Clarke County Economic Development Advisory Committee July 15, 2020, Minutes

A meeting of the Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) held in the Berryville/Clarke County Government Center, Berryville, Virginia, on Wednesday, July 15, 2020, at 1:00 pm.

1. Call to Order

At 1:01 pm, Chairman John Milleson called the meeting to order.

2. Adoption of Agenda

Christy Dunkle, seconded by Christina Kraybill, moved to adopt the agenda as presented. The motion carried by the following vote

3. Approval of Minutes

Christina Kraybill, seconded by Betsy Pritchard, moved to approve the January 29, 2020, and June 17, 2020, minutes as presented. The motion carried as follows:

4. Continued Discussion: Agri-Equine Survey

Highlights Include:

John Milleson:

- Requested point of clarification on the Ag-Equine Survey.
- Inquired to the price of the survey.
- Concluded, we will hold off until the beginning of 2021 and discuss it again. We do not have the money right now, and it's only going to get worse before it gets better.

Chris Bates:

- This topic comes up from time to time. The need has been presented a few times in the last few years. The agricultural land plan calls for such a survey. We've historically done them in the past.
- It's especially helpful for our new Director of Economic Development and Tourism to know what we have. A significant frustration over the years has been the former director, when asked a question about agriculture, would respond we don't have enough farms to do that. We need to know how many farms we do need or have what they do and what they need. We do not have the answers to those questions.
- The Agri-Equine Survey has been an ongoing discussion, which began a few years ago as a horse study only, as recommended by the Equine Alliance. The Board of Supervisors chose not to survey at that time. However, if you read the studies that have been completed and drive around the neighborhood, you will notice that equine is a tremendously large portion of the economic engine in Clarke County. We keep postponing this and feel it's about time to do it.
- We have an inland port that has expanded. The biggest and best on the East coast. Do we have enough products to handle a trans-loading or elevator situation in Clarke County to support that kind of operation?

• Chris Bates guestimated the price of the study as follows: roughly \$15,000 for the equine portion of the survey; approximately \$50,000 for a full agricultural study.

Bev McKay:

- Personally, not totally in favor of this as he is not sure what this will accomplish
 other than prove agriculture is a big part of the economy and zoning, which we
 already know. We need to know what we want to show before deciding to
 continue. He does not feel there will be very much funding support from the
 County right now due to budget constraints. We need agriculture
 infrastructure, machinery dealerships, hemp processing plant could have gone
 here, machinery repair, meat processing plants, etc.
- There is not much agriculture in the northern part of the Shenandoah Valley. People go to Harrisonburg or Pennsylvania. Everyone agrees we need that kind of stuff; but, due to budget constraints and the money, I would feel differently.
- Poultry mills pay 45 cents over for corn. The export market tends to be negative or even, which gets you to go to this side of Harrisonburg. It is a 45-minute drive, and you don't wait to unload, which is a big plus.
- What we are missing is the extension service. Virginia Tech has decimated the Extension Service.

Christy Dunkle:

Pointed out, service industries are currently struggling.

Christina Kraybill:

- If we did a survey like this in the future, would one possible outcome be information on the need for a type of trade school, farming services training site to help support what we have and what we envision? I feel that one of the things we don't have in our County is continued education/next level of education besides apprenticeships and stuff like that.
- Personally, a long-term vision is a type of school in Clarke County, likely located in a building no one has been able to do anything with; that's teaching these trades that are being decimated, yet are necessary, and we need to have.
- What has happened in the last few months is changing what people want to do going forward. Trades are attractive.
- Would this survey help show us where the gaps are to advocate further education/trade school/apprenticeships? Believes trade schools will be more desirable in the future because of Covid-19 and the changes it's brought.
- Voiced concerns the cost of the full study is equal to someone's salary.

Felicia Hart:

- In regards to trade schools: what are our gaps; not everyone will go for a 2-4 (two- or four-) year degree. How do we keep those people here? Every locality is facing this type of issue, and LFCC Workforce Development is taking this head-on.
- Regionally we are working closely with the high school to get that information out and understand the opportunities available.

Chris Boies:

- Expressed that as a board without spending authority, this study would have to go to the Board of Supervisors for approval as a budget supplement.
- This budget year will be very tough to get approved. The survey could be put in the budget process for next year.
- 5. Northern Shenandoah Valley Talent Attraction Marketing Strategy Discussion

Highlights Include:

Chris Boies:

- This is a study done on a regional basis to look at the struggle to acquire and attract the talent they need for the workforce.
- We should continue to promote:
 - o Quality of life we have here
 - o The relative affordability of housing
 - o Training opportunities through community colleges
- Having a talent website for the region, what to do, cost of living, networking, etc.
- Partner with GoVirginia request related to Covid-19; "Get back to work" marketing campaign.
- Our \$9,000 portion could potentially use CARES money for that; looking into this as a possibility.
- Economic Development is a regional type of activity; what helps Frederick County/Winchester often helps Clarke.

Felicia Hart:

- Work closely with Human Resources at larger plants and businesses because they
 are trying to convince folks to come here. It's a regional thing, must look at the big
 picture.
- A large number of people interviewed in the study had no idea where Shenandoah Valley was located. Understanding this must tie in with marketing to make ourselves known.

6. HB 785 Local Taxing Authority / Meals Tax Update

Highlights Include:

Chris Boies:

- Meals Tax:
 - o Previously worked towards estimating what revenue could come in via a meals tax; unfortunately, that data is not accessible.
 - o Virginia General Assembly allows localities to do specific taxation they could not before.
 - o Counties can impose up to six (6) percent without a referendum, effective July 1, 2020
 - o Apply to unincorporated areas of Clarke County. Berryville is already collecting a tax; the County couldn't impose an additional fee without its approval.
- Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT)
 - o The previous max taxation allowed was 2%; Virginia State code was changed to allow an unlimited amount but, any funds over 2%, but under 5%, must go to tourism promotion within the locality. Anything over 5% the board can spend as it wishes.
 - o Felicia Hart plans to meet with those currently paying the TOT to talk about how they would like to see revenues spent if we did increase the tax rate. A meeting date is not yet set.
 - o Cannot be effective until May 1, 2021
- Cigarette Tax
 - o Up to 40¢ per pack
 - o Effective July 1, 2021
 - o The state is trying to find a more efficient way to collect that tax. The current method is a sticker on each package, they are working for a better way to manage that taxation.
 - o Clarke County currently does not collect a tax on cigarettes; the Town of Berryville is collecting 10¢ per pack.
- Court House Security Fee
 - o An increase from \$10-\$20 per case
 - o Board is holding a public hearing set for Tuesday, July 21, 2020.
 - o Looked at as a user fee, already getting the security, but this is a way to collect those revenues.
- BPOL
 - o County has always had the right to receive, which has been debated and discussed in the past.

7. CARES Funds and Covid-19 Update by Felicia Hart

Highlights Include:

Felicia Hart:

- Hand out given in the meeting, see Attachment 1.
 - o First is a comparison of what other localities are doing and how they are dispersing their funds.
 - o The second is from the VA Employment Commission and is specific to Clarke County and tells us the employers, what our needs are, what our gaps are, turn over areas, etc.
 - o The third shows the percentage of change in consumer spending. This document is specific to the Covid-19 timeframe and Clarke County. It tells the story of what is happening in our backyard.
 - o The last document breaks down Clarke Counties' population and shows what it's needs are, good and bad. These are good reference points to have to help our community.
- Regarding the CARES Act
 - o We are still working on how we can manage funds. Clarification is being worked on in regards to a few definitions we are unsure of in regards to large industries and non-profits.
 - o This group could assist by talking with business owners, finding out their needs and how they feel the money should be spent.
 - o Business owners have been applying and receiving the Payroll Protection Funds, others the EIDL Funds. We just received notice the EIDL Funds are officially out of money, but the Federal Government has some ideas in the works it is going to be filtering down.
 - o Do we want to hand out monies, how do we hand out the money, what's the accountability? How much financial assistance do they need? Feels business owners should "have skin in the game" not used as a Band-Aid. Can they get through on the other side? Documentation could be requested. A considerable brush is available to be used here.
 - o A team needs to be put together to go through applications for CARES Funds to decide who gets the money. Recommends a deadline for requesting funds.
 - o Now that things have slowed down regarding masks and the limiting of people in one location want to take advantage and visit more businesses. Any introductions you may have, she would like.
 - o Will provide Christy an introductory letter and a business card to hand out when people are applying for business licenses in Berryville.
 - o Please send anyone with questions regarding the CARES funding to Felicia Hart.

Chris Boies

- The process is to develop a program, take that program to the Finance Committee, and then get approval from the Board of Supervisors. We hope to do this in August.
- One thought is to disperse funds through the IDA. Appoint a group of five people to go over requests as they come in. We need to determine the criteria to receive funds and what levels of assistance we are willing to give.
- Ideas from the EDAC should they have any, are a
- We've currently set aside ~\$100,000, which can be raised or lowered; this is a rough ballpark number thrown out to get the discussion going.
- 8. Committee Update: Berryville/Clarke County Joint Committee on Economic Development and Tourism by Chris Boies
 - The Town of Berryville and Clarke County have been collaborating for years on economic development and tourism.
 - The Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) was out of date and needed updating.
 - The updated MOU has been signed by both the Town of Berryville and Clarke County. Each has a copy on file.
 - The most significant change was the Town of Berryville contributing funds to allow a full-time Economic Development and Tourism Director, Felicia Hart, to be hired.
 - A joint committee between the Town of Berryville and Clarke County was established- The Berryville/Clarke County Joint Committee on Economic Development and Tourism- to assist in setting goals for the Director of Economic Development and Tourism.
 - The Joint Committee is meeting Friday, July 17, 2020. When goals are established, they will be added to the next packet, so this committee has the information as well.

Collector Road Update

Chris Boies:

- The Berryville Town Council and the Clarke County Board of Supervisors heard a presentation on Thursday, July 16, 2020, on the roadway that would connect Jack Enders Boulevard to Rt. 340.
- The site plan for the industrial park had a future crossing of the railroad tracks built into that site plan.
- There is a site distance issue due to curvature in the railroad, which removes the previously discussed location as an option for a crossing.
- The consultants came back with variations:
 - 1) Two options create cul-de-sacs at the end of Jack Enders to extend it to the Smallwood property and then cul-de-sac it.
 - 2) Two options to take it across the railroad tracks at the existing Smallwood Lane crossing and then take it to Rt. 340 from there.

- The approximate cost of the crossing, in addition to improvements to Jack Enders on this side, was about \$10 Million.
- We currently do not own any properties where the road would need to be built.
- Concerns:
 - 1) Overall cost
 - 2) Impact to wetlands
 - 3) Citizen concerns

Christy Dunkle:

- A large mailing was done to inform citizens this was happening.
- The reason this started was tractor/trailer traffic on Main Street.
- Tried for a smart scale grant a few years ago, but lacked the points to come close
- Incumbrancers:
 - o At grade crossing
 - o Train car stacking was an issue
 - o If we had a great rail station built or an active spur was made, then that would help to get an at-grade crossing. The curvature of the rail, site distance, and stacking will remain issues.
 - o Urban Legend: You have to give up possibly multiple crossings, and you have to apply to the railroad engineer to get an answer.
- Many issues are opposing this effort with the original plan; that is why they chose these other routes.
- Believes the end of the day proposal was to create a cul-de-sac on the Smallwood property, but that would mean more traffic on East Main Street or through downtown. This is also problematic, but that would give the benefit of not shovel ready, but developable sites for grant opportunities.
- The Smallwood property has numerous heirs that would have to be considered.
- Roads that we have built have been at a developer's cost.
- Cost-wise it is better to develop a partnership with a private developer who would incur the cost of the roads to be built. While this is a longterm vision, it is a critical component of transportation in the town.
- There are opportunities for developers in that direction.

9. Next Meeting

The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, September 16, 2020.

Staff will include monthly taxes collected from Airbnb's.



In **Clarke County**, as of July 01 2020, total spending by all consumers increased by **0.6%** compared to January 2020.



In Clarke County, as of July 08 2020, total small business revenue increased by 11.6% compared to January 2020.



In Clarke County, as of July 08 2020, the number of small businesses open decreased by 14.4% compared to January 2020.



In **Clarke County**, as of May 30 2020, employment rates among low-income workers decreased by **24.3%** compared to January 2020.



In **Clarke County**, as of May 30 2020, earnings among low-income workers decreased by **32%** compared to January 2020.



CARES Act monies – How Other Localities Are Using Some of Their Funds

Staunton Downtown Development

- 10 businesses will receive \$1,000
- Grant monies for businesses expanding their product line or collaboration with another local business
- Monies to be used for advertising, marketing and promotion
- Any business legally operating in the Downtown area as of April 1, 2020 eligible
- They ask for:
 - Total revenue online vs storefront
 - o Employment numbers full time vs part time
 - o Any layoffs
 - o How would monies be used
- Required follow up presentations to "board" December 1, March 1 and June 1
- Application reviewed by Staunton Downtown Development Association staff as well as a grant committee
- Grants given on a rolling basis

City of Winchester

- \$500,000 microloans; \$100,000 to large industries; \$300,000 to non-profits -
 - Micro-sized and non-profits 501(c)3 can receive up to \$5,000; Large size businesses can receive up to \$10,000
 - o \$220,000 reimburse EDA for earlier grants




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II. Demographic Profile

Overview

This Demographic Profile provides an in-depth analysis of the population in Clarke County. Most of the data is produced by the U.S. Census Bureau, and includes demographic characteristics such as age, race/ethnicity, and gender.



Related Terms and Definitions

Ability to speak English

For people who speak a language other than English at home, the response represents the person's own perception of his or her ability to speak English. Because census questionnaires are usually completed by one household member, the responses may represent the perception of another household member.

Age

The age classification is based on the age of the person in complete years as of April 1, 2010. The age of the person usually was derived from their date of birth information. Their reported age was used only when date of birth information was unavailable.

Gender

The data on gender were derived from answers to a question that was asked of all people. Individuals were asked to mark either "male" or "female" to indicate their gender. For most cases in which gender was not reported, it was determined by the appropriate entry from the person's given (i.e., first) name and household relationship. Otherwise, gender was imputed according to the relationship to the householder and the age of the person.

Race

The concept of race as used by the Census Bureau reflects self-identification by people according to the race or races with which they most closely identify. The categories are sociopolitical constructs and should not be interpreted as being scientific or anthropological in nature. Furthermore, the race categories include both racial and national-origin groups.



Population by Gender







III. Economic Profile

Overview

The Economic Profile of Clarke County consists primarily of data produced by the Virginia Employment Commission, U.S. Census Bureau, and the Bureau of Labor Statistics.



Related Terms and Definitions

Average Weekly Wage

Computed as average quarterly wages divided by 13.

Consumer Price Index (CPI)

The Consumer Price Index measures the average change over time in the prices paid by urban consumers for a representative market basket of consumer goods and services.

Local Employment Dynamics (LED)

The Local Employment Dynamics Program at the Census Bureau, together with its state partners, provides employment information at the county, city, and Workforce Investment Area level. This information tracks workers in different industries by age and gender and provides statistics on job creation, separation, turnover, and wages.

Quarterly Census of Employment & Wages (QCEW)

A federal/state cooperative program that collects and compiles employment and wage data for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and the federal civilian workers covered by Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE). These data are maintained at the state in micro and macro levels and also sent to BLS quarterly.


Unemployment Insurance (UI)

Unemployment insurance is a program for the accumulation of funds paid by employers to be used for the payment of unemployment insurance to workers during periods of unemployment which are beyond the workers' control. Unemployment insurance replaces a part of the worker's wage loss if he becomes eligible for payments.

The number of unemployed people as a percentage of the labor force.

Unemployment Rates Past 12 Months



Top 5 Industries With Largest Number of Claimants in Clarke County (excludes unclassified)







Related Terms and Definitions

Associate's degree

An award that normally requires at least two but less than four years of full-time equivalent college work.

Bachelor's degree

An award that normally requires at least four but not more than five years of full-time equivalent college-level work.

Post-baccalaureate certificate

An award that requires completion of an organized program of study equivalent to 18 semester credit hours beyond the bachelor's. It is designed for persons who have completed a bachelor's degree, but do not meet the requirements of a master's degree.

Master's degree

An award that requires the successful completion of a program of study of at least the full-time equivalent of one but not more than two academic years of work beyond the bachelor's degree.

Post-master's certificate

An award that requires completion of an organized program of study equivalent to 24 semester credit hours beyond the master's degree, but does not meet the requirements of academic degrees at the doctor's level.


Doctor's degree

The highest award a student can earn for graduate study.

First-professional degree

An award that requires completion of a program that meets all of the following criteria: (1) completion of the academic requirements to begin practice in the profession; (2) at least two years of college work prior to entering the program; and (3) a total of at least six academic years of college work to complete the degree program, including prior required college work plus the length of the professional program itself.

Educational Attainment by Age









- c) Investments Year-to-Date Summary, Year-to-Date Budget, Bond Log

5. Old Business

- A. Local EDA/IDA Bond Term Review
 - After review, Director Waite suggested leaving the bond terms as is right now. The fees currently set seem to be in line with our surrounding jurisdictions.
- B. Review and Adoption of Bylaws, Rules, and Procedures
 - Staff suggested edits include removing the bond fees from the Bylaws, so if changes want to be made, the Bylaws don't have to be changed.
 - Staff proposed a closer review and will recommend any edits at the next meeting in October 2020.

6. New Business

A. Discussion on CARES Funding for Small Business Assistance

Highlights Include:

- Director Hart provided a handout; see Attachment 1. The Board of Supervisors is looking at using some of the funds from the CARES Act to help small businesses. The document provided is a comparison sheet to help understand what others are doing, the requirements they are putting into their applications. The amount of funds in each locality is different; Clarke has set aside, to start, \$100,000 to give away. If the need is more significant than that, that number could change.
- Mr. Boies stated the idea is the Industrial Development Authority would be the body that issues the checks to the small businesses that receive the funds. The criteria are essential; what are the objectives and what is trying to be accomplished. Will the company receiving funds still be in business a few months

- for now, or will these funds be a "Band-Aid" of sorts. A review committee needs to be established to review applications and decide who receives funds.
- Mr. Boies indicated; ideally, this should be ready for the August 2020 Board of Supervisor meeting.
- Mr. Boies made clear that the money can only be spent on expenses related to Covid-19. If years down the road, it is found that funds are spent on items it shouldn't have; the money will have to be returned.

B. Southeaster Collector Study

Highlights by Chris Boies

- The long-term plan has been to expand the business park across the railroad tracks to Route 340.
- The purpose of the study was to understand the challenges, what could be overcome, and how it would all work.
- The initially proposed railroad crossing will no longer work due to sight distance and the curvature of the railroad.
- The consultants came back with variations:
 - o Two options create cul-de-sacs at the end of Jack Enders to extend it to the Smallwood property and then cul-de-sac it.
 - o Two options to take it across the railroad tracks at the existing Smallwood Lane crossing and then take it to Rt. 340 from there. This option would require an upgrade.
- The approximate cost of the crossing, in addition to improvements to Jack Enders on this side, was about \$10 Million.
- Director Hart felt it was important to note that the county does not currently own any of the properties where the road would need to be built.

C. Conflict of Interest Filing Requirement Change

Highlights by Tiffany Kemp

- New filing requirements effective July 1, 2020, stating all directors of the Industrial Development Authority are required to turn in a Statement of Economic Interest to County Administration no later than August 3, 2020.

Discussion Included:

- County Administration currently has a rough list of Airbnb operators in the town of Berryville and Clarke County. That list is not broken down by townships.
- With Covid-19, Felicia Hart stated that we are seeing an increase of people utilizing Airbnb and other similar platforms going up, predominantly because the numbers in Clarke County are so low.
- Various locations for a hotel were discussed.
- Christine Kriz from Lord Fairfax, Small Business Development Center, has been in Clarke County, working with small businesses to be able to come out of the other side of Covid-19 and survive and take advantage of the many small business assistance loans and grants.
- Once relationships are built with the local businesses, those owners need to come and ask for assistance before it is too late. They need to realize where the tipping point and that there is assistance available.
- The director of Economic Development & Tourism is a partner available to business owners to help minimize the speed bumps and make the process a bit easier.
- Berryville Main Street program is seen as a valuable program, but it takes a lot of effort to maintain the accreditation. Help is a challenge for this group.
- Do the businesses that pay dues to the Berryville Main Street program find this a valuable program? What are the strengths and weaknesses in the program; what can we afford to do and understand the value of the program. This is an evolving program.
- Social media sites have two (2) different target audiences; economic development and tourism.
- Felicia Hart voiced that realtors should see these groups as a resource. They don't need to know all the answers, but she can be a source of information.
- The development of a small business incentive program through the CARES Act will be a significant effort. More communication with the community once this is refined will be necessary. CARES funds must be expended by the end of the year.

- Various land sites that could be utilized for this project were discussed.
- The sights of Clarke County need and want to be protected.
- The railroad crossing will be problematic. An overpass or underpass is generally 10x the cost of an at-grade crossing. At the previously discussed location, there is a site distance issue due to curvature in the railroad, which makes it unusable.
