#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Hobert called the meeting to order at 6:34 pm.

There was a member's consensus that the agenda be approved as presented.

#### 2. CHANGES SINCE LAST MEETING

Mr. Judge briefly updated the Board of Supervisors and the public about the changes to the net tax funding as of April 30, 3012, noting minor changes and adjustments to the FY13 proposed budget. Changes Mr. Judge highlighted were to the budgets of the Clerk of the Circuit Court, Sheriff's Department, Regional Jail, Planning Administration, and Cooperative Extension

Vice-Chairman Weiss noted that the formula used to calculate the Virginia Tech Cooperative Extension fund is an outdated formula. Mr. Judge suggested that the formula is based upon the amount of agricultural land and livestock in the county.

Mr. Judge then highlighted the changes to the estimated revenue from the Commonwealth, noting a decrease in deficit of \$13,540.

Jim Brinkmier appeared before the Board of Supervisor to provide a PowerPoint presentation titled Construction / Renovation Update Clarke County Public Schools given

last evening to the Clarke County School Board. Highlights of the presentation and discussion include:

- The School Board gave very little guidance to OWPR other than to design in the most efficient way to accomplish all three projects with a total \$7.2MM budget.
- Cooley 33,400 sq ft does not include new gymnasium. Capacity 248
- 5 rooms for each grade 1 through 5; classroom size 18 to 22 students.
- VDOE has classroom maximums
- Option A gives more option for growth
- Current CCHS
  - Estimated costs include site work
  - o Capacity 456 currently
  - Core built to handle the proposed 456 students
  - o Mr. Brinkmeier will verify numbers and whether figures include soft costs.
  - Dr. Murphy advised that it is the division's intent to retain the athletic end of the former high school for community and school division use.
- Numerous questions were raised about school population and projections. Chairman Hobert stressed the importance of using growth projections from demographers.
- In response to questions on continued use of leased space for alternate education, Dr. Murphy advised that the Schools were looking for another space and relocation to the existing Primary school was being considered. Potential future uses of Primary are being explored.
- On the option of converting the Cooley facility to administrative offices,
  - o Dr. Murphy advised that the gym would function as an auxiliary for preK through 5.
  - Mr. Brinkmeier added that a walkway between Cooley and the former high school is planned.
  - Supervisor Staelin put forth that conversion of the Cooley facility for administrative office use might not be well received by the community.
  - Dr. Murphy opined that there is a potential \$50,000 savings in utility costs in relocating and combining at the Cooley facility: School Administration, personnel located in the Annex, Joint Administrative Services and Information Technology.

I am writing to express support, on behalf of the Board of Supervisors of Clarke County, for the Clarke County Conservation Easement Authority's application for Special Project Area designation for the County's Groundwater Recharge Area.

In 2002, as a result of a prolonged and serious drought, the County initiated a 6-year groundwater study with the United States Geological Survey (USGS). The primary objective of the study was to enhance the County's understanding of the quantity and sustainability of our

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groundwater resources. A report entitled "Hydrogeology and Groundwater Availability in Clarke County, Virginia" details the results of the 6-year study. The report describes the methodology used to describe the groundwater flow patterns that ultimately determine how groundwater is recharged.

One important finding of the study was the identification of the "Limestone Ridge", or "Groundwater Recharge Area", an area that encompasses the drainage divide between the Opequon and the Shenandoah basins occurs along an area above the 630' contour line. This area has been identified as being important for groundwater recharge. Preventing large amounts of impervious surface in this area will help to insure the maximum amount of recharge is available in any given year.

We believe that designation of the Groundwater Recharge Area in Clarke County as a VOF Special Project Area will play a critical role in helping to prevent excessive impervious surface is the placement of voluntary conservation easements that will protect this sensitive area in perpetuity. ## <u>Lord Fairfax Emergency Medical Services Council Memorandum of Agreement Regarding Use of Medical Radios</u>

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA)
Between
Lord Fairfax Emergency Medical Services Council (LFEMS), Inc.
and
the County of Clarke
(on behalf of all Clarke County Fire & Rescue agencies)

#### I. PURPOSE & SCOPE

The purpose of this Memorandum of Agreement between EMS Agencies, hospitals, and/or local governing bodies (County Administrators/City Managers) is to establish an agreement regarding the use of medical (med) radios licensed to the Lord Fairfax Emergency Medical Services Council, Inc. (LFEMS) by the Federal Communication Commission (FCC). The med radio frequencies are used for radio communications transmitted from ambulance to ambulance and ambulance to hospital for the purpose of pre-hospital patient care.

#### II. BACKGROUND

The LFEMS is responsible for the maintenance; repair, replacement, and license of all med radio frequencies within the LFEMS region since granted licenses by the FCC. The call signs for each license are KA91372, KNCS606, KNCS607, WGN601, WGN602, WGN603, WGN604, WNUG786, and WPGU207.

The frequencies are licensed to the LFEMS for use by pre-hospital providers in Clarke County, Frederick County, Page County, Shenandoah County, Warren County, and the City of Winchester per the FCC regulations.

#### III. RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THIS MOA

The LFEMS is responsible for maintenance, repair, replacement, and license for all fixed and mobile med radio communications equipment.

#### IV. RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THIS MOA

The local EMS Agencies, hospitals, and/or local governing body's responsibility is to comply with the FCC regulations.

## V. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

The LFEMS grants permission for all pre-hospital providers to use the med radio frequencies to transmit patient care communication from ambulance to ambulance and ambulance to hospital for the purpose of pre-hospital patient care according to FCC regulations.

#### VI. FUNDING

The funding to maintain, repair, replace, and license for all fixed and mobile med radio communications equipment is paid for from the LFEMS's Communication Fund. The fund is supported by the local hospitals and LFEMS general fund.

#### VII. EFFECTIVE DATE AND SIGNATURE

This MOA shall be effective upon the signature of parties listed below. It shall be in force from the date of original signature of both parties and shall not expire unless there is a change or loss of frequencies granted by the FCC. Both parties indicate agreement with this MOA by their signatures.

She advised the Board that a coalition of local environmentally oriented groups are working together to implement a plan to clean up the Spout Run watershed and requested the Board support the coalition's efforts by endorsing a request for a Chesapeake Bay Small Watershed Grant.

Dear Ms. Bassow,

I am writing to express support for Clarke County's Chesapeake Bay Small Watershed Grant to foster enhanced landowner stewardship and the restoration of riparian and aquatic habitat in the Spout Run watershed. There is a critical need for projects that target restoration activities to maximize pollutant reductions while restoring habitat of significant ecological value in the Chesapeake Bay watershed today. If we are to meet the aggressive nutrient and sediment reductions established through the Chesapeake Bay TMDL, local governments will not only need to encourage the targeted implementation of practices that address the greatest sources of nutrients and sediment, but also those that restore natural resources of local significance. In order to truly improve water quality in our

local streams and the Chesapeake Bay, a comprehensive and inclusive approach that considers agricultural, residential and urban pollutant loads is necessary. The holistic nature of the C-Spout Run project and the partnership that is behind it make it an excellent opportunity to improve a unique and ecologically valuable local stream and the Chesapeake Bay.

Spout Run is one of several spring creeks in the Shenandoah Valley that shows great promise for the reintroduction of brook trout. The local watershed community is both aware of, and enthusiastic about the streams potential to support a cold-water fishery. However, Spout Run and its tributaries are currently listed on Virginia's 303(d) list for a biological impairment due to excess sediment, and an *E.coli* impairment. A TMDL was developed for Spout Run in 2010, and an implementation plan is currently under development. Consequently, the local community has been actively engaged in the process of identifying measures that can be taken to restore the stream. Based on the findings of the TMDL study, much of the sediment in Spout Run is coming from the stream banks (approximately 60% of the total load). This means that in order to address the biological impairment, considerable stream bank stabilization will be needed. Based on local knowledge of the watershed and preliminary stream surveys, it is clear that there are several sections of stream bank that are contributing a large portion of the overall sediment load. This project will strategically target these stream segments.

The C-Spout Run project has engaged a diverse group of local stakeholders including non profits, local government and state agencies. The partnership that is in place in the watershed today will facilitate a comprehensive approach to watershed restoration that effectively addresses residential, urban and agricultural sources of bacteria and sediment in Spout Run. This holistic approach to improving water quality is critical to fostering broad based community stewardship, which was called for in the President's Executive Order for the Chesapeake Bay and associated action plan. Engaging the local community to do their part to reduce runoff from their roofs, lawns, pastures and parking lots will play an important role in cleaning up the Chesapeake Bay as well as our local rivers and streams.

Clarke County will be responsible for coordinating and developing the private landowner stewardship in the residential and urban areas of the watershed. This will include:

- Coordinating with the Interstate Commission on the Potomac River Basin (ICPRB) to conduct rain barrel workshops.
- Developing "attractive" riparian buffer program to begin vegetating setbacks in residential areas
- Working with the Center for Watershed Protection to identify 1-2 high priority stormwater projects in the watershed for targeting reforestation

We believe that this project will place a critical role in improving water quality and the overall health of Spout Run. We fully support this proposal. #### 19) Convenience Center Update.

David Ash provided a graphic presentation pertaining to the Clarke County Citizen Convenience Center planned for location on Quarry Road.

Supervisor Staelin pressed the importance of landscaping to shield from the road.

Chairman Hobert invited the public to comment.

<u>Jim Bogaty</u>, Veramar Vineyards 911 Quarry Road: asked how the increased traffic load would be handled, safety addressed and traffic slowed to allow vehicles to cross the road.

David Ash and Vice Chairman Weiss advised that after thoroughly reviewing the proposed plan VDOT determined that no changes to Route 7 were required.

Supervisor Byrd suggested that hours of operation could be adjusted to alleviate potential traffic issues.

Mr. Bogaty put forth, and the Supervisors concurred, the route was one of the busiest secondary roads in the county.

Supervisor Staelin explained that a lease had been made available and the County must accept the option by June 16. As part of the process, a cost estimate was developed to determine the feasibility of locating a collection station at this site. Mr. Staelin said that Planning Commission would be part of the site development process. He opined that signalization might be a potential solution to traffic issues.

<u>Doug Whitehouse</u>, President of Blue Ridge Mountain Association 51 Stonecrest Lane, stated that he agreed with Mr. Bogaty on traffic safety concerns. He said that he supported locating the facility in that area of the county opining that this facility would save tremendous amounts of gasoline and time for mountain residents. He stated that the majority of mountain residents were supportive.

Both Jim and Della Bogaty upheld that traffic on Route 7 needs to be slowed.

<u>Della Bogaty</u>, Veramar Vineyards 911 Quarry Road: asked how 200 trips per day into the convenience center had been determined.

David Ash responded that Ed Strawsnyder, Frederick County Public Works Director, had supplied the estimate.

Vice Chairman Weiss put forward that placement of a convenience center on this site would impact approximately 25% of the County's population located in the vicinity of the proposed facility.

David Ash concurred adding that this facility would be closer to a greater portion of the County and would cover more County residents than any other site.

Della Bogaty expressed her desire to use the proposed facility and her hope that traffic on Route 7 could be slowed. She urged safety consideration at the crossover.

Vice Chairman Weiss commented that VDOT had indicated that a traffic light was not warranted at this point.

Supervisor Staelin added that signage would be carefully reviewed during the site plan process.

Della Bogaty asked what Stuart Perry wanted in return for leasing the land.

Chairman Hobert responded that Mr. Perry would own the facility in 40 years if the County makes the election to lease the property and makes the election to exercise the option after 20 years.

Vice Chairman Weiss stated that the County was not paying to lease the property. He said that Mr. Perry did ask that a sign be erected on the site indicating that he had donated the land. Mr. Weiss commented that Mr. Perry, with this donation, wanted to help the community that had been good to him.

In summary, Chairman Hobert concluded that the Board had a contract that gives the County the right to exercise an option to lease the property for 40 years and Board action was required to grant the authority to sign the lease and authority to exercise the option required on or before June 16, 2012.

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Vice Chairman Weiss moved to authorize the County Administrator and the Chair of the Board, upon consultation with counsel and the other Board members, to proceed to exercise the option before June 16 and to, if appropriate, execute the lease on behalf of the County. The motion carried as follows:

# Member Contributions by Salary Reduction for Counties, Cities, Towns, and Other Political Subdivisions (In accordance with Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497)) Resolution 2012-12R

- WHEREAS, the Clarke County 55121 employees who are Virginia Retirement System members who commence or recommence employment on or after July I, 2012 ("FY20 13 Employees" for purposes of this resolution), shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation by salary reduction pursuant to Internal Revenue Code § 414(h) on a pre-tax basis upon commencing or recommencing employment; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Clarke County 55121 employees who are Virginia Retirement System members and in service on June 30, 2012, shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation by salary reduction pursuant to Internal Revenue Code § 414(h) on a pre-tax basis no later than July 1, 2016; and
- **WHEREAS**, such employees in service on June 30, 2012, shall contribute a minimum of an additional one percent of their creditable compensation beginning on each July I of2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016, or until the employees' contributions equal five percent of creditable compensation; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Clarke County 55121 may elect to require such employees in se1vice on June 30, 2012, to contribute more than an additional one percent each year, in whole percentages, until the employees' contributions equal five percent of creditable compensation; and
- **WHEREAS**, the second enactment clause of Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497) requires an increase in total creditable compensation, effective July 1, 2012, to each such employee in service on June 30, 2012, to offset the cost of the member contributions, such increase in total creditable compensation to be equal to the difference between five percent of the employee's total creditable compensation and the percentage of the member contribution paid by such employee on January 1, 2012.

The Clarke County Planning Commission recommends the amendment of the County Zoning Ordinance Section 6-B-Site Development Plans, when required so as to add Small Wind Turbines to the items not requiring a site plan. TA-12-01

The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend the proposed amendment to the Board of Supervisors at their June 1 meeting.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Recommend set public hearing for the text amendment to the County Zoning Ordinance so as to add small wind turbines to the items not requiring a site plan.

#### Comments to PC - June 1

No further comments.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Commission voted to recommend approval to the Board of Supervisors of the proposed amendment to the County Zoning Ordinance (8-0; Kreider, Brumback, Staelin absent). No one spoke for or against the item at the Commission's public hearing.

#### Comments to PC - May 1

At the Planning Commission meeting last month concerns were raised regarding the potentially unintended consequences of waiving the site plan requirements for wind turbines. In addition, Mr. Thuss wondered if a 100kW system was too large for residential use. As a result of these concerns the Commission moved to postpone action and have the committee discuss these issues further. The committee met again on Thursday April 26, 2012, present was Mr. Nelson, Mr. Kreider, Mr. Steinmetz, and Mr. Turkel.

The committee first discussed the size of the systems. Members were uncomfortable reducing the size to 10kW as this might unnecessarily limit the needs of some households. They discussed reducing the size to something less than 100kW but in the end determined that based on the other constraints including height limits and setbacks that the potential problems associated with these larger small systems would be addressed.

The second topic was under what circumstances a site plan should be required. Currently special use permits and site plans are required for wind turbines greater than 100 feet in height or if three or more structures are installed. The committee agreed to recommend modifying the existing site plan requirements to exempt structures greater than 100 feet but require a site plan if three or more structures are installed.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Set public hearing on the proposed amendment for the June 1st Planning Commission meeting.

#### Comments to PC - April 6

Recently a citizen contacted staff to discuss the regulations pertaining to residential wind turbines. He stated that he had researched the energy generation benefits and had decided that building a 120' turbine would be the most efficient in terms of cost and energy production. Current regulations allow turbines up to 100' as a permitted use and those over 100' require a special use permit. On further review if a special use permit is required then a site plan is also required. Staff opined that requiring a site plan may not be necessary as there are few if any site development issues related to wind turbine siting as compared to other uses where site plans are required such as convenience stores where traffic, parking, stormwater, and erosion and sediment control issues are addressed.

In response to these issues, Planning Commission Chair, George Ohrstrom, appointed a committee to review the existing wind turbine regulations that were adopted in 2008. The committee (Jon Turkel, Scott Kreider, Chip

Steinmetz, and Cliff Nelson) were tasked with reviewing the current wind turbine regulations in order to determine if height limitations were still appropriate and if so when a site plan should be required.

The committee met March 13<sup>th</sup> to discuss the wind turbine requirements. After discussion the committee determined that changing the height limits would require additional research and could have unintended consequences as the 100' limit is consistent with height limits on other features such as cell towers. They did agree that waiving the site plan was reasonable and recommended the following text amendment to include wind turbines as one of the structures not requiring a site plan.

#### 6 SITE DEVELOPMENT PLANS

(7/20/93) (6/15/04)

#### 6-A INTENT

The purpose of these requirements is to promote the orderly development of certain activities in the County and to insure that such activities are developed in a manner harmonious with surrounding properties and in the interest of public health, safety, and welfare. The site plan shall be used to review:

- 1. a project's compatibility with its environment,
- 2. the ability of proposed traffic circulation systems to provide for safe and convenient movement of vehicles and pedestrians,
- 3. the quantity, quality, utility, and type of the project's community facilities, and
- 4. the location and adequacy of the provision for drainage and utilities.

#### 6-B WHEN REQUIRED

- 6-B-1 A site plan shall be submitted in accordance with this article for all proposed buildings, structures, or uses, except:
  - a. single family detached dwellings
  - b. small wind turbines subject to the following requirements:
    - (1) single structures greater than 100 feet in height; or
    - (2) less than three wind turbine structures 100 feet or less
  - c. agricultural buildings.
- A site plan shall be submitted when a change of use of an existing structure requires additional parking or other significant external improvements.

Dear Members of the Transportation Conference Committee:

The Clarke County Board of Supervisors expresses its deep concern over provisions currently being considered for inclusion in the Surface Transportation Law (H.R. 4348 and S. 1813) that will weaken protections for our nation's – and Clarke County's – historic resources. The Board supports the efforts of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, Preservation Action, and the National Conference of State Historic Preservation Officers (NCSHPO) to urge the Committee to:

- 1. Oppose proposals that weaken existing protections for our historic places;
- 2. Reject automatic exemptions from project reviews; and
- 3. Support the continued availability of funding for relevant historic preservation projects under the Transportation Enhancements Program.

Historic preservation and resource conservation are among Clarke County's highest local priorities and our jurisdiction has received state and national notoriety for our efforts in these fields. Maintaining a strong and effective local program has its limitations as localities do not have the authority to preempt State and Federal projects with our own regulations. Instead, we must rely on Federal regulations to ensure that Federal transportation projects are held to the same high standards of scrutiny regarding impact on historical resources as the County would require of private sector projects.

Potential changes to the Surface Transportation Law would replace direct regulatory oversight with a consultative historic review process and inadequate state review processes, and would establish new review exemptions that would completely remove historic resource protections for many projects. Funding for historic preservation projects also stands to be threatened by these proposed regulatory changes.

As you deliberate potential changes to the Surface Transportation Law, please keep our concerns in the forefront of your discussions and take steps to ensure that funding and protections for our historic resources are maintained.

Maintaining a strong and effective local program has its limitations as localities do not have the authority to preempt State and Federal projects with our own regulations. Instead, we must rely on Federal regulations to ensure that Federal transportation projects are held to the same high standards of scrutiny regarding impact on historical resources as the County would require of private sector projects.

Potential changes to the Surface Transportation Law would replace direct regulatory oversight with a consultative historic review process and inadequate state review processes, and would establish new review exemptions that would completely remove historic resource protections for many projects. Funding for historic preservation projects also stands to be threatened by these proposed regulatory changes.

As you deliberate potential changes to the Surface Transportation Law, please keep our concerns in the forefront of your discussions and take steps to ensure that funding and protections for our historic resources are maintained.

Dear Members of the Transportation Conference Committee:

As Congress moves forward with the reauthorization of our national surface transportation law and reconciles the various provisions contained in H.R. 4348 and S. 1813, we ask that the nation's historic resources continue to be protected as part of transportation plans. We urge you to: 1) oppose proposals that weaken existing protections for our historic places; 2) reject automatic exemptions from project reviews; and 3) support the continued availability of funding for relevant historic preservation projects under the Transportation Enhancements program.

For more than 40 years, our surface transportation laws have included effective protections for historic resources. Prior to that, major highway projects were constructed without consideration of surrounding communities. Entire neighborhoods were destroyed by highway projects, allowing no opportunity for comment, and no review preventing the destruction of historic properties. In response to the devastating impacts of certain highway projects upon historic resources, parks and recreation areas, Congress established the strong protections of section 4(f) of the Department of Transportation Act as a safeguard to ensure our nation's historic neighborhoods remain vibrant and successful.

As the conference committee deliberates the provisions of this reauthorization bill, we ask that you consider the following issues related to historic preservation:

#### 1) Reject weakening protections for historic places

Section 607 of H.R. 4348 would profoundly weaken the protection of historic resources by eliminating the effective tool of section 4(f). Section 607 substitutes the strong protections for historic resources now provided by section 4(f) with the consultative project review process afforded by section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, calling them duplicative. These

reviews are very different and are not interchangeable. Section 106 provides a process for considering the potential impact of a federal project upon existing and discovered cultural resources. In contrast, section 4(f) requires the avoidance of these places, unless it is not "feasible and prudent," and unless the project includes "all possible planning to minimize harm." These two provisions, signed into law on the same day in 1966, were clearly designed to complement each other and are not duplicative. We strongly urge you to reject section 607's inclusion in the final conference report.

Additionally, section 615 of H.R. 4348 would substitute state environmental laws for section 106, further weakening protections by allowing for inconsistent and varied reviews. A survey of State Historic Preservation Offices (SHPOs) showed that virtually all SHPOs felt very strongly that state laws are an inadequate substitute for section 106.

#### 2) Reject exemptions from historic preservation reviews

A number of provisions in both H.R. 4348 and S. 1813 would eliminate both the ability to consider the impact of a project on historic resources and the ability of citizens to have a voice in protecting historic resources in their communities. These exemptions include:

- acquiring or disposing of properties purchased with tax dollars without considering the impact on historic places or whether or not they are historic themselves;
- reviewing projects costing less than \$10 million;
- mandating that regardless of complexity, reviews not completed by an arbitrary deadline will be automatically approved;
- categorical exclusions one provision goes as far as to exempt all bridge demolition
  and reconstruction projects from review even the demolition of the Golden Gate
  Bridge or the Brooklyn Bridge would be barred from review under this radical provision.

We urge you to not include these provisions in the final conference report.

3) Support continued availability of funding for relevant historic preservation projects

We support the ability for states and local governments to access federal Transportation

Enhancement (TE) dollars for historic preservation projects related to transportation initiatives.

The TE program has revitalized historic communities by improving access, safety and economic

vitality to downtowns and neighborhoods. We ask that TE funding continue to be available for relevant historic preservation projects.

Transportation projects are important to enhancing the mobility of people and goods. However, if comprehensive and considerate planning and review does not take place, transportation projects hold great potential to harm or destroy our communities. As you continue to negotiate a new highway reauthorization bill, please ensure our nation's transportation law continues to preserve our heritage, strengthen our communities and enhance our economy.

Gentlemen:

The Clarke County Board of Supervisors requests your assistance in creating a program to reach out to and motivate businesses which may be interested in locating in Clarke County, particularly those which might locate in the Waterloo area and be served by the Clarke County Sanitary Authority.

A small waste water treatment program like the one operated by our Sanitary Authority costs considerably more proportionately than a larger system and connection fees can be a significant initial expense to a business. Consequently, we believe these fees may be a limiting factor to the startup or relocation of a business in the Waterloo area.

The Board is requesting you work with staff to create a designed incentive package that can be offered to new business prospects or to existing businesses that seek to expand in the Waterloo area, especially those that can contribute the greatest tax revenue and net employment gain to the community. This package could include rate subsidies, low interest loans, and tax abatements but does not have to be limited to these options.

To ensure that the County benefits from the anticipated revenue and employment gains, consideration should be given to "claw back" provisions in the event the business receiving incentives does not meet its commitments. The proposal is intended to attract businesses that might not otherwise be inclined to consider the Waterloo location. If the designed incentive package is ultimately approved, we would work with owners and developers in the area, as well as realtors, through the County's website and other media, to prompt businesses to consider this location and to take advantage of the offered incentives.

We recognize that in order for an effort of this nature to be successful, funds will have to be allocated by way of grants or loans to reduce the impact of the hook-up or connection fees.

#### 1. FY 12 Supplemental Appropriations. The Finance Committee recommends the following:

"Be it resolved that FY 12 General Government Capital Projects be increased \$5,000, and the same be appropriated, and that revenue from donations be recognized in the same amount, all for the purposes of constructing a dog park."

"Be it resolved that FY 12 School Capital expenditures be increased \$21,034, the same be appropriated, and revenue from the Town of Berryville be recognized in the same amount, all for the purpose of providing an upsizing of the waterline requested by the town (\$18,400) and receipt of a refund by the town for engineering costs related to the booster pump station (\$2,634).

"Be it resolved that FY 12 budgeted expenditures for the Registrar be increased \$4,652, the same appropriated, and that revenue from the Commonwealth be recognized in the same amount, all for the purpose of funding expenses resulting from March and June primaries."

#### 2. FY 13 Supplemental Appropriations. The Finance Committee recommends the following:

A. In the early stages of the FY 13 budget process the FY 12 School budgets were used as a proxy for FY 13 in the Government's budget document, while the Board of Supervisors awaited final action by the School Board. When the School Board budget was adopted, and the Government's budget was updated with it, federal ARRA revenue of \$52,010, which would cease to be available in FY 13, was inadvertently not deleted from FY 13. The result is an understatement of the budget deficit by this amount, and the action to correct it is as follows:

"Be it resolved that the FY 13 School Capital Projects Fund federal revenue estimate be decreased by \$52,000, and local transfer to that fund increased in the same amount, to correct an error in the original budget for that fund, and be it further resolved that the General Fund Balance Designation for School Capital/Debt be reduced by \$52,000."

B. On June 11, the School Board adopted a resolution requesting approval of a supplemental appropriation to the FY 13 Budget of \$136,014, to be funded from carryover currently held as a General Fund balance designation. The funds would be utilized for the purposes listed on the attachment.

"Be it resolved that the FY 13 School Capital Projects Fund and School Operating Fund be increased \$40,000 and \$92,543, respectively, and the same be appropriated, for the various purposes listed in the attachment, and be it further resolved that the General Fund Balance designation for school carryover be reduced \$136,014."

- 3. **Virginia Retirement System resolution.** During the budget process the Board agreed to pay the full actuarial rate for VRS retirement, and to immediately implement employee payment of the full member share. Since then, the VRS has requested that we adopt formal resolutions to these ends. These proposed resolutions are attached. Adoption of these resolutions is recommended by the Finance Committee.
- 4. Acceptance of May Bills and Claims. The Finance Committee recommends acceptance of this report.
- 5. **Standing Reports.** The following are included: Reconciliation of Appropriations. General Fund Balance. General Fund Expenditure Summary. General Government Capital Projects.

Recent legislation calls for localities to make certain decisions by July 1, 2012 regarding employer and member retirement contributions. These include:

- Election/certification by your local governing body of your employer retirement contribution rate for 2012-2014, using one of the options allowed in the 2012 Appropriation Act, Item 468(H). We will keep you apprised of any amendments that would change these options.
- ➤ Election/certification by your local governing body of the member contribution your current employees will be required to pay beginning July 1, 2012 and the corresponding salary increase, as provided in Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (Senate Bill 497).

I am pleased to provide you this resolution packet to assist you and your local governing body in the election process for these contributions. Your packet includes:

- Resolutions to be completed and returned to VRS
- Copy of Item 468(H)
- Copy of Chapter 822 (SB 497)

#### Resolution 1: Employer Retirement Contribution Rate Election

By no later than July 1, 2012, your local governing body must approve one of the following employer contribution rate options for the defined benefit retirement plan in the biennium beginning July 1, 2012:

- 12.14% the rate certified by the VRS Board of Trustees for the 2012-2014 biennium; or
- <u>8.80%</u> the alternate rate, which is the higher of the current rate certified by the VRS Board for FY 2011-2012 or 70 percent of the VRS Board-certified rate for 2012-2014.

As a reminder, effective July 1, 2012, your contribution rates for Group Life Insurance and the Health Insurance Credit, as applicable, are:

- <u>1.19%</u> Group Life Insurance
- N/A Health Insurance Credit

#### Considerations in Electing Your Contribution Rate

The intent of the language in the 2012 Appropriation Act, Item 468(H), is to offer localities and schools some budget relief for the coming fiscal year with respect to the amount of their retirement contributions. However, this does not change the Board-certified rate or the Annual Required Contribution (ARC). Therefore, if you are considering using the Alternate Rate, please be aware that doing so will:

- Reduce contributions to your employer account and the investment earnings they would have generated, which will mean there will be fewer assets available for benefits.
- Result in a lower funded ratio when the next Actuarial Valuation is performed and, thus, a higher calculated contribution rate at that time.
- Require that you include the Net Pension Obligation (NPO) under GASB Standards in the notes to your financial statements.

#### **Resolution 2: Member Contribution Election**

As provided under Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB 497), all Plan 1 and Plan 2 school division and political subdivision employees must begin paying the 5 percent member contribution effective July 1, 2012. All employees hired on or after July 1, 2012 must pay the full 5 percent upon employment with no phase-in allowed. For current employees, the bill allows governing bodies to phase in the member contribution in each of the next five years or until current employees are paying the full 5 percent contribution, whichever is earlier. Phase-in increases must be in whole percentages of at least 1 percent of creditable compensation per year, with comparable offsetting salary increases.

By no later than July 1, 2012, your local governing body must approve the amount of the member contribution that current employees will pay beginning July 1. Your governing body also must certify that employees will receive a comparable offsetting salary increase effective July 1 of each year of the phase-in period.

#### **Deadline for Resolutions**

VRS must receive formal signed resolutions for the employer retirement contribution rate election and the member contribution election by no later than July 10, 2012.

### Member Contributions by Salary Reduction for Counties, Cities, Towns, and Other Political Subdivisions

(In accordance with Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497))

### Resolution

WHEREAS, the Clarke County 55121 employees who are Virginia Retirement System members who commence or recommence employment on or after July 1, 2012 ("FY2013 Employees" for purposes of this resolution), shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation by salary reduction pursuant to Internal Revenue Code § 414(h) on a pre-tax basis upon commencing or recommencing employment; and

WHEREAS, the Clarke County 55121 employees who are Virginia Retirement System members and in service on June 30, 2012, shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation by salary reduction pursuant to Internal Revenue Code § 414(h) on a pre-tax basis no later than July 1, 2016; and

WHEREAS, such employees in service on June 30, 2012, shall contribute a minimum of an additional one percent of their creditable compensation beginning on each July 1 of 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016, or until the employees' contributions equal five percent of creditable compensation; and

WHEREAS, the Clarke County 55121 may elect to require such employees in service on June 30, 2012, to contribute more than an additional one percent each year, in whole percentages, until the employees' contributions equal five percent of creditable compensation; and

WHEREAS, the second enactment clause of Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497) requires an increase in total creditable compensation, effective July 1, 2012, to each such employee in service on June 30, 2012, to offset the cost of the member contributions, such increase in total creditable compensation to be equal to the difference between five percent of the employee's total creditable compensation and the percentage of the member contribution paid by such employee on January 1, 2012.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Clarke County 55121 does hereby certify to the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees that it shall effect the implementation of the member contribution requirements of Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497) according to the following schedule for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012 (i.e., FY2013):

(Note: Each row must add up to 5 percent.); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such contributions, although designated as member contributions, are to be made by the Clarke County in lieu of member contributions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pick up member contributions shall be paid from the same source of funds as used in paying the wages to affected employees; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that member contributions made by the Clarke County under the pick up arrangement shall be treated for all purposes other than income taxation, including but not limited to VRS benefits, in the same manner and to the same extent as member contributions made prior to the pick up arrangement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing herein shall be construed so as to permit or extend an option to VRS members to receive the pick up contributions made by the Clarke County directly instead of having them paid to VRS; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that notwithstanding any contractual or other provisions, the wages of each member of VRS who is an employee of the Clarke County shall be reduced by the amount of member contributions picked up by the Clarke County on behalf of such employee pursuant to the foregoing resolutions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the officers of Clarke County 55121 are hereby authorized and directed in the name of the Clarke County to carry out the provisions of this resolution, and said officers of the Clarke County are authorized and directed to pay over to the Treasurer of Virginia from time to time such sums as are due to be paid by the Clarke County for this purpose.

#### VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY -- 2012 RECONVENED SESSION

#### **CHAPTER 822**

An Act to amend and reenact § 51.1-144 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Virginia Retirement System employee contributions; local employees; school board employees.

[S 497]

#### Approved April 18, 2012

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § 51.1-144 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 51.1-144. Member contributions.

A. Each member shall contribute five percent of his creditable compensation for each pay period for

which he receives compensation.

The employer shall deduct the contribution payable by the member. Every employee accepting employment shall be deemed to consent and agree to any deductions from his compensation required by this chapter. No deduction shall be taken from the compensation of a member after his normal retirement date if the member elects not to contribute.

B. In determining the creditable compensation of a member in a payroll period, the Board may consider the rate of compensation payable to the member on the date of entry or removal of his name from the payroll as having been received throughout the month if service for the month is creditable. If service for the month is not creditable, the Board may consider any compensation payable during the month as not being creditable compensation.

C. The minimum compensation provided by law for any member shall be reduced by the deduction required by this section. Except for any benefits provided by this chapter, payment of compensation minus the deductions shall be a full and complete discharge of all claims for services rendered by the

member during the period covered by the payment.

D. No deduction shall be made from any member's compensation if the employer's contribution is in default.

E. The Board may modify the method of collecting the contributions of members so that the employer may retain the amounts deducted from members' salaries and have a corresponding amount

deducted from state funds otherwise payable to the employer.

F. 1. Except as provided in subdivision subdivisions 2 3 and 4, any employer may elect to pay an equivalent amount in lieu of all member contributions required of its employees. Such payments shall be credited to the members' contribution account. These contributions shall not be considered wages for purposes of Chapter 7 (§ 51.1-700 et seq.) of this title, nor shall they be considered to be salary for purposes of this chapter.

2. A person who becomes a member on or after July 1, 2010, shall be required to pay member contributions on a salary reduction basis in accordance with § 414(h) of the Internal Revenue Code in the amount of five percent of creditable compensation if the person is (i) a member covered by the defined benefit plan established under this chapter, (ii) a member of the State Police Officers' Retirement System under Chapter 2 (§ 51.1-200 et seq.), (iii) a member of the Virginia Law Officers' Retirement System under Chapter 2.1 (§ 51.1-211 et seq.), (iv) a member of the Judicial Retirement System under

Chapter 3 (§ 51.1-300 et seq.), or (v) earning the benefits permitted by § 51.1-138.

Each county, city, town, local public school board, or other local employer may elect to pay an equivalent amount in lieu of the member contributions required of its employees described in this subdivision. The county, city, town, local public school board, or other local employer may pay, in whole percentages, up to five percent of the creditable compensation otherwise required of such employees, provided that the employer pays the same percentage of creditable compensation for all such employees, and is paying all member contributions required under this section for all of its other member employees not described in this subdivision. Any portion of the five percent of creditable compensation required of a person who becomes a member on or after July 1, 2010, that is not paid by the county, city, town, local public school board, or other local employer, shall be paid by such person.

No employer other than a county, city, town, local public school board, or other local employer shall be allowed to elect to pay any amount of the member contributions required of a person who becomes a

member on or after July 1, 2010.

3. A member who is an employee of a county, city, town, or other local employer other than a local public school board, regardless of whether the member is a person who becomes a member on or after July 1, 2010, shall be required to pay member contributions on a salary reduction basis in accordance with § 414(h) of the Internal Revenue Code in the amount of five percent of creditable compensation as follows: (i) any member who commences or recommences employment on or after July 1, 2012, shall be required to contribute five percent of his creditable compensation upon commencing or recommencing

employment and (ii) members in service on June 30, 2012, shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation no later than July 1, 2016. Such member described in subdivision (ii) shall contribute a minimum of an additional one percent of his creditable compensation beginning on each July 1 of 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016, or until the member's contribution equals five percent of creditable compensation, but the county, city, town, or other local employer other than a local public school board may elect to require members to contribute more than an additional one percent each year, in whole percentages. In no case shall a member be required to contribute more than five percent of his creditable compensation for each pay period for which he receives compensation. No county, city, town, or other local employer other than a local public school board shall be allowed to elect to pay any amount of member contributions except to pay the difference between five percent and the employee contribution during the phase-in period described in this subdivision for a member who was in service on June 30, 2012.

4. A member who is an employee of a local public school board, regardless of whether the member is a person who becomes a member on or after July 1, 2010, shall be required to pay member contributions on a salary reduction basis in accordance with § 414(h) of the Internal Revenue Code in the amount of five percent of creditable compensation as follows: (i) any member who commences or recommences employment on or after July 1, 2012, shall be required to contribute five percent of his creditable compensation upon commencing or recommencing employment and (ii) members in service on June 30, 2012, shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation no later than July 1, 2016. Such member described in subdivision (ii) shall contribute a minimum of an additional one percent of his creditable compensation beginning on each July 1 of 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016, or until the member's contribution equals five percent of creditable compensation, but the local public school board employer may elect to require members to contribute more than an additional one percent each year, in whole percentages. In no case shall a member be required to contribute more than five percent of his creditable compensation for each pay period for which he receives compensation. No local public school board employer shall be allowed to elect to pay any amount of member contributions except to pay the difference between five percent and the employee contribution during the phase-in period described in this subdivision for a member who was in service on June 30, 2012.

3. 5. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section or other law, only those employers who were paying member contributions as of February 1, 2010, may pay member contributions. The provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to a county, city, town, local public school board, or other

local employer.

G. Subject to the provisions of subsection F, any employer whose employees are paying member contributions to the retirement system on a salary reduction basis in accordance with § 414(h) of the Internal Revenue Code may phase in the payment of the member contributions on behalf of its employees upon notification to the Board of the employer's intent to make such payments. The Board shall approve the period of time by which the phase in shall be completed not to exceed six years from the commencement of the phased in payments.

H. Any employer that, by resolution of its governing body, elects to provide retirement coverage for its employees in accordance with § 51.1-130 on or after September 1, 1998, shall allow its employees to pay member contributions to the retirement system on a salary reduction basis in accordance with § 414(h) of the Internal Revenue Code in lieu of paying the member contribution on behalf of its

employees in accordance with the provisions of subsection F.

4. The Board may develop procedures to effect the transfer of member contributions paid by employers on or after July I, 1980, and accrued interest on those contributions, to the member contribution account of the member, if such contributions have been previously deposited into the

retirement allowance account of the employer.

2. That any county, city, town, local public school board, or other local employer that currently pays any portion of member contributions to the Virginia Retirement System that the member will be responsible for paying pursuant to the provisions of this act shall provide an increase in total creditable compensation, effective July 1, 2012, to each affected member who was in service on June 30, 2012, to offset the cost of the member contributions. Such increase in total creditable compensation shall be equal to the difference between five percent of an employee's total creditable compensation and the percentage of the member contribution paid by the local member on January 1, 2012. If a county, city, town, local public school board, or other local employer elects to phase in the member contributions pursuant to subdivision F 3 or F 4 of § 51.1-144 of the Code of Virginia, the increase in total creditable compensation may also be phased in at the same rate.

### 2012 Appropriation Act Item 468(H)

#### Central Appropriations Language

- "H.1. Except as authorized in Paragraph H.2. of this Item, rates paid to the VRS on behalf of employees of participating (i) counties, (ii) cities, (iii) towns, (iv) local public school divisions (only to the extent that the employer contribution rate is not otherwise specified in this act), and (v) other political subdivisions shall be based on the higher of: a) the contribution rate in effect for FY 2012, or b) seventy percent of the results of the June 30, 2011 actuarial valuation of assets and liabilities as approved by the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees for the 2012-14 biennium, eighty percent of the results of the June 30, 2013 actuarial valuation of assets and liabilities as approved by the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees for the 2014-16 biennium, ninety percent of the results of the June 30, 2015 actuarial valuation of assets and liabilities as approved by the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees for the 2016-18 biennium, one-hundred percent of the results of the June 30, 2017 actuarial valuation of assets and liabilities as approved by the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees for the 2018-20 biennium.
- 2. Rates paid to the VRS on behalf of employees of participating (i) counties, (ii) cities, (iii) towns, (iv) local public school divisions (only to the extent that the employer contribution rate is not otherwise specified in this act), and (v) other political subdivisions may, at each participating employers option, be based on the employer contribution rates certified by the Virginia Retirement System (VRS) Board of Trustees pursuant to § 51.1-145(I), Code of Virginia.
- 3. Every participating employer must certify to the board of the Virginia Retirement System by resolution adopted by its local governing body that it: has reviewed and understands the information provided by the Virginia Retirement System outlining the potential future fiscal implications of electing or not electing to utilize the employer contribution rates certified by the Virginia Retirement System (VRS) Board of Trustees, as provided for in paragraph H.2.
- 4. Prior to electing to utilize the employer contribution rates certified by the Virginia Retirement System (VRS) Board of Trustees, as authorized in paragraph H.2, local public school divisions must receive the concurrence of the local governing body. Such concurrence must be documented by a resolution of the governing body.
- 5. The board of the Virginia Retirement System shall provide all employers participating in the Virginia Retirement System with a summary of the implications inherent in the use of the employer contribution rates certified by the Virginia Retirement System (VRS) Board of Trustees set out in paragraph H.2, and the alternate employer contribution rates set out in paragraph H.1."

#### 1. Call To Order - Determination of Quorum

At 12:05 pm Michael Hobert called the meeting to order after determination that a quorum was present.

David Ash requested that reconsideration of meeting time be added to the agenda.

### 2. Approval of Minutes

#### 3. FY13 Audit

Dave Ash and Dr. Murphy approved an award for the FY 12 Audit to Robinson, Farmer, Cox. Mr. Ash and Dr. Murphy also recommend that Joint Administrative Services explore options for fraud detection and prevention.

Tom Judge provided the following update:

- Two proposals received.
- One vendor did not meet the requirements leaving Robinson, Farmer, Cox as the sole consideration.
- Fraud detection and prevention recommendations were requested in the RFP.
- While no specific fraudulent activities are currently suspected, the County must be open to the possibility of fraud and be vigilant in monitoring.
- Some focal areas suggested by staff include: fraudulent leave, time accounting, inventory control, financial transactions, pilfering.
- RFC noted that not all fraud runs through the financial books and fraud detection might be best conducted separately.
- RFC suggested researching the Association of Fraud Examiners.
- Upon review of the Association of Fraud Examiners website, Mr. Judge determined that staffing levels were not adequate to perform the extensive monitoring.
- Best deterrent is to establish policies and educate employees on those policies.
- A reporting hot line could be established.
- Policy clarification is the first step.
- Tom Judge put forth that establishment of personnel policies was the responsibility of the individual entities.
- Tom Judge offered to research areas of risk and make recommendations.

#### 4. Director Evaluation

The Job Description for this position is currently under review.

Mike Murphy and David Ash provided the following update:

- Have conducted several meetings.
- Review and revision of the job description to meet current responsibilities is planned for the next scheduled meeting.
- Following review and revision of the job description, evaluation will be conducted:
- To maintain consistency, will provide comment on goals established during last year's evaluation.

### 5. Technology Governance

A broad view plan, developed by the JAS Director and Technology Directors is attached. If approved it will be submitted to the respective governing bodies for review and support.

Tom Judge lead the review. Highlights of the discussion include:

RE: Conceptual Overview for Development of a Coordinated 10-Year County/School Technology Plan

The School Board and Board of Supervisors recently tasked the Joint Administrative Services Board with Technology Governance. The JAS Board has taken a first step toward fulfilling this obligation by requesting that its Director, and the two technology directors, work to develop an outline of a ten-year technology plan.

This plan is to be limited to areas of mutual benefit to the two organizations. Ten years was chosen for the term to encourage a long-term view, to encourage timely near-term actions to provide for future needs and, in particular, to include a replacement for the Comcast fiber lines connecting the Berryville buildings which will be needed by 2020.

Areas of mutual benefit that have thus far been identified include:

- 1. The need to provide greater bandwidth across the wide area network, including the need to replace fiber optic cabling between buildings not currently owned.
- 2. The need to extend telephone, energy management, and building security systems across the wide area network.
- 3. The need to provide for video conferencing and document management systems across the wide area network.

- 4. The need to plan for upgrading network switching devices.
- 5. The implementation of the Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system that would integrate administrative software.
- 6. The need to provide for information security including threats from outside the network, within the network, and data backup on multiple sites.
- 7. Development of shared data storage facilities.
- 8. Development of software operating system "virtualization", a technique for running many software applications on a single computer.
- 9. Shared training opportunities, and a regular schedule of training.

These various components are interdependent so it is important to identify the timing and financing of projects so that all systems are fully functional when implemented. The table on the following page presents an initial overview of the plan. Much work remains on the cost and timing of the projects, as well as the best technology direction for Government and Schools over the period. Approval of the Joint Board's work at this conceptual stage is requested.

- Highlights of Board review of the planned technology events list include:
  - Purchase Franchise fiber infrastructure: change to read Fiber "Data" Infrastructure.
  - Energy Management Systems monitoring and controls are waiting on repairs to the BCCGC HVAC, as well as transfer to the new high school.
  - Telephone System:
    - Major system upsize and upgrade since original installation.
    - System sized large enough for all the instruments needed for the foreseeable future.
    - Dr. Murphy noted that he would like to plan accordingly so that every handset registers the individual number in the Communications Center.
  - Building Security Systems:
    - BCCGC security system has been designed but not yet implemented.

- Systems in place in the old and new high schools and Johnson Williams Middle School.
- E911 building was designed for a security system. Limited grant funds were used to procure monitors. Head-end equipment is still needed to process incoming video and sensor information. Chairman Hobert requested follow up.
- Legal counsel is working with School Administration on the legal issue of who owns student data.
- Consideration of system integration of fire alarms, burglar alarms, etc. is necessary at the front end of facility design projects.
- Document Management System:
  - Identified in the GFOA report as a priority.
  - A long-term plan is needed for both the Schools and General Government.
  - Include email archiving system.
- Video conferencing is not considered a priority; however, this item was added to ensure availability of the necessary bandwidth.
- o Information security is not a specific device or piece of software; however, this item was noted to ensure security consideration.

#### o ERP

- May be more "doable" if phased in; however, GFOA warned against a piece-meal approach.
- If parceled out over time, the broad view may be lost.
- Any time purchase of enterprise software is considered it should be looked at collaboratively.
- System training allows users to maximize productivity and is critical for long-term success.
- Next steps:
  - Share Conceptual Overview with respective governing bodies during the monthly Joint Administrative Services update; and,
  - Request approval of the Joint Board's work at this conceptual stage.
  - After receiving general consensus approval, the Joint Administrative Services Board will:
    - Prioritize the technology events list.
    - Review the events individually and identify those things that need to be addressed or considered to move the item along.

By consensus the Board agreed to move the plan forward to their respective bodies for consideration, approval and feedback.

#### 6. Purchase of New Software

Procurement of new transportation management and timesheet tracking software are planned by the School System. These should be discussed by the Board in terms of possible joint use, as well as the long-term plan to implement an ERP system.

Mike Murphy led the review. Highlights include:

- Transportation Management Software:
  - Current transportation software does not work.
  - Believe there are a lot of efficiencies from use of adequate transportation software.
  - This system has been extensively researched by school staff.
  - This software is used by small up to large schools divisions,
  - o Have not begun to look at the procurement process.
- Time Sheet tracking software:
  - Making a significant change in hourly accounting for enterprise fund employees [food service.] [Enterprise fund means that revenue and expenditure must be balanced.]
  - Paper time sheets are a challenge division wide.
  - Approximately 100 plus employees have paper time sheets. [Bus drivers, food service, maintenance personnel are paper time sheet driven.]
  - Time sheets are not used by exempt employees. [Teachers and Administrators]
  - Veri-time was selected from the programs reviewed.
  - o Implementation would eliminate paper time sheets, manual data entry errors and should provide greater control of over time.
  - Use of comp time instead of over time is regulated by law and is different from flex time.
    - Schools use AESOP for leave accounting; but Joint Administrative Services does not have the ability to import the data, so a paper report is sent generated.
    - Full-time, year-round School employees use AESOP for leave: annual, personal, sick, to assist schools, bereavement, etc.
    - AESOP is a web-based tracking program.
  - Time sheet tracking will start with food service workers.
  - System will eventually be used by all non-exempt employees.
  - Goal is to have in place by the beginning of the next school year.
  - The Veri-time system could be used by Schools and General Government non-exempt employees.

 Tom Judge noted that this system would become redundant following ERP implementation; but, it could be years before an ERP is implemented and the software cost \$3,000.

### Reconsideration of Meeting Time

Due to repeated schedule conflicts, David Ash suggested changing the start time for the Joint Administrative Services Board meetings from 12:00 noon to 1:00 p.m.

By consensus, the Board agreed to change the regular meeting start time from 12:00 noon to 1:00 p.m.

### 7. Next Meeting

The next regularly scheduled meeting is set for Monday, June 25, 2012 at 1:00 p.m. in Meeting Room AB at the Berryville Clarke County Government Center.

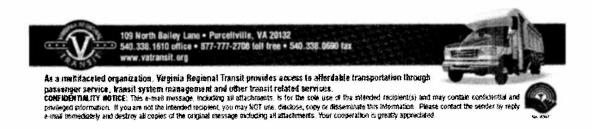
