic resources throughout the County. In addition, the Commission discussed adding icons for areas of interest related specifically to tourism as economic development. These might include restaurants, bed and breakfasts, wineries and other areas of interest.

Maral Kalbian, architectural historian, has agreed to update and add descriptions of additional historic resources but this work is beyond the scope of her current contract with the County. She estimates that it will take approximately 40 hours (\$110/hour) to update the tour descriptions and add approximately 55 sites with descriptions. There is also an additional \$2,500 needed to publish and reproduce the brochure, for a total estimated cost of \$6,900. Per Ms. Kalbian's contract, this project would be negotiated separately and funding would have to be appropriated separately by the Board of Supervisors. It does not exceed the \$25,000 threshold requiring competitive bidding.

In support of this effort, the Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) passed a motion to endorse the HPC's request at their February 20, 2013 meeting. The HPC formally requested the EDAC's endorsement for this project as it would support the County's tourism and economic development efforts.



## NOTICE OF TERRORISM INSURANCE COVERAGE

#### TERRORISM RISK INSURANCE ACT

Under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act of 2002, as amended pursuant to the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program ReauthorIzation Act of 2007, effective January 1, 2008 (the "Act"), you have a right to purchase insurance coverage for losses arising out of acts of terrorism, as defined in Section 102(1) of the Act. The following are issues that need to be described or addressed on special events permit applications:

- Tents Any tent greater than 900 square feet in size will require a Building Permit and inspections prior to the event. Inspection shall be arranged to be done during normal business hours Monday through Friday at least the day prior to the event. The event application should provide diagrams or layouts of the location of the tent(s). All tents shall be fire retardant treated with the appropriate approval label on the tent and shall have a mounted and posted fire extinguisher (5 lb. ABC min.) located in each tent. If the tent is enclosed, it shall have two (2) forms of exit that are labeled and illuminated if the event occurs after daylight. If the event will occur after daylight hours, emergency lighting shall be provided.
- Electrical Systems Any temporary or portable electrical distribution systems shall require an Electrical Permit and inspections prior to the event. All portable or temporary systems shall be Ground Fault Interrupter Circuit (GFIC) protected. Trailer mounted generators shall be provided with ground rods and grounding conductors appropriate for the generator output requirements. All equipment shall be listed and labeled for the application (weather resistant). No portable generators are allowed inside any tents or trailers where persons would normally enter. A description of the electrical distribution system shall be provided with the special event application.
- Gas Appliances All gas appliances including cooking and heating appliances shall be inspected including leak tested prior to the event. No gas cylinders will be allowed inside tents or occupied trailers or structures. All gas cylinders shall be secured in areas not normally used by the public. All gas equipment shall be in good working order and shall meet requirements of the Virginia Fuel Gas Code.
- **Lighting** Information pertaining to the temporary lighting systems shall be provided with the special event application including output wattage and generation system. Lighting system shall be located not to project excessive lighting off of the premises and not to blind any moving traffic on or of the event property. Applicants are responsible for insuring that all such permits, licenses, and certificates are obtained from the appropriate authority.
- § 57.8. Deposit. I am aware that a deposit may be required. As a condition of granting the permit, the Administrator or the Board may require the payment of a deposit to cover anticipated public clean-up costs, law enforcement costs, and/or emergency services costs beyond what is usual and customary. The applicant shall be responsible for such costs in excess of any deposit, and the applicant shall be refunded any portion of a deposit not needed to cover such costs.
- § 57.9. Permit not transferable. I am aware that this permit is not transferable.
- § 57.10. Revocation or suspension of permit. I am aware that this permit may be revoked for suspended A permit issued under the provisions of Chapter 57 may be revoked or suspended by the entity that approved the permit. The Sheriff or his/her designee may temporarily suspend the permit pending consideration, by the entity that approved the permit, of action to revoke or suspend a permit. Such action by the approving entity or the Sheriff or designee may be taken for any of the following reasons:
  - a) Any violation of one or more of the requirements or any violation of one or more of the terms and conditions of a permit issued hereunder.
  - b) Any material misrepresentation in the application for a permit.
  - c) Any change in the ownership of the location of the permitted event, unless there is provided a signed statement from the new owner to confirm that the new owner has given permission for the specific Special Event to be held.
  - d) Any material change in the condition of the facilities or ability of contracted organizations to provide required services or equipment.
  - e) Any state of emergency, disaster, hazardous weather condition, or other threat to the public health, safety, and welfare that has been declared or is anticipated to occur such that continuation of the event is deemed to be an undue or unnecessary risk to the participants, general public, or public safety providers.

f) Upon revocation or suspension of the permit, the permitee shall immediately cancel and/or terminate the eyent and provide for orderly dispersal of those in attendance.

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT, made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2013, by and between THE COUNTY OF CLARKE COUNTY,

VIRGINIA, a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia, hereinafter called the Lessor, and Dunn Land Surveys, Inc., a Virginia corporation, hereinafter called the Lessee.

#### WITNESSETH:

For and in consideration of the rental sums reserved hereunder and the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, Lessor does hereby lease to Lessee the following described property consisting of a good and substantial brick building, one story high, containing two rooms to be occupied for offices, upon the following terms and conditions:

#### 1. DESCRIPTION:

The Lessor hereby leases to the Lessee that certain lot or parcel of land, and the building located thereon lying and being situated in the Town of Berryville, County of Clarke, Virginia, and situated on that certain lot or parcel of land beginning at the Northwest Corner of the Court House lot near the G.E. Church and running thence along Church Street in said Town of Berryville fronting on said street sixty feet, thence in an Easterly direction from said street a distance of sixty feet, by a straight line a distance of sixty feet to the northern boundary line of said Court House lot, thence with said boundary line to the place of beginning, together with the improvements thereon and appurtenances thereto belonging, said lot being designated for street purposes as 106 North Church Street, Berryville, Virginia.

#### 2. TERM:

The term of this lease shall be three (3) years commencing upon the date Lessee takes occupancy and possession of the Property.

#### 3. RENT:

#### 4. OPTION TO EXTEND:

At the expiration of the primary term of this Lease, provided Lessee shall not be in default in the payment of rent or the performance of any of the covenants on its part to be performed, and except as hereinafter provided, Lessee shall have the option to renew this Lease for an additional term of three (3) years, upon giving written notice of the intention to renew to Lessor not less than ninety (90) days prior to expiration of the primary term. The terms and conditions on the renewal term shall be the same as set forth herein, except as to rent. Upon being notified of Lessee's intention to renew, Lessor shall advise Lessee of the rental amount for the renewal term not less than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the primary term; Lessee shall then notify Lessor not less than forty-five (45) days prior to expiration of the primary term whether Lessees shall elect to renew at the new rental rate. #### 5. ASSIGNMENT:

Lessees shall not assign this lease or sublet the described Property or any part thereof, without the written consent of Lessor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

#### 6. USE:

The Property shall be used as office space for the Lessee's doing survey business. No other use of the Property shall be permitted without the prior express written consent of Lessor. No use of the Property may be maintained that would be in violation of any contractual obligation or duty of Lessor. Lessor shall have the right to terminate this Lease when in its judgment the Lessee is no longer using the Property for the approved use stated above.

#### 7. PARKING:

Lessee shall have use of a maximum of two (2) unreserved parking spaces in the Courthouse parking lot. Such use is not exclusive, and available parking spaces from day to day shall not be guaranteed. Overnight parking shall be prohibited on the paved areas of the courthouse lot, but shall be permissible on the unpaved gravel portion behind the old library.

#### 8. UTILITIES:

During the term of this Lease, costs of electricity are included in the monthly rental term. Lessee shall be responsible for arranging and paying for phone service.

Lessor discloses and Lessee acknowledges that there is no plumbing in or on the Property. Public restroom facilities are located in the adjacent Clarke County District Court Building (104 North Church Street in the Town of Berryville, Virginia), and are accessible during regular District Court Clerk's Office hours only.

#### 9. REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE:

Lessee agrees to maintain the Property in a good and sufficient state of repair, and in a clean and healthy condition, loss by fire and ordinary wear and tear excepted.

Lessor agrees that during the term of this Lease and any renewal thereof, Lessor shall do the following:

- (a) Keep the exterior walls in proper and substantial repair;
- (b) Keep the roof in proper and substantial repair;
- (c) Keep the heating system in proper and substantial repair; and
- (d) Maintain the exterior appearance of the building, including paint, windows and landscaping.

It is agreed by the parties that Lessor is not an insurer and that Lessor's responsibility and liability for each of the terms of maintenance and repair set forth above shall be to make the proper repairs within a reasonable time after the necessity, nature, and location thereof has been called to Lessor's attention by Lessee.

#### 10. EXTERIOR SIGNAGE:

The Lessee shall have the right to place and maintain on the exterior of the Property, at its own expense, necessary or appropriate identification signs, in conformance with any regulations for such established by the Town of Berryville,

Virginia; provided, however, that no such sign shall be placed without the prior approval of Lessor as to design and location, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

#### 11. IMPROVEMENTS:

- A. <u>Improvements by Lessee</u>: Lessee shall have the right to make modifications and improvements to the Property to adapt it for Lessee's use of the Property as described above. However, no alterations of the building will be permitted without prior written consent of Lessor, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld.
- B. <u>Improvements by Lessor</u>: Lessor is under no obligation to make any improvements to Property. Lessee accepts Property as-is. Lessor reserves the right to address any exterior building features that it deems compromised or in disrepair by repairing or removing the feature.

#### 12. DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION:

If the leased premises shall, without fault of Lessee, be destroyed or be so damaged as to become wholly or partially untenable by fire or by providential means, then, if the Lessor shall elect to rebuild or repair, this lease shall remain in force and Lessor shall rebuild or repair the premises within a reasonable time after such election, putting premises in as good condition as they were at time of destruction or damage, and for that purpose they may enter said premises, and rent shall abate during time the premises are untenable; but if Lessor does not elect, as aforesaid, to rebuild or repair, then Lessor shall have possession of the premises hereby let, Lessee shall deliver and surrender to Lessor possession of the premises, this lease shall terminate, and the Lessee

shall have no obligation for the payment of rent from the date the premises became wholly or partially untenable.

#### 13. DEFAULT:

If any rent shall be due or unpaid for a period of twenty (20) days, or if default shall be made in any of the conditions or covenants herein contained, and if such a default should continue for thirty (30) days after written notification thereof is given to Lessee, Lessor shall have the right to terminate this lease and to recover any amounts due and owing by Lessee upon termination.

#### 14. INSURANCE:

#### A. Property Insurance:

#### B. Liability Insurance

Lessee shall annually provide Lessor with a proof of such insurance coverage. Lessor shall be listed as

an additional named insured under said policy. The policy shall be subject to the term and condition that it shall not be cancelled prior to thirty (30) day written notice to Lessor. Failure to obtain or maintain such insurance shall be grounds for termination of this Lease Agreement by Lessor without further notice to Lessee.

#### 15. INDEMNIFICATION:

Lessee agrees to indemnify and hold Lessor harmless from any and all liability, cost, expense, including attorney's fees, which the Lessor may or shall be required to pay or undertake as a result of the use, occupancy and operation of the Property by the Lessee under this Lease.

#### 16. NOTICES:

Any notice, invoice, statement, instructions, or direction required or permitted by this Lease Agreement shall be addressed as follows:

#### A. Entire Agreement:

This Lease Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between Lessor and Lessee. Provided, however, that if the Lessor intends to use the Property for its own uses at the expiration of the primary term, it shall notify Lessee in

writing not less than one (1) year prior to the expiration of the primary term, in which event the option to renew contained herein shall become null and void and in no further force and effect.

#### 4. ASSIGNMENT:

Lessee is permitted to sublet and share the Property solely with FISH OF CLARKE COUNTY, a private non-profit organization that assists individuals and families in need in and around Clarke County, hereinafter called the Sub-Lessee.

Lessee shall not assign this lease or sublet the described Property or any part thereof to any other entity without the written consent of Lessor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

#### 5. USE:

The Property shall be used by the Lessee and Sub-Lessee as office space and to maintain their organizations' resources and centralize their operations, including the organizations' usual and customary activities of sales and other distribution of food, clothing, etc. to those in need. No other use of the Property shall be permitted without the prior express written consent of Lessor. No use of the Property may be maintained that would be in violation of any contractual obligation or duty of Lessor. Lessor shall have the right to terminate this Lease when in its judgment, Lessee is no longer using the Property for the approved uses stated above, or when the organization of the Lessee becomes inactive or unable to regularly use and maintain the Property for the approved purposes stated above.

#### 6. UTILITIES AND HEAT:

During the term of this Lease, Lessee shall be responsible for arranging and paying for all utilities (electricity, phone, water and sewer) and for fuel costs for heat (oil and/or gas).

#### 7. BASEMENT:

Lessor discloses and Lessee acknowledges that the basement of the Property is subject to water and moisture infiltration especially in instances of heavy stormwater. Such condition is mitigated and managed by a sump pump.

Lessee is hereby put on notice that no guarantee is made by Lessor as to the fitness or usefulness of the Property's basement area for storage of any items that might be compromised by exposure to or contact with moisture.

#### 8. PARKING:

The gravel lot may be accessed by vehicular traffic from Church Street by way of the courthouse parking lot or from East Main Street by way of the driveway located on 34 East Main Street to the west of the Property.

Lessor's established snow/ inclement weather maintenance plan. All other snow removal shall be the sole responsibility of Lessee.

#### 9. GRASSY AREA:

Upon consent of the Lessor through the County Administrator, Lessee and Sub-Lessee are authorized to use the grassy area owned by Lessor located beyond the gravel lot for certain of their organizations' special events and fundraisers. Such use shall be subject to conditions established by Lessor.

Lessee shall be solely responsible for damage or liability arising from such use of the space.

#### 10. REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE:

Lessee agrees to maintain the Property in a good and sufficient state of repair, and in a clean and healthy condition, loss by fire and ordinary wear and tear excepted.

Lessee agrees that during the term of this Lease and any renewal thereof, Lessee shall do the following:

- (a) Maintain exterior landscaping, including mowing the lawn of the Property;
- (b) Keep the interior plumbing systems in proper and substantial repair, including completing renovation of the upstairs bathroom facility;

Lessor agrees that during the term of this Lease and any renewal thereof, Lessor shall do the following:

- (a) Keep the exterior walls in proper and substantial repair;
- (b) Keep the roof in proper and substantial repair;
- (c) Keep the heating system in proper and substantial repair; and
- (d) Maintain the exterior appearance of the building, including siding, paint, and windows.

It is agreed by the parties that Lessor is not an insurer and that Lessor's responsibility and liability for each of the terms of maintenance and repair set forth above

shall be to make the proper repairs within a reasonable time after the necessity, nature, and location thereof has been called to Lessor's attention by Lessee.

#### 11. EXTERIOR SIGNAGE:

All signage must comply with requirements and restrictions imposed by the Town of Berryville.

- A. <u>Permanent Signs</u>: The Lessee shall have the right to place and maintain on the exterior of the Property, at its own expense, necessary or appropriate signs identifying the organizations located therein; provided, however, that no such sign shall be placed without the prior approval of Lessor as to design and location, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- B. <u>Temporary Signs</u>: The Lessee and Sub-Lessee shall have the right to place, from time to time, on the exterior of the Property, at their own expense, appropriate signs advertising certain of the organizations' events that are of interest to the public; provided, however, that no such sign shall be placed without the prior approval of Lessor as to design and location, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

#### 12. IMPROVEMENTS:

A. <u>Improvements by Lessees</u>: Lessee shall have the right to make modifications and improvements to the Property to adapt it for Lessee's and Sub-Lessee's uses of the Property as described in Paragraph 5 above. No structural alterations of the building will be permitted without prior written consent of Lessor, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld. All

interior work shall be subject to all Building Code and local permitting requirements.

- a. <u>Porch</u>: Lessor discloses and Lessee acknowledges that the porch on the back of the building, though structurally sound, is in a state of disrepair and not currently suitable for Lessee's or Sub-Lessee's use. Lessee is authorized to make a determination of the utility of such space and, upon written consent of Lessor, to improve or remove, at Lessee's expense, such porch in compliance with any Building Code and local permitting requirements. If the porch is removed, it shall be replaced with a suitable means of egress from the second floor of the building, such as a deck with a staircase.
- B. <u>Improvements by Lessor</u>: Lessor is under no obligation to make any improvements to Property. Lessee accepts Property as-is. Lessor reserves the right to address any exterior building features that it deems compromised or in disrepair by repairing or removing the feature.

#### 13. DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION:

If the leased premises shall, without fault of Lessees, be destroyed or be so damaged as to become wholly or partially untenable by fire or by providential means, then, if the Lessor shall elect to rebuild or repair, this lease shall remain in force and Lessor shall rebuild or repair the premises within a reasonable time after such election, putting premises in as good condition as they were at time of destruction or damage, and for that purpose they may enter said premises, and rent shall abate during time the premises are untenable; but if Lessor does not elect, as aforesaid, to rebuild or repair, then

Lessor shall have possession of the premises hereby let, Lessee shall deliver and surrender to Lessor possession of the premises, this lease shall terminate, and the Lessee shall have no obligation for the payment of rent from the date the premises became wholly or partially untenable.

#### 14. DEFAULT:

If any rent shall be due or unpaid for a period of twenty (20) days, or if default shall be made in any of the conditions or covenants herein contained, and if such a default should continue for thirty (30) days after written notification thereof is given to Lessees, Lessor shall have the right to terminate this lease and to recover any amounts due and owing by Lessees upon termination.

#### 15. INSURANCE:

#### A. Property Insurance:

Lessor shall maintain in full force and effect during the term of this Lease

Agreement a policy of hazard insurance on the Property at Lessor's sole cost and expense, to its full insurable value. Such policy shall be sufficient to protect against loss incurred by damage or destruction by fire or other perils covered by the standard form of extended coverage endorsements to fire insurance policies in the Commonwealth of Virginia in effect at the time the policy is obtained.

Lessees shall be solely responsible for maintaining contents insurance for Lessees' personal property and equipment, should Lessees be so advised.

#### B. Liability Insurance

Lessees shall maintain in effect throughout the terms of this Lease, and any extension thereof, general public liability insurance coverage with limits of at

least One Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). Lessee shall annually provide Lessor with a proof of such insurance coverage. Lessor shall be listed as an additional named insured under said policy. The policy shall be subject to the term and condition that it shall not be cancelled prior to thirty (30) day written notice to Lessor. Failure to obtain or maintain such insurance shall be grounds for termination of this Lease Agreement by Lessor without further notice to Lessees.

#### 16. INDEMNIFICATION:

Lessees agree to indemnify and hold Lessor harmless from any and all liability, cost, expense, including attorney's fees, which the Lessor may or shall be required to pay or undertake as a result of the use, occupancy and operation of the Property by the Lessee under this Lease.

#### 17. NOTICES:

Any notice, invoice, statement, instructions, or direction required or permitted by this Lease Agreement shall be addressed as follows:

or to such other address or addresses as shall at any time or from time to time be specified by any Party by written notice to the other Party.

#### 18. MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT:

Any modification of this agreement or additional obligation assumed by either party in connection with this Lease Agreement shall be binding only if evidenced in writing and signed by each party or an authorized representative of each party.

#### 19. MISCELLANEOUS:

#### A. Entire Agreement:

This Lease Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between Lessor and Lessees. Any prior understanding or representation of any kind preceding the date of this agreement shall not be binding upon either party except to the extent to the extent incorporated in this Agreement.

#### B. Governing Law:

This Lease Agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, and any action brought to enforce its provisions shall be brought in the Circuit Court of Clarke County, Virginia.

#### C. <u>Provisions Several</u>:

The provisions of the Lease Agreement are several, and should a court of competent jurisdiction declare that any one or more of the provisions is unenforceable, the remainder shall remain in full force and effect.

#### D. Attorneys' Fees:

In the event that any legal action is taken in relation to this Lease Agreement, the unsuccessful party in the action shall pay to the successful party in addition to all sums that either party may be called on to pay, a reasonable sum for the successful party's attorney's fees.

#### **MEMORANDUM**

RE: Public Hearing for Conservation Easement Purchases

There are three Conservation Easement purchases that are near closing: Arkfield, and two Moore and Dorsey properties. The total expenditure for these easements is \$805,282. The local share for the three purchases, \$37,492, is budgeted, along with \$1,811 for the local share of closing costs. It is necessary to increase expenditures and revenue to account for the portion of the purchases associated with funding from Farm and Ranchland Protection, Virginia Land Conservation, Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, and the Piedmont Environmental. This will retain an appropriation of \$76,176 of local funds, as a portion of the \$378,872 balance of local amounts in the fund, thereby enabling future matches. To accomplish this, the following action is recommended:

"Be it resolved that the FY 13 budget be amended to increase expenditures and appropriations by \$766,079, and to recognize revenue from State, Federal, and private sources in the amount of \$766,079, all for the purpose of purchasing conservation easements on three properties located in the County of Clarke."
