The reason for this letter is to follow-up on the current ownership and responsibility of the White Post Historical Marker located in the middle of intersection of route 628 and route 658 there at White Post VA. It is also worth mentioning that this post was recognized by the Virginia State Commission on Conservation and Development in 1929 and then with a State Historical Marker in 1997. As the post has historical significance and predates the founding of this Country and the fact that it was to have originally been set in place by then Surveyor George Washington as a reference for then Lord Fairfax of Virginia and has been maintained by the Community of White Post since that time and later with the help of the Clarke County Historical Society it is the intent at this time to firm up or ascertain the responsibility of said post from here on. Seeing that the post was located in the same location before and since the Byrd Act of 1932 which incorporated the then County roads of the Commonwealth into the State Highway system and since the County had the responsibility of thus said Secondary Road system as to its improvements it is felt that it would be in the best interest if the County maintained ownership of said post and that the Clarke County Historical Society would be the logical resource to determine the need and frequency of repairs along with responsibility of maintenance and repair should the need arise from damage from some outside source i.e. vehicular accident , vandalism etc and that such repairs would be carried out in a way so as to protect the historical significance and that said repairs would also be done in accordance with the VA Land Use Manual.

1) Call to Order

Chairman Hobert called the afternoon session to order at 1:02 p.m.

2) Adoption of Agenda

By consensus, the Board approved the agenda as prepared.

3) VDOT

Ed Carter, Assistant Residency Administrator, appeared before the Board to provide the monthly update.

#### Maintenance – November:

- Completed secondary route mowing;
- Cleaned up after "Sandy" and regraded damaged non-hard surfaced roads;
- Cleaned up park & ride on Rt. 50;
- Surfaced box culvert on Rt. 622;
- Installed new pipe on Rt. 605 at pump station;
- Cut brush at intersection Rt.7/604, along Rt. 604, 606, 636 and 649 to address issues raised by school bus drivers.

#### Maintenance – December:

- Mow entire width Rt. 340 from Berryville to Rt. 522;
- Perform shoulder repair on various primaries;
- Clean box culvert on Rt. 606 bridge crew to evaluate erosion issue;
- Continue addressing issues raised by school bus drivers.

#### **Projects**

- Rt. 636, Mosby Rd. Project complete except for street lights and minor touch up. Scheduling meeting with Town/County to discuss opening and maintenance responsibilities.
- Rt. 1014, Paige St. Town of Berryville Bid came in higher that allotted funds. Town of Berryville committed to make up difference so project could be awarded.
- Turning Lanes Rt. 657/340 Preliminary Engineering is in progress.
- Rt. 633, Annfield Rd. Traffic Engineering is evaluating recommended signage placement.
- VDOT Route 612 (Shepherds Mill Road) Bridge Replacement Mr. Carter has passed along citizen concerns and desire to keep this a single-lane bridge.

#### **Supervisor Comments:**

- Supervisor Staelin:
  - Senseny Road / Route 340:
    - VDOT received petition
    - A map of wells in the area was provided.
- Supervisor McKay:
  - Route 624 Red Gate Road Bridge Replacement: Mr. Carter will check timing.

- Supervisor Byrd
  - Recapped Lewisville Road status from discussion at the November 14 Work Session.
  - Commended VDOT for the prompt removal of deer carcasses.
- Vice Chair Weiss
  - Parshall Road: shoulders on both sides the entire length of the road are deteriorating and in need of repair.

#### 4) Clarke County Public Schools Update

Jim Brinkmeier and Chip Schutte, Clarke County School Board members, and Dr. Mike Murphy, Superintendent, with Rick Catlett, Assistant Superintendent, appeared before the Supervisors to provide the monthly School update. Highlights include:

- Jim Brinkmeier, Berryville District School Board Member:
  - Distributed four sheets with floor plans from RRMM Architects.
  - School Board selected Option D.
  - Construction is planned in two phases.
  - Phase I is estimated at \$7.2MM.
    - Old high school will be PreK to 3 grade.
    - Cooley will be used for grades 4 and 5.
  - The School Board hopes to complete Phase II in five years as debt service allows.
  - Children will be in properly sized classrooms.
  - Construction will eliminate trailers.
  - Phase I out for bid June / July 2013 depending on approvals.
  - Construction schedule is 10 to 11 months; to be completed by fall 2014.
  - Phase I A: Administration move in to Primary until debt service available to enter Phase II construction.
  - Phase II anticipated to begin 2017 depending on conditions and debt service.
  - o Primary School:
    - Continue using until all children are relocated to the renovated school.
    - Anticipate using this space to house Administration once the old high school is converted to pre-K through grade 5 in phase II.
    - Anticipate beginning renovations in 2014 after the children are moved.
    - Architect estimates renovation cost to be \$800.000.

- Renovations are necessary to make it ADA compliant and to add an elevator.
- Renovations may increase the property value.
- Supervisor Byrd asked about the process if Primary were to be sold.

Tom Judge responded that the property would be turned back to the Board of Supervisors; and when sold, the funds would go back into the general fund not back to the Schools.

- Chip Schutte, White Post School Board Member
  - Stormwater management:
    - Met with architect over a two-day period
    - Stormwater will be designed and approved up front for both Phase I and Phase II construction projects.
    - Large storm drains are in place on Ramsburg Lane.
    - Credit for the removal of impervious surfaces [mobile classrooms] is unknown.
    - Jim Brinkmeier added that the architect had been told to hold off on any further action pending approval of the stormwater plan.
  - Construction Budget Discussion Highlights:
    - Vice Chairman Weiss stated that he was uncomfortable spending all \$7.2MM on one phase of construction when several firms have said that all the renovations could be done for that amount.

Chip Schutte responded that he and the Schools' architect had read these reports but these were only feasibility studies. Now, the architects were planning actual renovations. He opined that the Schools felt it had stripped the renovation project to the bone. He also pointed out that the furnace in the old high school had to be replaced having reached its maximum life.

Vice Chairman Weiss countered that furnace replacement was included in previous reports. He opined that the millions of additional dollars to be spent were not adding up and asked for specifics such as changes to space or programming needs.

Jim Brinkmeier added that he, too, had questioned the increase and had been told that the previous reports were feasibility studies that were not all inclusive. He stated that RRMM had assured the School Board that its design would address everything needed for the renovation; and while he was not 100% certain, he believed these assertions, for there must be trust and RRMM was respected across the state.

Supervisor McKay opined that he did not feel that trust in the meetings he had attended. He further noted that the Virginia Department of Education had indicated that \$7.2MM was sufficient for the renovations.

 Supervisor McKay asked if the two architectural firms that indicated all renovations could accomplished for \$7.2MM had bid on the project.

Jim Brinkmeier responded that he did not know having recused himself during process. He stated that an RFP had been sent out; and after reviewing all responses, the School Board had selected RRMM.

 Supervisor Byrd added her observations from the School Board meetings. She stated that the architect was actually talking about renovating two schools and possibly Primary. She noted that RRMM's architect had repeatedly asked them to keep an open mind. She stated that she did not entirely agree with RRMM.

Jim Brinkmeier put forward that the School Board wanted to make sure that it continued to be open and communicative with all involved groups.

• Chairman Hobert reiterated there were many people in the community that were not aware of the scope of the changes and what the plan is for moving forward with the renovations. He noted that only in the last thirty days had the School Board presented its current plan with a phased approach that assumes funding will be available. He suggested that the Schools perform a more thorough analysis particularly if it continued to consider moving Administration into Primary. He commented that once on course there would be no room for project creep and encouraged the School Board to keep communications with the community open and often.

#### Rick Catlett:

- Handout FTE [full-time equivalent employee] Comparison
- Membership has been relatively flat over the last few years.
  - Oct 2011: 2.034 full time students:
  - Oct. 2012: 2,048 increase of 14 students.
  - Total membership includes part-time students
  - Overall decrease of 6 students.
  - 163 homeschooled students in Clarke County.
- Supervisor Comments:
  - Supervisor Staelin: With the current economic environment, all general governments are operating with reduced staffing. The Schools, with a smaller student base, have increased staffing. He reminded that the Schools were now considering using the entire available balance of \$7.2MM for just one phase of construction and planning a second phase adding additional construction debt. He suggested that the Schools focus on ways it might better address the economic environment and reduce spending.

 Supervisor Byrd commented on the extra positions added for special education and asked if these positions were state mandated.

Dr. Murphy responded that there were at several factors. Standards of quality are mandated by the state; the Individualized Education Program is agreed upon by the parent and the school and is the largest driver in the special needs process.

 Supervisor McKay asked what measures the Schools were taking to improve test scores.

Mr. Catlett replied that a response would require a detailed presentation, which he was not prepared to address today.

#### Dr. Murphy:

- A survey process is under review.
- Could institute an exit survey at graduation.
- Could institute this process with the class of 2013.
- Data would be gathered over time.
- Want to establish an expectation with students that the school will contact them for a progress update around May of the following year.
- Will work with the alumni association.
- Supervisor McKay suggested adding "Joining the Military" to Question 1 What area do you plan to pursue immediately after high school?
- Supervisor Staelin encouraged the Schools to look at what is being done in other jurisdictions. Dr. Murphy responded that the survey he is proposing was used by another school in the Commonwealth.

#### 5) Citizens Comment Period

<u>Wendy Kedzierski</u>, Lord Fairfax Highway, Berryville, VA 22611, noting that she had arrived late, stated that she had hoped to hear VDOT's presentation regarding Route 340 and Senseny Road and to confirm receipt of the petition signed by she and other affected parties.

Chairman Hobert advised that VDOT had confirmed receipt of their petition.

Supervisor Staelin informed the affected citizen present that he had provided VDOT with a GIS map showing wells in the area. He added that VDOT was updating plans and doing everything it could to lessen impact to the east.

Note: In addition to Ms. Kedzierski, Former Supervisor Ben Longerbeam, and two others, also attended the meeting in support of the Route 340 / Senseny Road petition.

<u>David Steigmaier</u>, Community Outreach representative for Congressman Wolf, stated that that a summary of this meeting would be in his next report to the Congressman.

Robina Rich Bouffault, White Post, Planning Commissioner: commented on the replacement of the bridge crossing the Opequon opining that the current single-lane bridge served to calm traffic and that making this a two-line bridge was a bad idea.

#### **Easement Donation**

The Clarke County Easement Authority has approved the following easements for donation. The Authority requests the Board of Supervisors to authorize the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors to execute deeds, easements, and other documents necessary to the transactions, subject to the property owners and lenders signing the Deed prior to the Chair.

**James Turner** - James Turner has applied to the easement authority for approval of three easement donations. Mr. Turner owns 3 parcels; two are listed under the corporation MFR Company, L.C. and the other he co-owns with his brother John Turner.

The property is south of Route 50 near the Warren County line above Shenandoah Farms. The 3 parcels are currently vacant woodland and have a total of 11 DURs. The applicant wishes to retain 1 DUR on each parcel retiring a total of 8 DURs. The parcels are zoned FOC and are in land use. All 3 parcels meet 3 of the 4 criteria. All are larger than 40 acres, all scored over 35, and all will retire at least 1 DUR, non are adjacent to an existing easement. At their regular meeting held October 17th, 2012, on motion of Mr. Engel, seconded by Ms. Thomas, the Authority unanimously gave preliminary approval for the donation.

#### Modification of Gift of Deed of Easement – Powhatan School

A Deed of Easement was recorded on property gifted to Powhatan School in 2011. Two perennial streams, Roseville Run and Spout Run, separate the main school property from the eased property. The original Deed of Easement specified that a vehicular bridge could be located at the southeastern part of the property and that two existing bridges could only be used as foot bridges. The School requested that one of the foot bridges be permitted for use for vehicular access. The main reason for the request is that the school needs access for tractors and other such equipment in order to construct the permitted trails so that the students have more access to the eased property. In addition the school expressed concerns regarding safety and the ability to extract students or other persons who might be injured on the property.

One of the two pedestrian bridges had previously been used for vehicles so that the construction impact would be minimal. Any conversion of the bridge would require an amendment to the Deed of Easement. The Easement Authority conducted a site visit and approved the amendment allowing for the bridge conversion at their July 2012 meeting. The Powhatan School board also approved the proposed amendment. The draft amendment was prepared by Mr. Robert Mitchell (attached). As the County is a signatory on the Deed of Easement, the Board of Supervisors must also approve and authorize signature of the amendment.

#### MODIFICATION OF DEED OF GIFT OF EASEMENT

THIS MODIFICATION OF DEED OF GIFT OF EASEMENT, dated the \_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2012, is by and between POWHATAN SCHOOL, party of the first part, a Virginia nonstock corporation ("Powhatan School"), and the COUNTY OF CLARKE, VIRGINIA ("County"), and the CLARKE COUNTY CONSERVATION EASEMENT AUTHORITY ("Authority"), parties of the second part.

WHEREAS, by Deed of Gift of Easement dated June 3, 2011, and recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Clarke County, Virginia in Deed Book 535 at Page 817, Agnes C. Brengle, Constance B. Crocker, and Isabelle C. Osborne ("Brengle, Crocker, and Osborne") conveyed a Conservation Easement ("Easement") to the County and the Authority on a parcel containing 46.8384 acres in Clarke County, Virginia, as described therein ("the Property"); and

WHEREAS, by Deed of Gift and Deed of Boundary Line Adjustment and Merger dated June 2, 2011, and recorded in the aforesaid Clerk's Office in Deed Book 535 at Page 842, Brengle, Crocker, and Osborne conveyed the Property to Powhatan School, subject to the Easement; and

WHEREAS, Powhatan School, the County, and the Authority desire to modify Paragraph 6 of Section II of the Easement regarding provisions for a riparian buffer; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Authority find the modification to be consistent with the conservation and open-space purposes of the Easement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby modify and replace Paragraph 6 of Section II of the Easement to provide as follows:

**6. RIPARIAN BUFFER.** To protect water quality, a 100-foot buffer strip shall be maintained in forest or be permitted to revegetate naturally along each edge of the Roseville Run and the west edge of Spout Run, as measured from the top of the bank. (Where there is less than 100 feet between the east edge of Roseville Run and the east boundary of the Property, the entire distance from the east edge of Roseville Run and the east boundary of the Property shall be a buffer strip.) Within this buffer strip there shall be (a) no buildings or other substantial structures constructed; (b) no storage of compost, manure, fertilizers, chemicals, machinery, or equipment; (c) no removal of trees except removal of invasive species or removal of dead, diseased, or dying trees or trees posing an imminent human health or safety hazard; and (d) no cultivation or other earth-disturbing activity, except as may be reasonably necessary for (i) either wetland or stream bank restoration or erosion control, pursuant to a government permit, (ii) fencing along or within the buffer area; (iii) construction and maintenance of stream crossings that do not obstruct water flow: (iv) creation and maintenance of foot or horse trails with unimproved surfaces; and (v) dam construction to create ponds. Limited mowing to control non-native species or protect trees and other plants planted in forested buffers is permitted. Livestock shall be excluded from the riparian buffer strip, except for one stream access for watering. Stream access shall be constructed in accordance with current Department of Conservation and Recreation Agricultural Best Management Practices for a "hardened crossing" for the purpose of providing a stabilized area for access to the stream for livestock watering. Notwithstanding the foregoing, and except as provided above for livestock access, (i) stream crossings of Roseville Run shall be limited to two crossings in the location of the existing foot bridges across Roseville Run; one bridge shall remain as a foot bridge, and the other may be improved for access of tractors or other equipment as needed for maintenance, construction, and stream restoration, with bridge materials consisting of metal I-beam supports with wood planks for the travel surface and wood hand rails, (ii) access paths to the bridges across Roseville Run shall remain in their present location, or, if changed, shall be approximately perpendicular to Roseville Run, shall not exceed twelve (12) feet in width, and shall remain pervious (unpaved), and (iii) a stream crossing for Spout Run shall be limited to one bridge and one access path over the riparian buffer for Spout Run, which shall be in the location of the

existing 30 foot private right of way shown on the boundary line adjustment plat referenced in paragraph 2.B., above.

In all other respects the aforesaid Deed of Gift of Easement dated June 3, 2011 remains in full force and effect.

Dear Mr. Hobert:

We have reviewed the Commonwealth collections and remittances ofthe Treasurer, Commissioner of the Revenue, and Sheriff of the locality indicated for the year ended June 30, 2012. Our primary objectives were to determine that the officials have maintained accountability over Commonwealth collections, established internal controls, and complied with state laws and regulations.

The results of our tests found the Treasurer, Commissioner of the Revenue, and Sheriff complied, in all material respects, with state laws, regulations and other procedures relating to the receipt, disbursement, and custody of state funds, except as follows.

The Treasurer did not maintain sufficient internal control over state funds as described below.

#### Perform Monthly Reconciliations

The Treasurer did not perform timely and adequate monthly reconciliations of the accounting records to the Commonwealth Accounting and Reporting System (CARS)

reports provided by the Department of Accounts. Timely monthly reconciliations are a significant internal control which is essential for determining the reliability of information.

The Treasurer should reconcile assessments, collections, and uncollected balances to CARS on a monthly basis as required by Section 58.1-3168 of the Code of Virginia and submit correction requests timely. Proper procedures will ensure complete and accurate recording of tax assessments and collections.

We discussed this comment with the Treasurer on October 22, 2012 and we acknowledge the cooperation extended to us during this review.

WHEREAS, the Industrial Development Authority of Clarke County, Virginia (the "Authority"), on November 14, 2012, adopted a resolution (the "Authority Resolution") authorizing the issuance and sale of its Educational Facilities Revenue Bonds, Series 2012, in a principal amount not to exceed \$9,000,000 (the "Bonds"), for the benefit of the Lord Fairfax Community College Educational Foundation, a not-for-profit Virginia non-stock corporation (the "Foundation"), to finance the costs of constructing, equipping, improving and developing a multi-purpose student union building, of approximately 31,800 gross square feet and consisting of two stories, to be located on an approximately 17.8-acre site north of, and adjacent to, the Lord Fairfax Community College main campus in Frederick County at 173 Skirmisher Lane, Middletown, Virginia 22645, together with a related parking lot of approximately 6,000 square feet, and roadways and sidewalks to access the site (collectively, the "Project");

WHEREAS, Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Internal Revenue Code") and Section 15.2-4906 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the "Virginia Code"), require that the governmental unit on whose behalf the Bonds are issued approve the issuance of such Bonds;

**WHEREAS**, Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code requires that any such approval by the applicable governmental unit be given after a public hearing following reasonable public notice, which hearing may be held by the public authority issuing the Bonds;

**WHEREAS**, on November 14, 2012, in accordance with the requirements of Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code and Section 15.2-4906 of the Virginia Code, the Authority held a public hearing and adopted the Authority Resolution approving the issuance of the Bonds;

WHEREAS, a copy of the Authority Resolution, a record of the public hearing and a fiscal impact statement with respect to the issuance of the Bonds have been filed with the Board of Supervisors (the "Board of Supervisors") of Clarke County, Virginia (the "County");

**WHEREAS**, the Foundation has requested the Board of Supervisors to approve the issuance of the Bonds to comply with Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code and with Section 15.2-4906 of the Virginia Code; and

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CLARKE COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

- 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby approves the issuance of the Bonds by the Authority for the benefit of the Foundation, as required by Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code and by Section 15.2-4906 of the Virginia Code.
- 2. The County having not previously issued in calendar year 2012 any tax-exempt obligations (not including "private activity bonds" other than "qualified 501(c)(3) bonds," as those terms are defined in the Code), which are required to be aggregated with obligations issued by the Authority for purposes of Section 265(b)(3)(B) of the Code, and the County and all its subordinate issuing entities or authorities (including the Authority) not reasonably expecting to issue in calendar year 2012 any other such obligations that, when aggregated with the Bonds, will be in excess of \$10,000,000, the County hereby concurs with the Authority's intention to designate the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" under Section 265(b)(3)(B) of the Code.
- 3. The approval of the issuance of the Bonds does not constitute an endorsement of the Bonds or the creditworthiness of the Foundation. As required by Section 15.2-4909 of the Virginia Code, the Bonds shall provide that the County will have no obligation to pay the Bonds or the interest thereon or other costs incident thereto.
- 4. All acts and doings of the officers of the County and the Board of Supervisors that are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this resolution shall be, and the same hereby are, in all respects approved and confirmed.
- 5. The Board of Supervisors' approval of the issuance of the Bonds is conditioned upon (a) the issuance of the Bonds by December 31, 2012, and (b) the adoption of a concurring resolution by the Board of Supervisors of Frederick County, Virginia.
- 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

This letter is in response to your letter dated October 18, 2012 to Mr. David Ash, Clarke County Administrator, regarding VDOT's initial environmental review for the proposed replacement of the Long Marsh Run Bridge located on Shepherds Mill Road. The County appreciates the opportunity to serve as a consulting party in the Section 106 review process for this project.

As indicated in your letter, the bridge is a contributing resource within the Long Marsh Rural National Historic District (1993), as documented by Maral Kalbian, architectural historian, the historical significance of the bridge in the nomination is as follows:

"The one-lane bridge over Long Marsh Run along Route 612 (21-967-17) is in highly unaltered condition (Photo 39). According to an inscription in the southwest corner of the parapet side, the concrete bridge was constructed in 1918, perhaps by R. E. Byrd and A. J. Ritter, two names that appear under the date. What is so unique about this otherwise common structure is the Latin inscription found on the outside west wall of the bridge that reads, "HOC SIGNO VINCES." This is translated as "In this sign thou shalt conquer," and makes reference to Emperor Constantine's vision that he would triumph if he converted to Christianity. Above the written inscription are two crossed sabres, symbols for sabres at rest. Given the fact that the bridge was constructed at the end of World War I, one can assume this inscription refers to America's victory."

In addition the County believes that the bridge may also be eligible for individual listing. This is based on the unusual features of the inscriptions on this otherwise typical early-20<sup>th</sup>-century, single-slab, single-lane concrete bridge, that may be unique enough to warrant eligibility for individual listing. Further research needs to be conducted on the inscriptions in order to determine the story behind them as well as confirm whether this feature is found on other bridges of this era in the Commonwealth.

An additional concern, not addressed in the October 18 letter is the potential disturbance of significant archeological resources. The bridge is adjacent to the Castleman-Taylor Mill site, and any disturbance should be preceded by an archaeological survey.

#### 2013 Legislative Priorities and Positions for Clarke County

Issue: State Tax Reform, Cost and Revenue Shifting and State Year-end Surplus Funds Clarke County calls upon the Commonwealth to restructure state income, sales and use taxes to address anachronistic tax policies. Tax reform is required to help buttress the Commonwealth's General Fund which finances most core government functions and must be stabilized to meet current and foreseeable core service demands. Failure to address this need has resulted in the unfair gradual shifting of costs and the outright reduction in aid to localities to balance the state budget. With each passing year Clarke County has been required to raise real estate taxes in order to incrementally subsidize a variety of traditionally state funded (or state shared) costs (Compensation Board, Registrar, Cooperative Extension, Line of Duty, Social Services and the court system for example). This cost shifting places a tremendous burden on a regressive real estate tax system. Cost shifting must stop and the tax system must be reformed to reduce the burden on the real estate tax. Action must be taken to restore "Aid to Localities".

At a minimum tax reform should meet the following criteria:

- Reduction of local dependence on the real estate tax.
- Offset any change that reduces or eliminates an existing local funding source by a new or expanded source. Clarke County opposes repeal of the machinery and tools tax or the BPOL tax unless such offset is guaranteed.
- Ensure equal taxing authority to towns, cities and counties.
- Protection of the commonwealth's general fund and preservation for core government functions such as public education, health and human services, public safety, natural resources and environmental services. Transportation maintenance and improvements should be paid by user fees.

Issue: Education Clarke County supports full funding by the Commonwealth of its

share of the true cost of K-12 public education without reducing other parts of the budget affecting local government or shifting costs from the Commonwealth to localities.

Issue: Transportation Transportation improvements should be funded by user fees, not the General Fund. Otherwise, funds will be effectively taken away from the funding of education, natural resources, etc.

Further, Clarke County does not support the devolution or cost shifting of transportation responsibilities to counties, especially smaller counties, like Clarke, that do not have the scale of work to allow for the efficient provision of services.

Issue: Groundwater Control by Locality

Clarke County supports legislation that would allow counties to prohibit installation of alternative onsite septic systems in environmentally sensitive areas such as karst terrain. Moreover, Clarke believes the inspectors (operators) of alternative systems (AOSS) should be required to both sample the effluent of their AOSS and submit a written report to the Health Department annually. In addition, each local Health Department should be required to make an annual random sample of 10% of the AOSS in their area.

Issue: Water Protection and Chesapeake Bay TMDL Clarke County supports action by the Commonwealth to ensure protection of groundwater, clean rivers, a clean Bay and a viable agricultural community. Clarke expects the Commonwealth to advance a supportable plan with adequate funding and/or regulations to protect our rivers, groundwater and the Bay at reasonable cost to farmers, towns and citizens.

Issue: Voting Districts

Clarke County requests the boundary line between House Districts 10 and 33 be revised to more closely align the local election Districts. This change would affect about 150 voters and would dramatically ease the burden on local election officials.

Issue: Growth Management

Clarke County believes that the authority to plan and regulate land use should remain with the local governing bodies and Clarke opposes any legislation that would weaken that authority.

Issue: Hunting

Clarke County believes the Commonwealth's hunting rules are fine the way they are and sees no reason to change them.

Issue: Wireless and Broadband Access

It is clear that Verizon Wireless, AT&T and the other internet, broadband and cellular providers will not provide wireless communication broadband service to rural areas unless they are given incentives or a mandate to do so. Clarke County

asks that the Commonwealth take steps to encourage or require rural access to modern broadband and cellular technology to rural areas just as was done years ago when electrical and telephone service became important technologies.

Issue: Sales Tax Collection from Outof-State Providers Clarke believes that in this modern era of Internet sales the Commonwealth should do everything it can to collect sales tax from as many Internet sales companies as possible.

#### 13) Finance Committee Items

Special Note: The Finance Committee completed items 1 and 2, below, at their meeting on November 14, and the balance of the finance agenda on November 16, subsequent to the publication of the board agenda. Application for Donation – Fred Hetzel Tax Map# 33-((6))-E, F, G & 33-((A))-32

The Clarke County Easement Authority has approved the following easement for donation. The Authority requests the Board of Supervisors to authorize the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors to execute deeds, easements, and other documents necessary to the transactions, subject to the property owners and lenders signing the Deed prior to the Chair.

Fred Hetzel, Glen Poe, Agent, has applied to the easement authority for approval of an easement donation. The property consists of approximately 70 acres on the east side of Blue Ridge Mountain Road, off of Ashley Woods Lane, approximately 3.7 miles south of Route 7. The property was subdivided in 2005. The lots remain vacant. The owner has decided to reconfigure the lots. He would like to merge 4 of the lots, each with one DUR, so as to create the 70 acre parcel with 1 DUR. The merger would occur immediately after the easement recordation so that the applicant can get tax credits for retiring 3 DURs (see attached map).

The parcel is zoned FOC and is in land use. Therefore the following guidelines for accepting properties for easement purchase are used:

- 1) the parcel's Property Resource Score is at least 35;
- 2) at least one dwelling unit right is extinguished by the conservation easement;
- 3) the parcel is adjacent to a parcel already under permanent conservation easement;
- 4) the property has a minimum area of 40 acres.

The Authority requires that a property meet <u>at least two</u> of the four guidelines for acceptance.

The property resource score is 62.49. Points were given for retiring three of the four remaining DURs and frontage on along Appalachian Trail Property. It meets the criteria by being over 40 acres, scoring over 35, and giving up more than 1 DUR.

DATE: December 10, 2012

In September 2011 the County contracted with an energy management firm, Planet Footprint (PF), to input and analyze the County's energy use. The purpose of hiring this outside firm was to reduce the amount of time spent by County staff entering energy bills while providing expertise in the analysis of the data. The contract for one year was \$1,500.

The past year staff has been working with PF to insure the reporting is accurate and informative. Specifically:

- 1) providing web access to County utility accounts beginning in July 2010. These accounts included 60 electric meters (37 County, 22 schools); 2 LP gas, 3 Heating Oil.
- 2) reviewing building utility use to insure utility bills are tagged to correct building
- 3) reviewing and revising reporting summaries to insure accurate results
- 4) providing data reflecting changes in building footprints and account contracts

Planet Footprint has provided quarterly reports that detail the energy use of the County as a whole ("Organizational Footprint"), and by individual buildings ("Property Footprint") (see attached example). The Organizational Footprint provides analysis of seasonal trends and quarterly comparisons. In addition there is a breakdown of the annual energy mix, electric versus gas and oil that describes consumption in energy units (MBtu's) and dollars. The Property Footprints provide a similar analysis for the main buildings, these include the Government Center, District Court, Circuit Court, Sheriffs Building (100 N. Church St.), Social Service, Animal Shelter, Joint Administrative Services, Maintenance, the Park Office, Pool, and Recreation Center.

#### **Energy Use Analysis**


The previous detailed Energy Management Update compared the energy cost and use for 3 fiscal years, FY08-FY10. Planet Footprint took over tracking July 2010. Previous tracking was done using Energy Star Portfolio Manager. The Portfolio Manager uses a slightly different method for analysis and therefore it is difficult to compare results from the last two years to the previous three. In addition, there have been significant structural and use changes for many of the County offices including the Circuit Court, Sheriff's Department, Park Office, and Recreation Center. Further, utility providers have changed, the most significant being the change from Allegheny Power to Rappahannock. The heating oil contract changed in July from Quarles to Emmart which affects Joint Administrative Services, and the park office which is now vacant. Due in part to these changes and making sure the data is accurately reported this report will provide a composite comparison of all energy use for individual buildings and departments for FY12 only and a comparison of electricity use for the main buildings for FY11 and FY12.


#### **Energy Use FY12 Individual Buildings**

Between FY08 and FY10 the County spent about \$125,000 per year for energy (electricity, heating oil, natural gas, propane) and water for the 10 buildings. In FY12 the annual expense increased just over \$160,000 due mainly to the addition of a full year of use from the Government Center and inclusion of the pool. Energy Cost per square foot is provided for comparison between buildings.

As shown the pool has the highest cost per square foot, however this may be somewhat misleading as the electricity used to run the pumps that filter the pool water are included in the cost and the building footprint only includes the concession stand, pool office, and changing areas.






#### **Electrical Consumption Comparison FY11 & FY12**

Overall the electric use for all buildings was lower in FY12 than FY11. This is attributed to the milder winter in FY12. Planet Footprint will provide future reports that detail comparisons of buildings consumption and costs between buildings and annually. Of all buildings the Government Center costs the most to run. It will be interesting to see if upgrades to the HVAC system improve the energy efficiency of the building.



#### **Electrical Use by Department**


Analysis of the individual energy sources, electricity, natural gas, heating oil, and propane are analyzed based on what Planet Footprint terms "responsibility" or department. In this analysis all of the electrical use for individual departments is included. For example, the County Park is included in Recreation. This includes the meters serving the shelters, irrigation, barn, concession stands, in addition to the buildings like the Recreation Center and Park Office. Analysis of Natural Gas, Heating Oil, and Propane is not included in this report but will be analyzed in future reports.

For the electricity use comparison, the Clarke County Sanitary Authority electricity use was included. This was not included in the overall cost to the County for utility usage as the CCSA pays their own utility bills. It is interesting to note how much electricity is used by the CCSA facilities in comparison to other government uses. In speaking with Mr. David Tyrell, Director of Utilities for the Town of Berryville, he stated that he was not surprised by the amount of usage as it takes a lot of energy to filter and pump water and sewage.

Another interesting finding was the energy use in the Circuit Court Building as shown in the graph below. The data clearly shows an increase in energy use during the renovation of the building when a lot of construction activity was occurring.



#### **Anomolies**

Another service provided by Planet Footprint is the reporting of anomalies or changes between quarters annually in energy use either 20% above or below the previous year. This helps to identify problems and/or successes in energy use. This past year found several discrepancies in electricity use at the Park. Specifically energy use increased at the concession stands. After discussions with Park Director, Lisa Cooke, it was identified that freezers may have been left on during the winter months. Though the increased use has already occurred it does bring attention to how much extra power a freezer uses and potential savings that can be incurred in the future. A similar anomaly occurred with the CCSA and it was identified that a block heater for a generator and back hoe had been added that used additional power.

#### **Building Improvements**

Many upgrades to improve energy efficiency were included in the building renovation to the Circuit Court Building. These improvements include lighting upgrades, heating system upgrades, and increased insulation. Additional insulation has been added to the District Court and Joint Administrative Services buildings. The Cook House, or Park Office was closed this October and offices moved to the newly renovated recreation center/senior center. Natural Gas was added to the Recreation Center.

#### **Next Steps**

As many of the renovations and use changes to County buildings are now complete, a more detailed and accurate analysis of energy use and trends can be evaluated to target potential savings innovations. Revaluating energy data collected in the Energy Portfolio may be useful for highlighting the increased efficiency of buildings as use can be shown prior to the noted improvements. In addition, to fully and completely understand and evaluate our energy uses and opportunities for savings, all utility data should be analyzed including water and fleet fuel. Planet Footprint has provided a cost estimate for the next year's subscription of services. In addition to the County, Dr. Murphy has tentatively agreed to include the schools in the contract.

#### **Planet Footprint Invoice**

For the County and schools the Planet Footprint fee for the 2012-2013 fiscal year will be \$4,750. The County fee will be \$2,375 up from \$1,500 last year. That will include:

- Data collection and management, including
  - Electricity data from Rappahannock Electric Coop.
  - Natural Gas data from Washington Gas.
- Propane and Heating Oil data supplied by the County in Excel format using our template, or a complete set of legible scanned delivery dockets emailed to <a href="mailto:edge@planetfootprint.us">edge@planetfootprint.us</a> quarterly.
  - Fleet fuel data from the SRS reporting server on Mansfield Oil's website.
- Water data supplied by the county as a set of legible scanned bills for around 20 accounts emailed to <a href="mailto:edge@planetfootprint.us">edge@planetfootprint.us</a> monthly or quarterly.
- Quarterly Performance Reviews by Webex. There would be a single review per quarter, to be attended by representatives of the County and schools.
- Up to 4 hours of support by your Planet Footprint Service Manager. Your service manager this year will be Marianne Jones, who has many years' experience planning and reporting on energy efficiency for 'small' local governments.

Property Footprint - ENERGY Quarter ending Sep 30, 2012





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



#### **Part A: Stand-alone Performance Over Time**

#### **About Property Comparisons**






#### Energy consumption per square foot per day (kBtu/sq ft/day)






#### Energy consumption per square foot per day (kBtu/sq ft/day)

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# ZONING MAP AMENDMENT (RZ-12-02) Daniel P. & Kristine D. Hamilton (owners) December 19, 2012 Board of Supervisors Meeting STAFF REPORT/PUBLIC HEARING – Department of Planning

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The purpose of this staff report is to provide information to the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors to assist them in reviewing this proposed ordinance amendment. It may be useful to members of the general public interested in this proposed amendment.

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#### **Case Summary**

#### **Applicant(s):**

Daniel P. & Kristine D. Hamilton (owners)

#### **Location:**

- 74 Laurel Lane, Tax Map Parcel 17A1-4-26; parcel reduced by boundary line adjustment is located at 256 Hemlock Lane, Tax Map Parcel 17A1-((A))-1
- West side of Laurel Lane between Timber Lane and Dogwood Lane
- Buckmarsh Election District (Kreider, Thuss Planning Commission; Weiss Board of Supervisors)

#### Parcel Size/Area to be Rezoned:

4,965 square foot portion of an existing 20,252 square foot parcel.

#### **Request:**

Re-zone property from Forestal-Open Space-Conservation (FOC) to Rural Residential (RR).

#### **Purpose of Request:**

The purpose of the request is to rezone all of the subject property to the RR District. The parcel became split-zoned FOC and RR following a boundary line adjustment.

#### **Planning Commission Recommendation:**

Following a duly advertised public hearing on December 7, 2012, the Commission voted 8-0-3 (Ohrstrom, Staelin, Kreider absent) to recommend approval of the request as submitted by the Applicants.

#### **Staff Recommendation:**

Recommend setting public hearing for the January 15, 2013 regular meeting.

#### **Description:**

Daniel P. and Kristine D. Hamilton request the rezoning of a 4,965 square foot portion of a 20,252 square foot parcel from Forestal-Open-Space Conservation (FOC) to Rural Residential (RR). The purpose of the request is to rezone all of the subject property to the RR District. The parcel became split-zoned FOC and RR following a boundary line adjustment. The subject property is located at 74 Laurel Lane, Buckmarsh Electoral District, and is referenced as Tax Map Parcel 17A1-4-26.

#### **Facts:**

Shenandoah Retreat Land Corporation ("the Corporation") recently agreed to a boundary line adjustment with Daniel & Kristine Hamilton, owners of 74 Laurel Lane in Shenandoah Retreat. The boundary line adjustment was necessary because it was discovered that the Hamilton's home encroached on the Corporation's parkland area. The amount of land that was transferred to the Hamilton's property to correct the encroachment was 4,965 square feet. The land that was transferred to the Hamilton's property from the Corporation is currently zoned FOC. Because the Hamilton's property is zoned RR, their property is now split-zoned following recordation of the boundary line adjustment. The boundary line adjustment plat was approved by Staff on September 21, 2012 and has since been recorded.

The County has an established practice of avoiding the creation of split-zoned properties. Because the practice is not codified in the Zoning or Subdivision Ordinance, Staff cannot require property owners to rezone their properties prior to approval of a boundary line adjustment plat. Staff works with property owners to rezone their properties in these situations as split-zoning can cause confusion regarding lot dimensions and allowable uses. In this case, the Applicants have agreed to request a rezoning to correct the split-zoning situation.

The size of the subject property following the boundary line adjustment is 20,252 square feet or 0.465 acres (previous area was 15,287 square feet). The property is nonconforming in terms of lot area as the minimum lot size for an RR-zoned parcel outside a County sewer service area is one acre. No proffered conditions have been provided by the Applicants and Staff has not identified a need for proffers at this time.

At the request of Planning Commission members, Planning Staff researched the permit history for the subject property in an attempt to ascertain how the encroachment may have occurred. Staff determined that the home was constructed in 1955 and there were subsequent additions including a deck. Building permits are no longer available for the original construction or later projects due to records retention policies, so Staff could not determine at what point in time that the lot line encroachment occurred.

This case was originally filed prior to the approval and recordation of the boundary line adjustment with Shenandoah Retreat Land Corporation listed as the owner and applicant on the application. Since the boundary line adjustment has been approved and recorded to transfer ownership of the property, a revised application was filed showing the Hamiltons as the owners/applicants.

#### **Staff Analysis:**

One of the major issues in reviewing these types of cases is determining whether the rezoning would increase the property's capacity for development in addition to correcting the split-zoning issue. As noted above, the area of the subject property is being increased from 15,287 square feet to 20,252 square feet. Since the minimum lot size is one acre, the property remains a nonconforming lot and cannot be further subdivided. Therefore, its capacity for development is not being increased.

Evaluation of the rezoning request is also required to include an analysis of 17 criteria set forth in §8-E-3 of the Zoning Ordinance:

a. Will be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan of the County.

There are no specific provisions of the Comprehensive Plan that directly address this type of request, and the request is not inconsistent with any provisions of the Plan.

b. Will be consistent with the Purposes and Intent of this Ordinance.

There are no specific portions of the Zoning Ordinance's Purposes and Intent that directly address this request, and the request is not inconsistent with any provisions. Two specific provisions are furthered by this request:

- 1-B-2-c. To facilitate the creation of a convenient, attractive and harmonious community.
- 1-B-2-h. To protect and stabilize the rural agricultural, forestal and open space areas that are essential to maintaining the County's heritage, character and economy.

Correcting a boundary line encroachment and eliminating a split-zoning issue helps to establish clear delineation between the residential parcels and the community's open space/parkland.

c. Will not have an undue adverse impact on the short-term and long-term fiscal resources of the county for education, water, sewage, fire, police, rescue, solid waste disposal or other services, and will be consistent with the capital improvement goals and objectives of the Comprehensive Plan, to the end that growth of the community will be consonant with the efficient and economic use of public funds.

The request is consistent with this provision as it will not increase the property's capacity for development.

d. Will not cause an undue adverse effect on neighboring property values without furthering the goals of the Comprehensive Plan to the benefit of the County.

The request would not adversely affect adjacent property values.

e. Will not cause an undue adverse effect on the preservation of agricultural or forestal land.

The request would not adversely affect preservation of agricultural or forestal land. It would help to preserve the Corporation's reserved open space by establishing a clear boundary and zoning district line.

f. Will not cause unreasonable traffic congestion or unsafe conditions on existing or proposed public roads and has adequate road access.

The request is consistent with this provision as it will not increase the property's capacity for development.

g. Will not cause destruction of or encroachment upon historic or archeological sites, particularly properties under historic easement.

The subject property does not border historic or archaeological sites.

h. Will not cause an undue adverse effect on rare and irreplaceable natural areas, areas of outstanding natural beauty, state-designated scenic byways or scenic rivers or properties under open space easement.

The subject property does not border rare natural areas, designated scenic areas, or open space easements.

*i.* Will not cause an undue adverse effect on wildlife and plant habitats.

The subject property will not impact wildlife and plant habitats. The transaction results in establishing a conforming rear yard for the existing house that did not previously exist.

j. Will have sufficient water available for its foreseeable needs.

The request is consistent with this provision as it will not increase the property's capacity for development and need for additional water capacity.

k. Will not cause unreasonable depletion of or other undue adverse effect on the water source(s) serving existing development(s) in adjacent areas.

The request will not impact existing water sources as the Applicants will continue to use the existing well on the property.

*l.* Will not cause undue surface or subsurface water pollution.

The request will not result in new activities that would affect surface or subsurface water pollution.

m. Will not cause an undue adverse effect on existing or proposed septic systems in adjacent areas.

The Applicants will continue to use their existing septic system. Increasing the lot size could potentially enable future repair of the existing system if needed.

*n.* Will not cause unreasonable soil erosion.

No land disturbance activities are proposed.

o. Will have adequate facilities to provide safety from flooding, both with respect to proposed structures and to downhill/downstream properties.

There are no watercourses or areas for potential downstream flooding on the property.

*p.* Will not cause undue air pollution.

There are no activities associated with this request that would produce air pollution.

*q.* Will not cause undue noise, light or glare, dust, odor, fumes, or vibration.

There are no activities associated with this request that would produce the aforementioned elements.







In order to resolve the encroachment of the dwelling on the above property owned by the Hamiltons onto Parkland owned by Shenandoah Retreat Land Corporation (SRLC), enclosed please find an application for a boundary line adjustment together with the plat of survey showing the boundary line adjustment and a rezoning application requesting that the area to be conveyed by SRLC to the Hamiltons containing 4,965 square feet be rezoned from Forestal Open-Space (FOC) to Rural Residential (RR).

We note that the two lots to the west of the Hamiltons' lots have acquired land from SRLC in the past and merged that Parkland with their existing subdivided lots such that the boundary line for the Parkland area adjacent to the original subdivided lots for the Retreat is not a straight line and these merged lots extend into the Parkland. Thus, the zoning division line between the RR and the FOC in this area also extends into the Parkland and is not a straight division line. In 2012, we concluded a tremendous celebration of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our park, Shenandoah National Park. More than 30 people – including representatives from local county governments and partner organizations, and tourism professionals – volunteered more than 1,900 hours of their time working with park staff, engaging local communities to bring about a year-long celebration of one of the nation's most treasured places. The Committee organized several highly successful events, including the Launching of a Year of Celebration in November 2010, and the Rededication of Shenandoah National Park in June 2011. There were also 64 sanctioned events held in surrounding communities, which helped take our message to thousands of people from around the world.

From the efforts of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee a successful partnership was forged between jurisdictions bordering Shenandoah and the various conservation organizations and businesses associated with the park. These groups shared the mission of inspiring the public to value the park and region's resources in the Blue Ridge Mountains and infusing surrounding communities in the Shenandoah Valley and Virginia Piedmont with a sense of ownership and pride in the park and region. We believe we accomplished this mission.

On May 24, 2012, approximately 140 representatives of local government, conservation groups, and support organizations came together to chart the future of the park and its relationships. The Anniversary Committee has further developed this concept into Celebrate Shenandoah, a group forming to continue this effort.

#### **ARTICLE THREE**

#### **GOVERNANCE**

Section 1. Membership. The initial Representative Committee shall consist of the following:

### **Category One Members:**

Two members:

Shenandoah National Park Superintendent or his/her designee

One employee of the National Park Service appointed by the Superintendent

#### **Category Two Members:**

Two members appointed by each member jurisdiction that borders on Shenandoah National Park, one of which shall be a tourism representative. Counties are encouraged to consider appointing a representative from a town to represent the jurisdiction or tourism.

#### **Category Three Members:**

One member appointed by each organization.

## **Category Four Members:**

One member appointed by each member jurisdiction that lay just outside those counties that border on Shenandoah National Park. Category Four Members shall be non-voting members.

Section 2. General Powers. The affairs of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group shall be managed by its Representative Committee. Members need not be residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Section 4. Regular Meetings. A regular meeting of the Representative Committee shall be held without any other notice than their Bylaws on the unless it is a legal holiday, then said meeting shall be held on the next business day. Regular meetings shall be held at a location within the member communities on a rotating basis. The Representative Committee may provide, by resolution, the time and place for holding additional regular meetings without other notice than such resolution. Additional regular meetings shall be held at a location within the member communities in the absence of any designation in the resolution.

Section 5. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Representative Committee may be called by or at the request of the chairman or any two (2) or more members, and shall be held at a place the members may determine.

Section 6. Notice. Notice of any special meeting of the Representative Committee shall be given at least seven calendar days previously thereto by written or oral notice delivered personally or sent by e-mail to each member at his address as shown by the records of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group. If notice is given orally or by e-mail it shall be deemed delivered. Any member may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a member at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting except where a member attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. The business to be transacted at the meeting need not be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting, unless specifically required by law or by these Articles.

Section 7. Quorum. A majority of the appointed Category Two Members and majority of the appointed Category Three Members and a representative of Category One Members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the board; but if less than a majority of the members is present at a meeting, a majority of the members present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

Section 8. Committee Decisions. The act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Committee, unless the act of a greater number is required by law or by these Articles.

#### **ARTICLE FOUR**

#### **OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES**

- Section 1. The Officers of the organization shall consist of a Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer.
- Section 2. Chair: The Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group. The Chair shall determine the location of regular and special meetings.
- Section 3. Vice-Chair: During absence or disability of the Chair, the Vice-Chair shall exercise all functions of the Chair.
- Section 4. Secretary: The Secretary shall issue notices for all meetings and shall keep the minutes of all meetings.
- Section 5. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall have the custody of all moneys and securities of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group and shall keep regular books on account. He/she shall disburse funds of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group in payment of the just demands against the Celebrate Shenandoah Group or as may be ordered by the Representative Committee, taking proper vouchers for such disbursements, and shall render to the Representative Committee from time to time as may be required of him/her, an account of all his transactions as Treasurer and of the financial conditions to his office or that are properly required of him by the Representative Committee.

#### Section 6. Election of Officers:

(a) Officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the appointed members of the Representative Committee at the first regular meeting of the calendar year.

- (b) New officers will assume duties of office immediately and will serve for one year.
- Section 7. The Chair may appoint Ad Hoc Sub-Committees, as deemed necessary, and appoint a Chairperson for such committees. Permanent Sub-Committees will be voted on by the board.

#### **ARTICLE FIVE**

#### CONTRACTS, CHECKS, DEPOSITS, AND GIFTS

- Section 1. Contracts. The Representative Committee may authorize any member or members, agent or agents of the Celebrate Shenandoah Board, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group, and such authority may be general or may be confined to specific instances. The Representative Committee may appoint in writing by agreement a fiscal agent for specific projects.
- Section 2. Checks, Drafts, or Orders. All checks, drafts, or orders for the payment of money, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group shall be signed by such person or agent or agents of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Representative Committee.
- Section 3. Deposits. All funds of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group in such banks, trust companies, or other depositaries as the Representative Committee may select.

Section 4. Gifts. The Representative Committee may accept on behalf of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group any contribution, gift, bequest, or devise for any purpose of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group.

#### **ARTICLE SIX**

#### **PROJECTS**

A five-year strategic plan to include economic development, health of the region, tourism and marketing, community engagement will be developed. An annual work plan may be developed to provide project direction.

#### **ARTICLE SEVEN**

#### **BOOKS AND RECORDS**

The Celebrate Shenandoah Group shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Representative Committee and committees having and exercising any of the authority of the Representative Committee. All books and records of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group may be inspected by any member, or its agent or attorney, for any proper purpose at any reasonable time.

#### **ARTICLE EIGHT**

#### FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group shall begin on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July in each year and end at midnight on the last day of June.

#### **ARTICLE NINE**

#### WAIVER OF NOTICE

Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provisions or the Articles of Organization of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group, a waiver thereof given by the person and persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

#### ARTICLE TEN

#### AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION

- Section 1. These Articles may be amended at any meeting of the organization by two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the appointed members eligible to vote. Notice of the proposed amendment(s) must be provided to the membership at least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting where they are to be voted upon.
- Section 2. Any vote regarding amendment of the Articles shall require a quorum of a minimum of fifty-one percent (51%) of appointed members.
  - Section 3. Voting may be by those present or by advanced written proxy.

#### ARTICLE ELEVEN

#### LIABILITY

- Section 1. General Liability. No member or committee of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group, or other person shall contract or incur any debt on behalf of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group or in any way render it liable unless authorized by the Committee. No member or committee of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group is authorized to promise moral or financial support of any charitable or other objective without the approval of the Committee.
- Section 2. Conflict of Interest. It shall be the policy of the Celebrate

  Shenandoah Group that all and executives thereof shall scrupulously avoid any conflict

Shenandoah Group in any and all actions taken by them on behalf of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group in their respective capacities and that they shall comply with all the prohibited conduct, prohibited contracts and prohibited conduct relating to transactions portions of the Virginia State and Local Governmental Conflict of Interest Act, Sections 2.2-3103 through 2.2-3112 of the code of Virginia as amended.

In the event that any member of the Representative Committee, or executive of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group shall have any direct or indirect interest in or relationship with any individual or organization which proposes to enter into any transaction with the Celebrate Shenandoah Group for the sale, purchase, lease, or rental of property or to render or employ services, personal or otherwise, said officer, member, or executive shall forthwith give the Representative Committee of the Celebrate Shenandoah Group notice of such interest or relationship and shall thereafter refrain from voting or otherwise attempting to exert any influence on the Celebrate Shenandoah Group to affect its decision to participate or not participate to such transactions.

#### 3. Update

Tom Judge provided the following update:

- Circuit Court payroll
  - Joint Administrative Services will assume payroll processing for the Circuit Court.
- Internal Control Recommendations
  - Working on establishing controls to address concerns raised during the FY12 audit.

#### 4. Joint Technology Plan.

The JAS Board should evaluate this draft for further refinement, and make recommendations where needed, especially with regards to timing and priority, because the strongest plan that can be presented to the Boards will be one that will be both technically and financially feasible. The plan can be proposed for adoption at this meeting, and sources of funding for the ERP System can be discussed in advance of the FY 14 budget process.

Tom Judge provided an overview. Highlights of discussion include:

- Reviewed summary table including events, projected costs and time line.
- ComCast: negotiations continue.
- Fiber Optic Network:
  - Currently, trenching and completing connections between DG Cooley and high school.
  - Main link will run down Main Street and picks up all schools terminating at Social Services.
  - It may be necessary to purchase easements.
  - County-owned fiber is buried; ComCast-owned fiber is overhead.
  - Need to include in projected cost estimated annual recurring charges for lease and maintenance.
  - Goal is to negotiations complete for FY 2014 and complete by 2020.
  - Extension of ComCast Lease. Negotiation on the extension of the lease with Comcast is underway and expected to be complete prior to the outset of the FY 14 budget process. The terms of the lease should be compared to the cost of purchase.
- Energy Management System Extensions:
  - o Dr. Murphy is meeting with Snyder Electric on Monday.
  - Need to look for most likely vendor.

- Schools have authorized the purchase of an IPad for Bobby Levi to allow remote access.
- Criteria for selection should be an open system.
- Ask RRMM, school renovations architect, for recommendation.
- Approach Bobby Levi, Maintenance Director, and ask him to gather information. Dr. Murphy volunteered to brief Bobby Levi and Randy Trenary.
- Need to determine whether a consultant should be hired and whether to hire an HVAC employee.
- Rework section to simplify.

#### — Telephone System Extensions and Upgrades

Section straightforward and no rework necessary.

### - Building Security Systems

- Grant funds are no longer available; and given the high cost, there are greater priorities.
- o Add statement that issues of cost and to whom data belongs are under investigation.
- By consensus, agreed that looking at expenditure of funds to address technology is a lower priority while recognizing that targeted expenditures are needed.

### - Video Conferencing

- o At this time, there is no demand making it a lower priority.
- It was recognized that this is an evolving priority.

#### — Network Switches

- Section requires greater elaboration.
- There are some shared systems with one point of intersection and some overlap. The schools do have more switches.
- Enterprise Resource Planning and Document Management Systems
  - While this is a priority, it continues to compete for resources.
- Sort options in timeline order.
- Shared Data Storage
  - o Data storage costs have decreased over time.
- Information Security

 As a first step, goals need to be defined. This process is anticipated to take approximately a year.

#### Employee Training

- Move employee training closer to ERP.
- Tom Judge will ask General Government IT to add training to its FY2014 budget.
- No shared budget is recommended at this time.
- Develop goals over the next 6 to 12 months.
- Schools will invite General Government to next software training.

#### — Software Adoption and Replacement

- Need to review future needs for shared systems.
- Many disparate software systems could be replaced with an ERP.

Tom Judge will rewrite and bring back to the group for further review.

#### 5. Fraud Prevention Program.

Last month's discussion of this topic ended with concerns regarding whether hotline tips can subsequent investigations were subject to disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act. Correspondence from the relevant state agency is attached. It appears that such information can be kept confidential, but legal opinion from the County Attorney is recommended.

Due to time constraints, this item was moved forward to the next scheduled meeting.

#### Budget Calendar

The Board may wish to discuss the budget calendar, especially with respect to the constraints on the process, and the timing of the School Board's request.

The Board discussed the timing of the budget calendar. Various examples were given of changes in requirements that negatively impacted the budget that came late in the budget season; and it was agreed that such actions have fostered a reluctance to act early.

By consensus, Tom Judge, David Ash and Mike Murphy were tasked with drafting the calendar.

#### 7. Benefit Waivers.

Attached is information concerning benefit waivers, whereby an employee is paid some amount that encourages them to enroll in health coverage with a spouse, thereby reducing the total cost to the

employer. This is presented for information only. If the board wishes to pursue the matter, more information can be obtained.



- Tents Any tent greater than 900 square feet in size will require a Building Permit and inspections prior to the event. Inspection shall be arranged to be done during normal business hours Monday through Friday at least the day prior to the event. The event application should provide diagrams or layouts of the location of the tent(s). All tents shall be fire retardant treated with the appropriate approval label on the tent and shall have a mounted and posted fire extinguisher (5 lb. ABC min.) located in each tent. If the tent is enclosed, it shall have two (2) forms of exit that are labeled and illuminated if the event occurs after daylight. If the event will occur after daylight hours, emergency lighting shall be provided.
- Electrical Systems Any temporary or portable electrical distribution systems shall require an Electrical Permit and inspections prior to the event. All portable or temporary systems shall be Ground Fault Interrupter Circuit (GFIC) protected. Trailer mounted generators shall be provided with ground rods and grounding conductors appropriate for the generator output requirements. All equipment shall be listed and labeled for the application (weather resistant). No portable generators are allowed inside any tents or trailers where persons would normally enter. A description of the electrical distribution system shall be provided with the special event application.
- Gas Appliances All gas appliances including cooking and heating appliances shall be inspected including leak tested prior to the event. No gas cylinders will be allowed inside tents or occupied trailers or structures. All gas cylinders shall be secured in areas not normally used by the public. All gas equipment shall be in good working order and shall meet requirements of the Virginia Fuel Gas Code.
- **Lighting** Information pertaining to the temporary lighting systems shall be provided with the special event application including output wattage and generation system. Lighting system shall be located not to project excessive lighting off of the premises and not to blind any moving traffic on or of the event property. Any lighting pointing to the property boundary shall be shielded and downcast.
- Inspections Arrangement for inspections shall be scheduled to occur prior to opening of the event during normal business hours between Monday and Friday. Required inspections shall be scheduled at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the expected inspection. If special times and arrangements are required, prior approval will need to be arranged with the Clarke County Building Department.






