- Bev McKay would like to go to the southern end of the county and visit businesses out there no one knows of, business who build electrical boxes at White Post, smaller things like that. When asked, Bev McKay stated he would provide a list of places to visit out there to staff.

— Chair Milleson brought up Lori Macintosh not attending any meetings all year. Chair Milleson asked, and the Committee agreed, for him to contact about Ms. Mackintosh about meeting attendance and stepping down, if necessary.

5. Continued Discussion: Economic Development Structure

Chris Boies

- Asked for any thoughts now that the Committee has had time to process the information presented at the December 2, 2020, meeting.
- Will present to the IDA next week, January 28, 2021.
- Will schedule with BoS work session in February or March to discuss input from the different groups and get things finalized.

Chair Milleson

- Felt there is a good discussion last month, requested, EDAC be specifically informed of the work session with the Board of Supervisors should anyone wish to attend.
- Also requested the Berryville-Clarke County Joint Committee on Economic Development and Tourism meeting schedule. Felt it would be beneficial for members of the EDAC to attend if schedules align.
- Chair Milleson asked if the IDA can legally change its name.
 - Chris Boies stated the IDA could become an EDA through a resolution. The only
 fees associated are those accured in the legal process of changing the paperwork
 to march the name change.
- Often thought EDAC should do what the Berryville-Clarke County Joint Committee on Economic Development and Tourism does, and feels EDAC should be included and asked for meeting dates and times.
 - o Keep MOU at a higher level, EDAC and IDA do the groundwork.
 - MOU gets into weeds, can give strategic direction, other groups can accomplish the goals. Some work could funnel down.

Kristina Kraybill

- In favor of changing IDA to EDA.
- Feels EDAC needs a new name.
- Conversation with a business owner who had a concern list. Found she had to explain whom the EDAC is historically, reminding the EDAC has no money or budget. Felt it was frustrating to do that; it feels like a revamp is needed.
 - Bev McKay stated the EDAC could request any budget it may need from the board of Supervisors. Chris Boies responded Bev McKay is correct; some of what we need to accomplish would be through budgets.
- Marketing generally involves funds and time. When the public sees the name, they tend to think the EDAC is doing what the IDA is doing; they get confused.
 - o Chris Boies stated if we do a revamp, it is a good idea to do a complete overhaul.

Bev McKay

- Informed the Committee that the BoS voted to reduce the sewer fees by 1/3. Feels this should help sell the land currently available in Waterloo.
 - Chris Boies clarified this is an example of trying to be more proactive. Property
 owners stated these fees were a deterrent for us. This reduction is only for 2021,
 hoping that an end date would spur activity sooner than later. Looking at
 barriers, both perceived and actual, to help property owners get things moving.

Chris Bates

— Asked for clarification the fee reduction would be for new business connections only?

- Chris Boies stated it was proposed that way, but the board gave the flexibility to include properties with older septic systems if the request came before us.
- Originally designed as an economic development tool, but if there is a health concern, there is the flexibility to use that exemption for those properties.

Christy Dunkle

- Inquired as to whether the capacities good in the sanitary system?
 - Chris Boies stated the plant capacity is currently at 50%. There is some capacity of the pump stations in that location, which may need to be upgraded, but the plant capacity is excellent.
- Is there a threshold where you have to start designing the next phase?
 - Chris Boies stated we could fill that up and not have to worry. It is a small plant, but it has quite a bit of capacity. Bev McKay supplied it would not hurt the plant to have more going through it; it would make it more efficient.

Feasibility Study

Chris Boies

- The Sanitary Authority will do a monthly fee comparison and a hookup fee comparison.
- Hired an engineering firm to look at surrounding locality rates, but also capital needs, how to pay to determine if our current rates are where they should be or if they need to go up or down based on the study.
- It could be done in the next 90 days. Will keep this group updated on that.
- 6. Director of Economic Development and Tourism Update and 2020 Year-End Summary

Felicia Hart:

- Convene a group of hospitality owners/operators (topics to include TOT, short-term rentals, Civil War)
 - Group has met once in person. The discussion continues with business owners regularly for updates/status
- 2. Engage stakeholders on the feasibility of a hotel in Berryville (this would include owners/operators in the region)
 - Participate in a weekly update of the travel industry. This covers the hotel industry. Talked last week with regional DMOs who get the STR report (monthly hotel industry booking numbers), and many hotels are still understaffed and way under-booked due to COVID-19. Talk now for the industry is that the numbers will not get better until at least 2023. Many travelers are now utilizing short term rentals.

- 3. Continue efforts on business attraction, retention, and growth (seminars, promotion, assistance).
 - I continue to work closely with the Virginia Employment Commission, Virginia
 Career Works, Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center, and other
 agencies as needed. We are currently working with the USDA and other Federal
 agencies to take advantage of their programs.
 - o While in Front Royal, I collaborated with Page and Rockingham County to develop the Connect 340 program. We applied for and won a REDI (Rural Economic Development Initiative) grant from the USDA. USDA has allowed this program to follow me. This grant provides extensive research for our area(s) aimed at outdoor tourism-related businesses. It is based on our quality of life and the resources that we have. The research includes other areas/states that have been successful in recruiting these types of businesses and their overall marketing plan. We hosted our second Zoom meeting, fine-tuning our research needs/areas.
 - We continue to work with our local businesses to promote their hiring and training needs.
 - We have had another status meeting with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership.
 - We have successfully completed our first extended conference call with Cochran's Lumber regarding the Economic Gardening program. From this call, researchers will work to determine Cochran's best opportunities for not only increased sales but better understanding their competition, where sales opportunities are, and how to better promote (and to who) their products.
 - We will start working with C2M on their second phase of this same program.
 - We have initiated a conversation with a local business and the Virginia Economic
 Development Partnership regarding international trade.
 - Via conference call, we are meeting next week with the USDA to continue the discussion on the USDA Rural Development Value-Added Producer grant with a local farmer.
 - We have been regularly communicating with local businesses/non-profits to make them aware of the new PPP 2.0 program. Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center has already been working with five local businesses to determine eligibility.
- 4. Engage in a dialogue with property owners of vacant buildings and the developable land to spur economic activity.
 - We continue the discussion with local property owners.
 - o Regularly run queries about new properties on the market to start a dialogue.
 - We produced the graphics for the oversize "For Sale/Rent" posters designed to spur discussion

- We have regular meetings/updates with Christy Dunkle, and she continues to make introductions for me.
- 5. Evaluate what is needed to make the Berryville Main Street program viable and successful report back to Joint Committee on recommendations.
 - Have initiated several meetings with both current and past board members for a better understanding of the history of the Berryville Main Street program. We are working on potential partnership opportunities for events, trainings, and campaigns. While the board members themselves will determine the fate of the program, we can definitely utilize the fact that they are at least trying and wanting to make a difference. They already have relationships with many of the business owners, and we can work to take advantage of that asset in getting the word out and helping us better understand current reality.
- 6. Formalize website and social media strategies for economic development.
 - Work continues. We have talked with other localities to learn what does/doesn't work. What pages and community infographics to include. Then production of those individual pieces will be initiated based on budget. We have set up a meeting with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership to incorporate the VAScan program into our site. This program includes land and property offerings in Clarke County. In our first training, we will be working to determine what properties would qualify to be included in this State listing database.
- 7. Establish relationships, and provide training for realtors in the area.
 - I am now planning one-on-one meetings with local realtors in Clarke County and surrounding areas.
 - Continue working with ED at the Blue Ridge Association of Realtors to collaborate on potential Zoom training meetings with the USDA, LFSBDC, and others.
- 8. Develop and implement an incentive program using the CARES funding.
 - Currently, as stated earlier, we are working to educate businesses and nonprofits as to what the PPP 2.0 version is offering.
 - o The Clear Brook Welcome Center display was a great opportunity. We showcased Main Street and other Clarke County towns/communities, numerous non-profits including Long Branch, Blandy, Historical Association, Farmers Market, the Clarke County Equine Alliance, and Shenandoah Spirits Trail that showcased our two wineries. Special thanks to Chris Bates for getting organizations to participate.
 - We were able to produce three banners that will be used throughout the year at events/programs and at places like the Clear Brook Welcome Center.

- We produced a Profile Sheet that will be utilized to promote Clarke County to various travel writers, travel bloggers, and DMOs. Our profile sheet will be distributed at numerous shows (courtesy of SVTP, SVTA, and others) attending the shows.
- We produced short videos of local business owners and video of our area. This
 will give us access to the video that will be utilized for future projects including
 those with the State Tourism, Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership,
 Shenandoah Valley Travel Association, Shenandoah Spirits Trail, social media,
 and many others.
- We also produced the over-size for sale/rent signs that will be utilized by property owners. These are colorful signs that include my contact information and make mention of incentives that might be available.
 - Christy Dunkle suggested adding Felicia Hart's title to these signs to clarify who she is.
 - Felicia Hart clarified many of the buildings are family-owned properties that have been handed down, and the owners do not want to sell, rent, or be landlords.
 - If anyone knows anyone who wants one, please direct those owners to Felicia Hart.
 - Bev McKay asked if localities do vacancy taxes?
 - Felicia Hart does not know of any program.
 - Christy Dunkle does not feel the General Assembly would allow that kind of tax.
 - Christina Kraybill found inviting property owners to dinner to discuss how the business owners feel seeing the vacant buildings. Feels the only way we will get past this is if people know what it feels like. Wants people to do something for the betterment of the group.
 - Felicia Hart stated once one starts to clean up their vacant buildings, a domino effect uually goes into play. Just need the initial spark.
- O We continue to have weekly conference calls with EDAs from both Winchester City and Frederick County. Meeting also includes LFSBDC (Christine Kriz) and the Top of Virginia Chamber (Cynthia Snyder). It also includes the United Way as needed. This weekly communication helps us to better understand what our current reality is and how we can adjust sooner to meet those needs. We also serve as a clearinghouse of new information regarding grants and training opportunities. We continue to push the "Open and Safe" COVID-19 campaign.
- We are in regular communication with our local community banks to ensure we are not missing areas of concern for our "Main Street" businesses.
 - There area a couple of meetings next week which Chris Boies is attending.

Other Projects:

Economic Development

- We continue to regionally participate as part of the Small Business Resiliency Team program as part of a GOVirginia grant. This is in partnership with Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center. This program assists small businesses with marketing, financial guidance, the creation of an e-commerce website, and accounting software.
- Continue to utilize Christine Kriz and her staff from the Lord Fairfax Small Business
 Development Center.
- We continue working regionally to promote the Workforce Initiative. This program works to put businesses in front of high-school students to show them potential career opportunities.
 - Not just for students, people who are looking for a new direction for employment.
- Regionally we are producing a Northern Shenandoah Valley Talent website. This site will
 highlight each areas' quality of life (including P&R), educational opportunities, and other
 pertinent information that people are looking for when job hunting.
- We continue participating regionally in the Startup Shenandoah Valley program. This
 program works with businesses to identify and address their risks while scaling up.
- I continue to meet regularly with Clarke County's Planning and Zoning Directors for updates/catch-ups.
- We continue to see some turnover in smaller businesses i.e., restaurants and some others.

Tourism

- As part of the Shenandoah Valley Spirits Trail, we just finalized our latest video that highlights Twin Oaks Tavern Winery. This video is shared on the Spirits Trail website and the Virginia Tourism Corporation's site. It is hosted on YouTube and shared via numerous social media outlets.
- We continue to update the Virginia Tourism Corporation, the Shenandoah Valley Travel Association, and other websites regarding Clarke County and our assets/businesses. This includes providing photography and video as time allows. Because of time constraints, we are missing opportunities to highlight Clarke County via blogs, itineraries, and "What's New" stories.
- We have been successful working with local photographers who have offered their works to us. They are providing their images to us for free with just a copyright credit. We are (and will be) incorporating these images in our websites and social media opportunities, in addition to other outlets.
 - Thirty-six citizens offered their photos, with photo credit; no money was spent to get photos of Clarke County.
- Following up with Mayor Arnold's suggestion about potential signage at the trailheads (special thanks to Alison Teeter for the introduction to the "Trail Boss" Chris Brunton),

- we have discussed where potential signage can go (VDOT vs. State Park properties) and what said signage could incorporate. In the works is a new Eagle Scout kiosk project at Bear's Den that we could also potentially include our messaging on.
- As a general reminder, unemployment numbers are climbing again. Handout provided to see how we compare to surrounding localities. We need to understand what type of work these newly unemployed people are doing – restaurant workers, brick and mortar stores, etc.
- The handout provided shows the numbers from the Virginia Tourism Corporation. From an economic standpoint, we need to understand the value of tourism and the potential it brings to our community. Each year the State does a breakdown by locality, see the handout, (1 year behind to collect data) 2019 local tax receipts include an increase of 3.1% compared to surrounding localities. When questioned about tourism, this shows why it is important.
- As part of our Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership Annual Meeting (1/21 @ 10 am), we are proud to announce guest speakers:
 - o Rita McClenney, President and CEO of the Virginia Tourism Corporation;
 - o Eric Terry, President of the Virginia Restaurant, Lodging and Travel Association;
 - o Patrick Kenney, Park Superintendent, Shenandoah National Park; along with
 - Presentations on the economic impact of travel in the Shenandoah Valley; and the
 - o The unveiling of our new Partnership website
 - Highlights localities as individuals
 - Your Zoom invitation will be e-mailed to you personally.

Questions/Comments

Christy Dunkle

- What is the status of websites, and do you need any help. It seems the old ones are dead
 specifically clarketourism.com and yesclarkecounty.com
 - Felicia Hart responded those websites are a work in progress; help would be great, currently gathering all the different pieces to give to the website developer – we are starting new.
 - The list of businesses on the economic development site, yesclarkecounty.com, was removed. Before doing the leg work, people will google businesses to find a website to list those out.
 - o If something needs immediately changed, let her know. Would like to take it down, but unsure of feedback.
 - Christina Kraybill asked, and Felicia Hart confirmed the economic development would be completely new. Felicia Hart also noted she is moving away from words to pictures to then filter from there.

 EDAC Committee agreed the business lisitings on yesclarkecounty.com should come down until a new site can go up, so there is not incorrect information listed.

Christina Kraybill

- Mentioned the building vacancy list should go on the yesclarkecounty.com page.
 - Felicia Hart stated we are working on the VAScan program. Has had two
 meetings to go through rules and regulations stipulating which properties can go
 on there.
- Asked if the Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership Annual Meeting's invitation was sent out recently as she has not received her invite. Also, asked how much time the meeting would take and when it was?
 - Felicia Hart responded she sent it last week but will resend it. The meeting is on
 1/21/21 at 10:00 am. It will last roughly 90 minutes.

Chair Milleson

- Any complaints on USPS and how slow the service has been?
 - Felicia Hart responded she had received comments. Roughly 50 of the Small Business Grant Applications we mailed, knowing we had a correct address, came back as undeliverable. It seems to be getting worse.
- Felt the COVID-19 vaccination clinic at the High School went fantastic.

Bev McKay

- Keep trying to get online to get shots. Website updates all day long.
- Boyce clinic was not done well, but they were patient.

Felicia Hart

- We need the vaccines for the business side of things, a big economic piece!
- Berryville Main Street still trying to figure out what they are going to be doing. They are great at getting the word out, expanded their reach to more businesses in the county.
- Berryville Graphics has 85 slots to fill. Working with HR to improve the situation. Working
 on some short videos to help educate what positions are at Berryville graphics. They are
 on the lower scale for wages, which doesn't help the problem.
- Cochran Lumber currently has three positions to fill, but nothing is listed on their website
 yet. She is working on getting them to post something online to point qualified people
 his way.
- Felicia Hart needs to be the main point of contact, from time to time, using Clarke's social media and controlling the Economic Development office's message.

Chris Bates

- Are you coordinating with the career and technical program at school?
 - Felicia Hart confirmed she has been in joint meetings with Cathy Seal to do something once COVID-19 slows down.
 - o Christine Kriz can come in and meet if the Committee would like.
 - Chair Milleson felt this would be a good idea.
- Can LFSBDC do the video for Berryville Graphics? Wondering if that could fit into the educational programs.
 - o Felicia Hart stated the State is working on that they have the budget to do that.
 - Having students do the videos as an educational project is a bit out of the scope of the LFSBDC.
- Meeting with Virginia Economic Development Partnership, did anything come up for companies we are missing?
 - Felicia responded in the affirmative. They produce quarterly reports, but they are confidential and cannot be shared.
 - O Goes over businesses reached out, what they were looking for, areas looking at, etc. They reach out when appropriate, and we have what the business needs. The MOU with the City of Winchester and Frederick County works very well. Also tells us what we do not have.

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Employment Statistics

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistic:

"In 2019, the employment-population ratio for persons with a disability was 19.3 percent. The ratio for persons without a disability, at 66.3 percent."

"Workers with a disability were also more likely than those with no disability to work in production, transportation, and material moving occupations"

"The unemployment rate for persons with a disability, at 7.3 percent in 2019. Their jobless rate continued to be about twice as high as the rate for those without a disability."

Education for Employment

- Indicator 13 and 14 are required by the Virginia Board of Education.
 - **Indicator 13:** Youth aged 16 and above with an IEP that includes appropriate measurable postsecondary goals that are annually updated and based upon an age appropriate transition assessment, transition services, including courses of study, that will reasonably enable the student to meet those postsecondary goals, and annual IEP goals related to the student's transition services needs.
 - **Indicator 14:** School's reach out to students a year after graduation to obtain information about if they are working or continuing their education.
 - **2017 Seriors:** 9 out of 17 students were unemployed, still living in the community
 - **2018 Seriors:** 8 out of 14 students were unemployed, still living in the community
 - **2019 Seriors:** 14 out of 21 students were unemployed, still living in the community

Education for Employment

This course teaches students to make informed career and continuing education choices as they transition from school, gain technical skills, and adapt to the workplace.  The recovery was selective to companies who benefited from shut down; Zoom,
 Amazon, etc.
- The IDA has a diversified portfolio. When initially set up, it was divided very conservatively, a little more aggressive, and added a growth component to get a better return rate.
- In a floating rate fund last year, at the time doing well because they are short-term banknotes that turn over every 60-90 days. The idea was interest rates were rising, as the notes were maturing, getting new notes with a higher interest rate to help the fund.
- When the pandemic hit, there was a massive sell-off due to credit risk; many companies were not doing well and could default on loans.
- Reached out in April because of that concern, recommended moving the money from the Floating Rate fund to the U.S. Government Securities Fund, which is a safe haven until things leveled out.
- Overall did well. Made allocation in May 2018 with \$100,000; 2 ½ years later up to \$115,000 - 6% per year - doing well for a conservative/moderate portfolio.
- Felt comfortable with keeping it as is for next year.

Questions/Comments:

- Director Waite stated he believes this is aligned with the strategy adopted two (2) years ago. Recommends maintaining as-is for another year with an annual review in January 2022. Director Wolfe agreed.
- Board vocalized their appreciation of Janice Kuhn keeping an eye on and making changes as needed due to the pandemic.

Director Waite, seconded by Director Wolfe, moved to approve the investments as presented and maintain the strategy through the year 2021 with a re-evaluation in January 2022. The motion carried by the following vote:

- Other opportunities should be looked at when we need a new revenue stream.

Chris Boies gave a brief update on the COVID-19 vaccination.

- Clarke County is above the average percentage of citizens vaccinated.
- Businesses should start creating a list of employees who are willing to get the COVID-19 vaccine. It would be helpful to know the numbers ahead of time.
- Coordinating through the Director of Emergency Management.
- The problem now is vaccine supply.
- Doing group 1B as quickly as they can.
- Health Department is willing to go into manufacturers and do vaccinations depending on resources. The bigger the group, the more likely the Health Department will come out.

7. New Business

A. Discussion on Economic Development Structure

- Chris Boies stated when he first arrived, Economic Development efforts were fragmented/disconnected as far as direction and structure.
- The current structure of the County is as follows:
 - o Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC)
 - o Industrial Development Authority (IDA)
 - o Berryville-Clarke County Joint Committee on Economic Development and Tourism (MOU Committee)
 - The town of Berryville has a Community Development Committee where pieces overlap
 - o NGO's (Non-Governmental Organizations)
 - Top of Virginia Chamber of Commerce
 - Berryville Main Street
 - Barns of Rose Hill
 - Historical Association/Mill, Equine Alliance, Farmers Market, Fairgrounds, and many others
- Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC)
 - o Initially discussed/appointed by the Board of Supervisors in 1999/2000
 - o Initial Charge:
 - Review revenue needs and offers ideas for revenue generation
 - Offer advice to BoS, County Administrator, and the Economic Development Director concerning economic development activities
 - A broad charge for them to work on
 - Talented people on the group who feel they have not been utilized, as they would like to

- Industrial Development Authority (IDA)
 - o A legal entity created by the BoS with authority granted by the Code of Virginia
 - They have special powers localities don't
 - Make grants to private entities
 - Buy/Sell/Lease property without a public hearing
 - o Develop industrial parks
 - Issue bonds for the benefit of private entities
 - Make loans to private entities/forgive repayment of those loans
 - They are also:
 - The economic development cheerleaders
 - Eyes/ears of the business community
 - Help elected officials analyze opportunities, determine needs, and generally keep them informed on the status of the business community
 - o Could become an "Economic Development Authority" with the same powers.
 - The only cost associated with this is changing the legal paperwork
 - A more encompassing type of name
 - IDA's, historically, are thought of as helping a business park grow and expand, but they should be helping small businesses too
- Berryville-Clarke County Joint Committee on Economic Development and Tourism (referred to as the MOU Committee)
 - o Consists of two (2) members of the Board of Supervisors and two (2) Town Council members
 - o Ensures the joint efforts/cooperation on economic development activities in and around the Town of Berryville
 - o Provides one (1) direction to the Economic Development Director
 - Streamlines the direction she is receiving
 - Both Town and County contribute financially to the position
 - o Ensures joint funding of the economic development position
- Basic Functions of a Local Economic Development Program
 - o Placemaking/Tourism
 - o Business Retention/Expansion
 - o Growing Your Own-small business/entrepreneurs
 - o Business Attraction
- Placemaking/Tourism
 - o Showcasing your community's special attributes/vibrancy
 - o Two-fold effort bringing people to your community to visit, spend money, then go home/also key for existing and new businesses
 - o Talent/Workforce number one concern for expansion/relocation

- o Quality of Life Schools, healthcare, events, recreation, neighborhoods, community pride, etc.
- o Clarke is very strong in the Placemaking category people want to live in Clarke County. Homes being built are sold faster than they are completed
- o Talent is one of the biggest contributors. Southwest Virginia is struggling because people are leaving that area. Businesses that need 300 employees will not develop in an area people do not want to live.
- Business Retention/Expansion
 - o 2019 Virginia Economic Development Partnership (VEDP):
 - 67% of all announcements regarding new and expanding businesses were from existing Virginia businesses
 - 68% of job announcements were from existing Virginia businesses
 - 54% of capital investments were from existing Virginia businesses
 - o Need a coordinated program, site visits, and check-ins
 - Thought would be to have members of these groups be assigned business to check in throughout the year
 - o Anticipate local business needs/identify problems before they arise
 - Lack of available employees is the biggest complaint we are hearing from local businesses
 - o Build a strong business climate/create business champions
 - If Director Cochran could be a spokesperson for the Economic Gardening Program, it would help with future referrals to that program.
 - o Strategies/approach different for corporate vs. downtown businesses
 - A large business approach, such as Berryville Graphics, will be a very different approach than one for a small, Mom-and-Pop type of business on Main Street.
- Growing Your Own-small business/entrepreneurs
 - o Extensive support networks needed
 - o A high percentage of failure in the first two (2) years
 - o Business incubators
 - o Educational programs for would-be entrepreneurs
 - o Small Business Development Center at Lord Fairfax Community College
 - State Agency, resources offered are free to businesses, working with seven
 (7) in Clarke County currently
- Business Attraction
 - o By far the most expensive endeavor/most visible headlines
 - o Very competitive localities with strong incentive programs
 - o In Clarke, very targeted and limited due to strong Comprehensive Plan
 - Ensures we maintain a sense of place

- o Focus right now on already properly zoned vacant properties/buildings
- o History of a very successful business park
- Regional Perspective
 - o Businesses look at regions, not just jurisdictional boundaries
 - o Established relationship with Frederick County and the City of Winchester
 - o Coordination with the State
 - Virginia Economic Development Partnership
 - Virginia Economic Developer's Association
 - o Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership
 - o Shenandoah Valley Travel Association
- Projects in and around Berryville (Starting Point)
 - Board of Supervisors and Town Council thoughts filter through the Berryville-Clarke County Joint Committee on Economic Development and Tourism (MOU Committee)
 - o MOU Committee would be able to provide direction to:
 - IDA (or EDA)
 - EDA is a more inclusive term than IDA. The only cost to change is the legal paperwork. A name change could be done with the adoption of a resolution.
 - Would focus on:
 - ✓ Business Attraction
 - ✓ Business Retention
 - ✓ Business Expansion
 - Would send feedback back to the MOU Committee
 - EDAC
 - Would focus on:

Questions/Comments

Director Wolfe

Feels this is a fantastic idea. It fills a gap that has been missing. He is frequently
asked how to get in and whom to talk to. Gives us an idea of what works and what
needs to be adjusted.

Director Waite

- Excited to see the allocation of resources to help. Each group has different skill sets; how do we define the role better for everyone, so there is a clear definition.
 Need an objective; what does contacting mean other than saying help and how to report on an ongoing basis.
- From a Board position, where do we help get pads ready vs. not? What is our willingness in a financing role?
 - o Chris Boies stated some areas in the County are defined. The biggest question becomes how Berryville and the County work together. Where the next spot for appropriate development is and what does it look like?
 - o David Weiss stated he wants to utilize the IDA's ability and monies when development opportunities arise. Training is the critical component to implementing an exciting and good plan, specifically training to allow all groups to understand what the Council and the Board's expectations are moving forward. Committed as a Board with County properties to make things happen.

Director Ferrell

- Before speaking with anyone, should Directors get confirmation with Board?
 Doesn't want to waste time if not interested.
 - O Chris Boies stated the MOU did very well providing direction over this last year. The next time the MOU sets goals, it needs to be determined whom we should be targeting, and what is the right size and fit for Clarke County? Staff needs to create a defined list.
 - David Weiss stated a vital question is what companies need our demographics and then how to market them to those available properties. Not interested in Large Scale re-zonings. Need and will be very controlled in any expansions.
 Good to have a conversation with staff, to have an understanding of whom to talk to and what to talk about.
 - o Felicia Hart stated understanding ordinances, permitting time and costs, etc., is a big piece of the picture.

Director Cochran

- Would be happy to talk to people but would need tangible data that show plots available, fees for hook-ups, a cheat sheet of sorts.
- Went through an expansion in 2020 and his contractors felt County and Town were a pleasure to work with as opposed to other localities.
 - o Felicia Hart stressed all departments working as a team is the best way to be successful for new businesses coming in.
 - O David Weiss stated over the last several years, we have tried to identify single points of contact, get all departments on board so that when businesses talk to us, they get a straight answer. Be clear and have all information available so businesses can understand what is needed and welcomed in Clarke County.

Director Koontz

- What are the sizes of the properties, zoned appropriately? Concerned Clarke County's cost per acre is significantly higher than Frederick County's. The cost of the land may also be a factor.
 - o Chris Boies stated Clarke is in the middle, too expensive on one side, but others feel it is cheap.
 - o Felicia Hart added many other localities are offering pad-ready sites by working with developers.

B. Director of Economic Development and Tourism Update

- Convene a group of hospitality owners/operators (topics to include TOT, shortterm rentals, Civil War)
 - o Group has met once in person. The discussion continues with business owners on a regular basis for updates/status

- Engage stakeholders on the feasibility of a hotel in Berryville (this would include owners/operators in the region)
 - o Participate in a weekly update of the travel industry. This covers the hotel industry. Talked last week with regional DMOs who get the STR report (monthly hotel industry booking numbers) and many hotels are still understaffed and way under booked due to COVID. Talk now for the industry is that the numbers will not get better until at least 2023. Many travelers are now utilizing short term rentals.
- Continue efforts on business attraction, retention and growth (seminars, promotion, assistance).
 - O Continue to work closely with the Virginia Employment Commission, Virginia Career Works, Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center and other agencies as needed. We are currently working with the USDA and other Federal agencies to take advantage of their programs.
 - o While in Front Royal, I collaborated with Page and Rockingham County to develop the Connect 340 program. We applied for and won a REDI (Rural Economic Development Initiative) grant from the USDA. USDA has allowed this program to follow me. This grant provides extensive research for our area(s) aimed at outdoor tourism-related businesses. It is based on our quality of life and the resources that we have. The research includes other areas/states that have been successful in recruiting these types of businesses and their overall marketing plan. We hosted our second Zoom meeting fine-tuning our research needs/areas.
 - o We continue to work with our local businesses to promote their hiring and training needs.
 - o We have had another status meeting with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership.
 - o We have successfully completed our first extended conference call with Cochran's Lumber regarding the Economic Gardening program. From this call, researchers will work to determine Cochran's best opportunities for not only increased sales but better understanding their competition, where sales opportunities are, and how to better promote (and to who) their products.
 - Director Cochran is currently participating in this program. Was a bit skeptical at first about how it could help his company. Feels the market research they are doing for him will be extremely helpful. It is a statesupported process, but it has a nationwide reach.
 - Informing them of areas that are up and coming, what the jobs pay, historical data, infrastructure, etc.
 - Very impressed with the thoroughness done on the company, excited to see what they bring back.

- Director Ferrell asked if they will promote the business, Felicia Hart responded they would not promote a business. They find the relevant information to each business and help them improve.
- Felicia Hart added C2Management previously went through the program once and will be going through it again.
- Director Waite stated this is a great business retention program for County. Does Felicia Hart have a list of companies who should go after this next? Felicia Hart responded she has reached out to a couple of businesses and is prepared to help. Some not ready at this time but constantly talking.
- David Weiss felt it was important to note businesses cannot take advantage of this service if we did not have an Economic Development Officer; they will not come to a community without that liaison.
- Director Preston asked for clarification as to why C2Management was going through the second round of this program, and did they see any improvements after going through the first time?
 - Felicia Hart stated it took a while. Did not understand the value of what they were bringing and did not have time to implement the findings correctly.
 - David Weiss felt it would be helpful to provide a background of what C2Management is. Felicia Hart responded it is an electronic recycling company. They recycle materials across the east coast from hospitals, data centers, and people with metals. C2Management will salvage what they can, resell what can be refurbished, and recycle the rest. Works with technical equipment and has staff to do specialized testing. Has state and federal contracts refurbish old equipment.
 - Director Wolfe has visited. Felt it is an amazing facility and worth a trip to see.
- o We have initiated a conversation with a local business and the Virginia Economic Development Partnership regarding international trade.
- Via conference call, met a couple of weeks ago with the USDA to continue the discussion on the USDA Rural Development Value-Added Producer grant with a local farmer.
- o We have been regularly communicating with local businesses/non-profits to make them aware of the new PPP 2.0 program. Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center has already been working with local businesses to determine eligibility.
- Engage in a dialogue with property owners of vacant buildings and the developable land to spur economic activity.
 - o We continue the discussion with some local property owners.
 - o Regularly run queries about new properties on the market to start dialogue.

- o We produced the graphics for the oversize "For Sale/Rent" posters designed to spur discussion.
- o We have regular meetings/updates with Christy Dunkle, and she continues to make introductions.
- Evaluate what is needed to make the Berryville Main Street program viable and successful and report back to Joint Committee on recommendations.
 - o Have initiated several meetings with both current and past board members for a better understanding of the history of the Berryville Main Street program. We are working on potential partnership opportunities for events, trainings, and campaigns. While the board members themselves will determine the fate of the program, we can definitely utilize the fact that they are at least trying and wanting to make a difference. They already have relationships with many of the business owners, and we can work to take advantage of that asset in getting the word out and helping us better understand current reality.
- Formalize website and social media strategies for economic development.
 - o Work continues. We have talked with other localities to learn what does/doesn't work. What pages and community infographics to include. Then production of those individual pieces will be initiated based on budget. We have set up a meeting with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership to incorporate the VA Scan program into our site. This program includes land and property offerings in Clarke County. In our first training, we will be working to determine what properties would qualify to be included in this State listing database.
- Establish relationships, and provide training for, realtors in the area.
 - o I am now planning one-on-one meetings with local realtors both in Clarke County and surrounding areas.
 - o Continue working with ED at the Blue Ridge Association of Realtors to collaborate on potential Zoom training meetings with the USDA, LFSBDC and others.
- Develop and implement an incentive program using the CARES funding
 - o Currently, as stated earlier, we are working to educate business and non-profits as to what the PPP 2.0 version is offering.
 - o The Clear Brook Welcome Center display was a great opportunity. We showcased Main Street and other Clarke County towns/communities, numerous non-profits including Long Branch, Blandy, Historical Association, Farmers Market, the Clarke County Equine Alliance and Shenandoah Spirits Trail that showcased our two wineries. Special thanks to Chris Bates for getting organizations to participate.

- In the past, up to 60,000 people pass through this welcome center, this year, just over 40,000 visitors.
- o We were able to produce three banners that will be used throughout the year at events/programs and at places like the Clear Brook Welcome Center.
- o We produced a Profile Sheet that will be utilized to promote Clarke County to various travel writers, travel bloggers, and DMOs. Our profile sheet will be distributed at numerous shows (courtesy of SVTP, SVTA, and others) attending the shows.
- o Regionally we are putting together another Shop Local campaign but this time for Valentine's Day. This is a play off of our "Open and Safe" program.
- O We produced short videos of local business owners and videos of our area. This will give us access to video that will be utilized for future projects – including those with the State Tourism, Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership, Shenandoah Valley Travel Association, Shenandoah Spirits Trail, social media, and many others.
 - Shows what Clarke County has to offer.
 - Thanked Betsy Pritchard for participating.
 - Noted Director Cochran and Cochran Lumber are in line to participate.
- o Farmer's markets, since moving to the Primary School, have had 300-500 going through a weekend.
 - David Weiss asked if they were staying at the school or moving; Felicia Hart responded they are in negotiations with the town right now.
 - Director Koontz noted the farmer's market gets a ton of people visiting and is very popular; how do we capture those visiting and pointing them towards town.
 - Felicia Hart responded that was part of the discussion. There are
 opportunities for the Town/County to set up a booth as well as other
 businesses. Not sure where folks are coming from. Punch card idea to
 include names and emails to win a free "something." Build on that
 database. In contact with LFSBDC, VA Tourism point of contact, many
 small businesses don't realize, but the VTC website provides a free
 listing for businesses to take advantage of.
- o We also produced the over-size (3'x4') for sale/rent signs that will be utilized by property owners. These are colorful signs that include my contact information and make mention of incentives that might be available.
- o We continue to have weekly conference calls with EDAs from both Winchester City and Frederick County. Meeting also includes LFSBDC (Christine Kriz) and the Top of Virginia Chamber (Cynthia Snyder). It also includes the United Way as needed. This weekly communication helps us to better understand what our current reality is and how can we adjust sooner to meet those needs. We also serve as a clearinghouse of new information regarding grants and training opportunities. We continue to push the "Open and Safe" COVID-19 campaign.

- o We are in regular communication with our local community banks to ensure we are not missing areas of concern for our "Main Street" businesses.
- o Way to see what is happening in our underserved in our community
- o The next meeting is scheduled for 01/29/2021.

Other projects:

- Economic Development
 - O We continue to regionally participate as part of the Small Business Resiliency Team program as part of a GO Virginia grant. This is in partnership with Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center. This program assists small businesses with marketing, financial guidance, the creation of an e-commerce website, and accounting software.
 - o Continue to utilize Christine Kriz and her staff from the Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center.
 - o We continue working regionally to promote the Workforce Initiative. This program works to put businesses in front of high school students to show them potential career opportunities.
 - o Regionally we are producing an NSV Talent website. This site will highlight each areas' quality of life (including P&R), educational opportunities, and other pertinent information that people are looking for when job hunting.
 - o We continue participating regionally in the Startup Shenandoah Valley program. This program works with businesses to identify and address their risks while scaling up.
 - o I continue to meet regularly with Clarke County's Planning and Zoning Director for updates/catch-ups.
 - o We continue to see some turnover in smaller businesses i.e., restaurants and some others.

Tourism

- o As part of the Shenandoah Valley Spirits Trail, we just finalized our latest video that highlights Twin Oaks Tavern Winery. This video is shared on the Spirits Trail website and the Virginia Tourism Corporation's site. It is hosted on YouTube and shared via numerous social media outlets.
- o We continue to update the Virginia Tourism Corporation, the Shenandoah Valley Travel Association, and other websites regarding Clarke County and our assets/businesses. This includes providing photography and video as time allows. Because of time constraints, we are missing opportunities to highlight Clarke County via blogs, itineraries, and "What's New" stories.
- o All have a website, updating to get our info out there.
- o If a new business has an expansion, new product, VTC wants to know so we can showcase it.

- o We have been successful working with local photographers who have offered their works to us. They are providing their images to us for free with just a copyright credit. We are (and will be) incorporating these images in our websites and social media opportunities, in addition to other outlets.
- o Both tourism and Economic development websites are sorely outdated.
- o Images have previously been a chunk of her budget at other locations, getting for free right now.
 - Director Cochran stated he has drone footage from fall he can share with Felicia Hart for these pages.
- o Following up with Mayor Arnold's suggestion about potential signage at the trailheads (special thanks to Alison Teeter for the introduction to the "Trail Boss" Chris Brunton), we have discussed where potential signage can go (VDOT vs. State Park properties) and what said signage could incorporate. In the works is a new Eagle Scout kiosk project at Bear's Den that we could also potentially include our messaging on.
- o There are rules as to what can be posted; will need to get a graphic artist to assist with this project.
- o Included tourism numbers in the handout. State Corporation puts together a report. 2019 tax receipts went up 3.1%
- o Good to have to help justify why tourism matters.

C. Waterloo Availability Fees Program Update

Highlights by Chris Boies

- Permission by the Board of Supervisors to reduce the sewer hook-up fees by 1/3 of the current fee.
- Hook-up fees are high for a small system with not many efficiencies.
- Hook-up fees were developed around the Capital costs associated with building the system.
- There was old money due back to the Board of Supervisors. The Board agreed to waive payback if we get new hook-ups. The reduction lasts for the calendar year 2021 to help spur activity.
- There is an existing incentive program with the IDA to space payments out. No takers yet for this program.
- Conversations with Mr. Claytor, who claims interested tenants left when they saw water/sewer hook-up fees. Took feedback to heart, try to soften the impact to new businesses.
 - o Director Ferrell Questioned how many pads sites the system can accommodate.
 - Chris Boies stated there is a decent amount of property that is zoned commercial but has not been built on.

5. Director of Economic Development & Tourism Goals Update and Year-end Summary

Felicia Hart Highlights Include:

Goals

- Convene group of hospitality owners/operators (topics to include TOT, short-term rentals, Civil War)
 - Group has met once in person. Discussion continues with business owners on a regular basis for updates/status
- 2. Engage stakeholders on the feasibility of a hotel in Berryville (this would include owners/operators in the region)
 - Participate in a weekly update of the travel industry. This covers the hotel industry.
 Talked last week with regional DMOs who get the STR report (monthly hotel industry booking numbers) and many hotels are still understaffed and way under booked due to COVID-19. Talk now for the industry is that the numbers will not get better until at least 2023. Many travelers are now utilizing short-term rentals.
 - Chris Boies offered that capital for new enterprises is not going to be investing in new facilities because they have so many not being used. Still a priority but it does not seem we will see movement on this right now until occupancy numbers go up.
- 3. Continue efforts on business attraction, retention *and growth* (seminars, promotion, and assistance)
 - I continue to work closely with the Virginia Employment Commission, Virginia
 Career Works, Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center and other agencies
 as needed. We are currently working with the USDA and other Federal agencies to
 take advantage of their programs.
 - While in Front Royal, I collaborated with Page and Rockingham County to develop the Connect 340 program. We applied for, and won, a REDI (Rural Economic Development Initiative) grant from the USDA. USDA has allowed this program to follow me. This grant provides extensive research for our area(s) aimed at outdoor tourism-related businesses. It is based on our quality of life and the resources that we have. The research includes other areas/states that have been successful in recruiting these types of businesses and their overall marketing plan. We hosted our second Zoom meeting fine-tuning our research needs/areas.

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- We continue to work with our local businesses to promote their hiring and training needs.
- We have had another status meeting with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership.
- O We have successfully completed our first extended conference call with Cochran's Lumber regarding the Economic Gardening program. From this call, researchers will work to determine Cochran's best opportunities for not only increased sales, but better understanding their competition, where sales opportunities are, and how to better promote (and to who) their products.
 - David Weiss asked how that program works and if the business has to pay a fee to the State for this assistance. Felicia Hart responded that she personally interviews the business to get a sense, then she will put that business in Clarke together with the State. The State will then hire someone to do all the research for that business once the State understands the plan of action of the business. There are no fees associated with this program.
 - Chris Boies added the key to this is the local relationship, the liaison being Felicia Hart. If she is responsive, reliable, communicates, does everything she is supposed to on her end, they will keep coming back to her to serve the local businesses. They do not reach out to companies directly.
- We will start working with C2M on their second phase of this same program.
 - Chris Boies added Felicia initiated conversations between C2 Management (C2M) and Cochran's Lumber, who previously went through this program. C2 Management can tell Cochran's Lumber, here is how much time I had to dedicate, how much work we had to do, but it was worth it in the end. Cochran's Lumber then becomes the spokesperson for the next business we try to get into this program.
- We have initiated conversations with a local business and the Virginia Economic
 Development Partnership regarding international trade.
- Via conference call, we are meeting next week with the USDA to continue the discussion on the USDA Rural Development Value-Added Producer grant with a local farmer.
- We have been regularly communicating with local businesses/non-profits to make them aware of the new PPP 2.0 program. Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center has already been working with five local businesses to determine eligibility.
 - Businesses that previously took advantage of the PPP funding still do not know if the money they received will be forgiven or not.
 - Working with CPAs and Tax Consultants to help businesses understand what they need to be looking for and to help businesses prepare for the tax season.
 - David Weiss asked, and Felicia Hart confirmed, it is possible those businesses who took advantage of the PPP Program may not have to pay that money back. Funds will still count as income but whether they have to pay it back or not is unsure.

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- 4. Engage in a dialogue with property owners of vacant buildings and the developable land to spur economic activity
 - We continue the discussion with local property owners.
 - Regularly run queries about new properties on the market to start a dialogue.
 - We produced the graphics for the oversize "For Sale/Rent" posters designed to spur discussion.
 - David Weiss asked if Felicia Hart had received a sense as to why the buildings remain vacant. Felicia Hart responded many vacant properties are family properties and the owners are not in a hurry to become renters or realtors. Many owners do not want to put the money in because they do not need the income.
 - David Weiss asked if other localities have programs to encourage owners.
 Felicia Hart responded, there can be. Tax abatements, water/sewer hook-up fees spread over the years, etc.
 - Kara Rodriguez asked if there was any interest from property owners for improving those areas. Felicia Hart stated these posters have just been completed; some owners have been spoken to and are aware of the signage but have not asked for it yet. Felicia Hart plans to make a big push on this.
 - We have regular meetings/updates with Christy Dunkle, and she continues to make introductions for me.
- 5. Evaluate what is needed to make the Berryville Main Street program viable and successful report back to Joint Committee on recommendation
 - O Have initiated several meetings with both current and past board members for a better understanding of the history of the Berryville Main Street program. We are working on potential partnership opportunities for events, trainings, and campaigns. While the board members themselves will determine the fate of the program, we can definitely utilize the fact that they are at least trying and wanting to make a difference. They already have relationships with many of the business owners, and we can work to take advantage of that asset in getting the word out and helping us better understand current reality.
 - Ultimately, it will be up to that board to decide what they want to do moving forward.
- 6. Formalize website and social media strategies for economic development
 - Work continues. We have talked with other localities to learn what does/doesn't work. What pages and community infographics to include. Then production of those individual pieces will be initiated based on budget. We have set up a meeting with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership to incorporate the VAScan program into our site. This program includes land and property offerings in Clarke County. In our first training, we will be working to determine what properties would qualify to be included in this State listing database.
- 7. Establish relationships, and provide training for realtors in the area.

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- I am now planning one-on-one meetings with local realtors both in Clarke County and surrounding areas.
- Continue working with the Executive Director Nancy at the Blue Ridge Association of Realtors to collaborate on potential Zoom training meetings with the USDA, LFSBDC, and others.
- 8. Develop and implement an incentive program using the CARES funding
 - Currently, as stated earlier, we are working to educate businesses and non-profits as to what the PPP 2.0 version is offering.
 - The Clear Brook Welcome Center display was a great opportunity. We showcased Main Street and other Clarke County towns/communities, numerous non-profits including Long Branch, Blandy, Historical Association, Farmers Market, the Clarke County Equine Alliance, and Shenandoah Spirits Trail that showcased our two wineries. Special thanks to Chris Bates for getting organizations to participate.
 - Previous years have had upwards of 60,000 plus visitors pass through; this year, they were at 47,000 visitors.
 - We were able to produce three banners that will be used throughout the year at events/programs and at places like the Clear Brook Welcome Center.
 - We produced a Profile Sheet that will be utilized to promote Clarke County to various travel writers, travel bloggers, and DMOs. Our profile sheet will be distributed at numerous shows (courtesy of SVTP, SVTA, and others) attending the shows.
 - We produced short videos of local business owners and video of our area. This will
 give us access to video that will be utilized for future projects including those with
 the State Tourism, Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership, Shenandoah Valley
 Travel Association, Shenandoah Spirits Trail, social media and many others.
 - We also produced the over-size for sale/rent signs that will be utilized by property owners. These are colorful signs that include my contact information and make mention of incentives that might be available.
 - We continue to have weekly conference calls with EDAs from both Winchester City and Frederick County. Meeting also includes LFSBDC (Christine Kriz) and the Top of Virginia Chamber (Cynthia Snyder). It also includes the United Way as needed. This weekly communication helps us to better understand what our current reality is and how can we adjust sooner to meet those needs. We also serve as a clearinghouse of new information regarding grants and training opportunities. We continue to push the "Open and Safe" COVID-19 campaign.
 - We are in regular communication with our local community banks to ensure we are not missing areas of concern for our "Main Street" businesses.

Other Projects:

Economic Development:

 We continue to regionally participate as part of the Small Business Resiliency Team program as part of a GOVirginia grant. This is in partnership with Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center. This program assists small businesses with

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- marketing, financial guidance, creation of an e-commerce website and accounting software.
- O Continue to utilize Christine Kriz and her staff from the Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center.
- We continue working regionally to promote the Workforce Initiative. This program
 works to put businesses in front of high school students to show them potential
 career opportunities.
- Regionally we are producing a NSV Talent website. This site will highlight each
 areas' quality of life (including P&R), educational opportunities, and other pertinent
 information that people are looking for when job hunting.
- We continue participating regionally in the Startup Shenandoah Valley program.
 This program works with businesses to identify and address their risks while scaling up.
- o I continue to meet regularly with Clarke County's Planning and Zoning Directors for updates/catch ups.
- We continue to see some turnover in smaller businesses i.e. restaurants and some others.

Tourism:

- As part of the Shenandoah Valley Spirits Trail, we just finalized our latest video that highlights Twin Oaks Tavern Winery. This video is shared on the Spirits Trail website and the Virginia Tourism Corporation's site. It is hosted on YouTube and shared via numerous social media outlets.
- We continue to update the Virginia Tourism Corporation, the Shenandoah Valley
 Travel Association and other websites regarding Clarke County and our
 assets/businesses. This includes providing photography and video as time allows.
 Because of time constraints, we are missing opportunities to highlight Clarke
 County via blogs, itineraries and "What's New" stories.
- We have been successful working with local photographers who have offered their works to us. They are providing their images to us free with just a copyright credit.
 We are (and will be) incorporating these images in our websites and social media opportunities, in addition to other outlets.
- o Following up with Mayor Arnold's suggestion about potential signage at the trailheads, (special thanks to Alison Teeter for the introduction to the "Trail Boss" Chris Brunton) we have discussed where potential signage can go (VDOT vs State Park properties) and what said signage could incorporate. In the works is a new Eagle Scout kiosk project at Bear's Den that we could also potentially include our messaging on.
 - Chris Boies clarified we can say "Come visit Berryville" but we cannot say "Visit these restaurants in Berryville". There are specific rules as to what can be posted.
 - Kara Rodriguez offered the idea of a QR code on the sign to pull up places in Berryville/Clarke County.

Questions:

Chair Arnold

- Would it be possible to add a section to the social media sites of jobs available in Berryville/Clarke County? Businesses can post they are hiring and applicants would apply directly with that business; we would not want to manage applications, qualifications etc., but a list of businesses looking for help.
 - Felicia Hart responded they are working on this and can definitely implement something like this on the new website. Working with businesses to put together specific advertisements for jobs currently open.
 - Chris Boies added it might be easier to do something like this as a weekly email as opposed to a section on the website.
 - O David Weiss asked for clarification that this could be done on a government website. Chris Boies responded yes, as long as we keep it open to any business interested in posting something; we can limit to Clarke County.

Doug Lawrence

- The hotel business will not come back for a while, can the retirement homes be used as such.
 - O Chair Arnold responded he did not believe those areas to be zoned appropriately. Keith Dalton confirmed Chair Arnold's comment, but can double check if needed.

Kara Rodriguez

- It is obviously not a great time for a hotel to start new projects, but knowing that is there
 anything that can be done now to get potential sites ready for development when
 activities pick back up.
 - Felicia Hart responded we need to have sites pad-ready, infrastructure in place.
 The community needs to invest in the project.
- Has there been any thought given to our Economic Development Facebook Page, changing the image so it is not a map?
 - o Felicia Hart responded she is working on that but yes that is the plan.

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Chris Boies provided a COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic Update:

 The vaccination clinic being held at the Clarke County High School will have to begin turning people away as they have allotted all available vaccines on hand to people waiting. Some school employees were able to get in to get their vaccinations.

 - Historical Association/Mill, Equine Alliance, Farmers Market,
 Fairgrounds, and many others
- EDAC
 - Originally discussed/appointed by the Board of Supervisors in 1999/2000.
 - o Initial Charge:
 - Review revenue needs and offer ideas for revenue generation
 - Offer advice to BoS, County Administrator, and the Economic Development Director concerning economic development activities
 - A broad charge for them to work on
 - Talented people on the group who feel they have not been utilized, as they would like to
- IDA
- Legal entity created by the BoS with authority granted by the Code of Virginia.
 - They have special powers localities don't
 - Make grants to private entities
 - Buy/Sell/Lease property without a public hearing
 - o develop industrial parks
 - Issue bonds for the benefit of private entities
 - Make loans to private entities/forgive repayment of those loans
 - They are also:
 - The economic development cheerleaders
 - Eyes/ears of the business community

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- Help elected officials analyze opportunities, determine needs, and generally keep them informed on the status of the business community.
- o Could become an "Economic Development Authority" with the same powers.
 - The only cost associated with this is changing paperwork
 - A more encompassing type of name
 - IDA's, historically, are thought of as helping a business park grow and expand but they should be helping small businesses too
- Berryville-Clarke County Joint Committee on Economic Development and Tourism
 - Consists of two (2) members of the Board of Supervisors, and two (2) Town Council members.
 - Ensures the joint efforts/cooperation on economic development activities in and around the Town of Berryville.
 - o Provides one (1) direction to the Economic Development Director.
 - o Ensures joint funding of the economic development position.
- Basic Functions of a Local Economic Development Program
 - o Placemaking/Tourism
 - o Business Retention/Expansion
 - o Growing Your Own-small business/entrepreneurs
 - o Business Attraction
- Placemaking/Tourism
 - Showcasing your community's special attributes/vibrancy
 - Two-fold effort bringing people to your community to visit, spend money, then go home/also key for existing and new businesses
 - o Talent/Workforce number one concern for expansion/relocation
 - Quality of Life Schools, healthcare, events, recreation, neighborhoods, and community pride, etc.
- Business Retention/Expansion
 - 2019 Virginia Economic Development Partnership (VEDP):
 - 67% of all announcements regarding new and expanding businesses were from existing Virginia businesses
 - 68% of job announcements were from existing Virginia businesses
 - 54% of capital investments were from existing Virginia businesses
 - Need a coordinated program, site visits, check-ins
 - Thought would be to have members of these groups be assigned business to check in throughout the year
 - Anticipate local business needs/identify problems before they arise
 - Build a strong business climate/create business champions
 - Strategies/approach different for corporate vs downtown businesses
 - The approach for a large business, such as Berryville Graphics, will be a very different approach than one for a small, Mom-and-Pop type of business on Main Street.

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- Growing Your Own-small business/entrepreneurs
 - o Extensive support networks needed
 - o High percentage of failure in the first two (2) years
 - o Business incubators
 - o Educational programs for would-be entrepreneurs
 - o Small Business Development center at Lord Fairfax Community College
- Business Attraction
 - o By far the most expensive endeavor/most visible headlines
 - Very competitive localities with strong incentive programs
 - o In Clarke, very targeted and limited due to strong Comprehensive Plan
 - Ensures we maintain a sense of place
 - o Focus right now on already properly zoned vacant properties/buildings.
 - o History of very successful business park
- Regional Perspective
 - o Businesses look at regions, not just jurisdictional boundaries
 - o Established relationship with Frederick County and the City of Winchester
 - Coordination with the State
 - Virginia Economic Development Partnership
 - Virginia Economic Developer's Association
 - o Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership
 - o Shenandoah Valley Travel Association
- Projects in and around Berryville
 - Board of Supervisors and Town Council thoughts filter through the Berryville-Clarke
