#### Other projects:

#### **Economic Development**

- Broadband Our VATI grant for universal broadband coverage in Clarke County was approved by the State. Now we are waiting on the MOU from them in order to better plan for the next steps and overall timeline.
- We continue to work one-on-one with the Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center. Numerous (9) local business introductions have been made, which the LFSBDC has immediately followed up with.
- Met with the owner of the LGV group and his property manager. I've since made numerous introductions, including local businesses, local realtors, EDAs in Winchester and Frederick County, along with introductions to the Lord Fairfax Small

- Business Development Center and to both the Virginia Economic Development Partnership (VEDP) and the Virginia Economic Developers Association (VEDA). I continue to have regular conversations with all entities.
- We are developing an Agritourism summit in partnership with Winchester/Frederick County to bring our local farmers together for a meet/greet. At this conference, we will be discussing their needs (local/state) to better determine how we can be of assistance to them. We have already reached out to the leadership of the Clarke County Farmer's Market to participate. We are looking at a meeting at the end of February that will be hosted here in Clarke County at the Ruritan grounds.
- Have reached out to the group that purchased the Battletown Inn to see if I can be of assistance.
  - Chris Boies noted this project is currently on hold for the owners to deal with some structural issues.
- We continue to work closely with the Clarke County Farmer's Market to not only help promote their events but also assist them with regional/state/federal events and potential fundings for their members.
- Continue to plan the new Economic Development website. I am still researching resources from fellow EDA's, the State's EDA site, and other potential resources.
- We continue to work closely with local realtors to get a heads up on properties that will be coming on the market soon. This allows us to work one on one with them and make introductions to appropriate business owners.
- We have made several introductions to property owners in the Waterloo area.
   These introductions are from realtors/businesses outside our area who are looking at potential properties.
- Clarke County will be represented again in the upcoming Widget Cup. This is a
  partnership between EDAs and the school systems in Winchester and Frederick and
  Clarke Counties. Clarke County currently holds the title.
- We are already working on the Economic Development Advisory Committee Spring Tour.
- I, along with the EDA Directors for Winchester and Frederick County, presented to the Top of Virginia Chamber's Leadership class. The discussion was on economic development and tourism.
- Clarke County Economic Development was represented at the Employer Expo hosted in Winchester at the War Memorial Building. In addition to serving on the planning committee, Clarke County had two local businesses host recruiting tables at the event. Wrap-up and planning for our next Expo is already in the works.
- Have met with the owner of Clarke Monthly to see how we can better collaborate
  on getting the word out about new programs/projects Clarke County is
  participating in and opportunities for our Clarke County citizens. Opportunities like
  the Habitat Home Repair program are out there, we just need to help get the word
  out.

- We continue to push the "Return to Earn" grant program that reimburses companies (up to \$500) for sign-on bonuses. This is a program through the Governor's office.
- We continue to make introductions for local companies that have an immediate hiring need. Introductions include Clarke County High School, Top of Virginia Chamber, Christine Kriz at Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center, United Way, and numerous local and state agencies.
- We continue to have monthly phone calls with representatives of the Virginia Economic Developers Association (VEDA).
- Continue to meet with Christy Dunkle for updates/catch-up.
- Continue to meet regularly with Clarke County's Planning and Zoning Directors for updates.
- I continue to regularly post upcoming events (training, meetings, etc.) on the Economic Facebook page.
- Work/talk continues regarding the water/sewer subsidiary program offered in the Waterloo area. I have made a presentation at the Blue Ridge Association of Realtors, have made other regional associations aware, and continue to talk with local property owners in the area about this. After a call from a local realtor, Chris and I met and talked with the Sanitary Authority about our fees and how they are determined.
- Work/talk continues on sewer/water in the Double Tollgate area from Frederick
   Water. Chris Boise has been regularly meeting with them to discuss the next steps.
- I continue to work directly with Shaine Coleman from Clarke County High School
  to make introductions to our local businesses. This includes working to find
  potential jobs in our area and also allows the students to "shadow" an employee to
  determine if they really are interested in that profession.
- I continue hosting weekly meetings with Frederick County and the City of Winchester EDAs. Also part of the group is Christine Kriz with Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center and Cynthia Snyder with the Top of Virginia Chamber.
- I want to personally thank Winchester, Frederick, and Shenandoah County for taking the lead on a new "talent website." I am currently updating information for Clarke County to this new site. This site provides an overview of our area and the quality of life that we offer.
- I continue to push the Small Business Resiliency Team regional program as part of the GOVirginia – this is in partnership with Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center. This program assists small businesses with access to free marketing, financial guidance, the creation of an e-commerce website, and accounting software.

#### **Tourism**

 Being aware of the disconnect between what is going on at the fairgrounds and what our local businesses know, and do not know, we have developed new relationships. I have joined the Ruritans to help bridge this gap. A "Welcome" piece for Ruritans to hand out to organizations who are renting/leasing fairground space is being produced. This handout will provide my contact information and give ideas on ways that we can assist them in not only promoting their event but making introductions to local businesses that can be of assistance to them.

- Lucketts Market is already committed to two events this year one in May and one in October.
- We can provide them the links to "Places to Stay" and "Things to Do" while their vendors and attendees are here and share any specials or discounts local businesses would like to offer.
- We are looking at additional signage opportunities at the fairgrounds to remind attendees of our Main Street and what else Clarke County has to offer.
- Continue to write blogs for state, regional, and local use.
- As mentioned earlier, we will be hosting an Agritourism Summit here in Clarke County at the end of February. This is a partnership with Winchester/Frederick County, and all farmers/farm markets will be invited.
- We are promoting the fairgrounds as a place that can be rented for outdoor/indoor events. We are targeting the Northern Virginia area to help promote this space – especially with COVID restrictions.
- Continue conversations with our local farmers/farm markets about needs and opportunities, and we continue to promote them regionally.
- We continue to post regular updates on the Tourism Facebook page highlighting upcoming events, places to visit, and things to do.
- Clarke County hosted space at the Virginia Welcome Center in Clear Brook, VA, for the month of December. In addition to the Clarke County marketing, numerous non-profits also had displayed. This marketing allows Clarke County to get in front of over 40,000 visitors.
- We have expanded blog opportunities listings with the Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership (SVTP) and the Shenandoah Valley Travel Association (SVTA) and are sharing these with the Virginia Tourism Corporation (VTC).
- Distribution of the ARPA funds through the Virginia Tourism Corporation is in the works. Discussions about new rack cards, ways to promote/improve the experience at the Clarke County Visitors Center, and additional signage at the fairgrounds are topics of discussion.
- We are working closely with local photographers to share their talents/images on our Tourism website and through our social media.
- I would like to (again) acknowledge the new partnership between the Berryville
   Main Street Program and the Barns of Rose Hill. This partnership provides:
  - An opportunity for Clarke County, Berryville Main Street, and the Barns to reach a broader audience to disseminate information in a timelier manner.
  - We already hosted our first quarterly Meet/Greets (two meetings) and had wonderful turnouts at both events.

- We will start hosting quarterly Meet/Greet for new residents of Berryville and Clarke County. Our first event will be on April 11<sup>th</sup> at the Barns of Rose Hill. This will give us an opportunity to help new residents understand the Town vs. the county and what services are provided by each, introductions to our local non-profits and volunteer opportunities here in Clarke County, handouts from local businesses/organizations, and an opportunity for new residents to ask questions.
- We have developed a social media calendar with all the national holidays and "national days." This will allow us to plan marketing around specific events. Marketing would include our three entities and local businesses and organizations to allow for an even greater audience reach.
- We are producing Welcome Bags with information about the Town/County, coupons/ brochures from local businesses, information about local nonprofits.
- We continue the conversation about a mural program here in the Town/County. We could become part of the Appalachian Mural Trail program that would give us an even broader audience.
- We continue to explore the opportunity to become a WonderLOVE community through the Virginia Tourism Corporation. This statewide program would give us another targeted audience.
- The Barns just hosted their first "Dinner and a Show" event that was sold out. If an attendee provided a receipt from a local restaurant for dinner, they get a reduced rate to attend the show. We will continue to push social media between the three of us to help get the word out. Additional marketing opportunities are being explored.
- We will be looking at the production of a new rack card incorporating businesses in the Town and the County and a possible coupon card.
- Berryville Main Street will be producing its own website. This will enable the
  three organizations to share more information, provide links to each other's
  sites and provide a more cohesive message to not only our community but
  to our visitors as well.
- We continue exploring ways to host a "Community Calendar" on the Berryville Main Street's website.
- Work is in progress to develop a "Local Love" program/campaign

#### Doug Lawrence

 Asked if it were possible to have the Sheriff's Office allow traffic to make a left-hand turn out of the fairgrounds when events are happening? Feels it would serve the county to direct citizens into town instead of Route 7.

- Jay Arnold agreed, adding it was an inconvenience and safety hazard not to allow a left-hand turn because drivers end up making a U-turn at Jim Barnett Park and then work their way back into town. Chris Boies stated he would bring this up to the Sheriff.
- Inquired if the lights could be extended further down towards the park and if grants could be found to help fund that type of project.
  - Jay Arnold agreed and believed it shouldn't cost too much to upgrade the lights.
  - o Chris Boies stated he would look into it.

- Stated the Town of Berryville was getting ready to distribute ARPA funds to businesses to use for the improvement of the buildings to include painting, facade, handicap accessible ramps, handrails, etc.

  - Christy Dunkle added that Berryville Main Street would also be advocating for the Town of Berryville with this project.

## **Citizens Academy Discussion**

# Update by Felicia Hart – Director of Economic Development and Tourism

#### Other projects:

#### **Economic Development**

Broadband – Our VATI grant for universal broadband coverage in Clarke County was approved by the State. The Board of Supervisors will get an update this week on the joint MOU.

I continue to work one-on-one with the Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center (LFSBDC). Eight local business introductions have been made to which the LFSBDC has immediately followed up with. See report (attached) from LFSBDC regarding the previous 61 businesses they worked directly with and the capital amounts.

We developed an Agribusiness summit in partnership with Winchester/Frederick County to bring our local farmers/farm markets/wanna be's together for a meet/greet. The first meeting was hosted in February at the Clarke County Ruritan fairgrounds with almost 100 attendees. We just hosted our follow up meeting and had 28 people attend. This Agribusiness group was designed to understand their needs, and learn the commonalities so we can better assist them. We are working in partnership with our local Extension Agents and other government entities to educate the farmers at the same time. *See attached flyer*.

I continue to work closely with the Clarke County Farmer's Market to not only help promote their events, but to also assist them with regional/state/federal events and potential fundings for their members. They were a big part of getting the word out about our Agribusiness event. I just provided them with upcoming state training and grant opportunities. They, in turn, pass that information along to their members. This is a wonderful partnership.

I continue to work closely with local realtors to get a heads up of properties that will be coming on the market soon and what properties just sold. This allows us to work one on one with them and make introductions to appropriate potential business owners. I will be participating in their upcoming meeting in May to give them an update on the programs here in Clarke County including the water subsidy in Waterloo and the water/sewer update in Double Tollgate along with what is going on in town.

Clarke County High School, along with Sherando, James Wood and Handley, just recently participated in the Widget Cup. It was hosted at the new innovation center in Winchester. These teams had to design, build and market a needed product for a local business. They were judged on different categories throughout the day. Clarke County proudly took home the trophy again this year.

The Economic Development Advisory Committee happened earlier this week with a tour of Audley Farm and the Grafton facility.

I, along with the EDA Directors for Winchester and Frederick County presented to the Top of Virginia Chamber's Leadership class. Discussion was on economic development and tourism.

I am working with the Virginia Regional Transit group to promote local bus service that is available to all residents in Berryville/Clarke County. This curb-to-curb service allows our seniors and those in need of transportation, a way to get to shopping and needed appointments. See attached flyer.

I am working directly with the new property owner on Cattleman's Lane regarding warehouse space that is now available. We are scheduling an on-site meeting of the facility and then will work to put together a marketing plan for regional realtors. This will also include an update to the Virginia Economic Developers Partnership.

Clarke County Economic Development will again be working on, and with, the upcoming Employer Expo hosted in Winchester at the War Memorial Building in May. I serving on the planning committee and work to encourage our local businesses to participate by hosting their own hiring tables. We are currently pushing this information out to our local businesses. See flyers attached.

I had a working meeting with the Mayor and Town Manager of Boyce to discuss their needs and talk about opportunities they could take advantage of. I have encouraged them to pass along my contact information.

We continue to make introductions for local companies who have an immediate hiring need. Introductions include Clarke County High School, Top of Virginia Chamber, Christine Kriz at Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center, United Way, and numerous local and state agencies.

I continue to have monthly phone calls with representatives of the Virginia Economic Developers Association (VEDA).

Continue to meet regularly with Christy Dunkle for updates/catch up.

Continue to meet regularly with Clarke County's Planning and Zoning Directors for updates.

I am working with another company here in town that has recently consolidated work showroom space and will now have their old showroom space available.

Talk continues on sewer/water in the Double Tollgate area from Frederick Water. County Administrator Chris Boise just gave an update to the Board of Supervisors.

I continue to work directly with Shaine Coleman from Clarke County High School to make introductions to our local businesses for those students who may not be attending college. This includes working to find potential jobs in our area and allows the students to "shadow" an employee to determine if they are really interested in that profession. I just recently made introduction to the Winchester Airport Authority to schedule a field trip there and updated Shaine on a new program in the City of Winchester collaborating with the local high school.

I continue hosting weekly meetings with Frederick County and City of Winchester EDAs. Also part of the group is Christine Kriz with Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center and Cynthia Snyder with the Top of Virginia Chamber.

I continue to work with Winchester, Frederick and Shenandoah County on the new Talent website. I am currently updating information for Clarke County to this new site. This site provides an overview of our area and the quality of life that we offer.

Last year our Small Business Resiliency Team regional program grant from GOVirginia – in partnership with Lord Fairfax Small Business Development Center was so popular that we have applied for, and won – the grant again this year. This program assists any small business with access to free marketing, financial guidance, creation of an e-commerce website and accounting software. We will be starting our campaign to promote this soon.

#### **Tourism**

I am working closely with the Ruritans Fairgrounds to promote their facility. I've produced a handout for them to give to entities who lease their facility explaining how I can not only assist them in marketing their event, but also connect them with local businesses they may need for their event. See attached handout. In addition, we

- Provide them links to "Places to Stay" and "Things to Do" while their vendors and attendees are here – and share any specials or discounts local businesses would like to offer.
- We are looking at additional signage opportunities at the fairgrounds to remind attendees of our Main Street, Visitors Center and what else Clarke County has to offer.
- I am promoting the fairgrounds as a place that can be rented for outdoor/indoor events to the Northern Virginia area. I have also made the state Tourism Corporation aware of this space.
- In addition, I am reaching out to other event managers that I have worked with in other localities to make them aware of this facility.
- Lucketts Market has already signed up for two events one coming up in May and another one in October.
- Watermelon Pickers has already signed on.
- HamFest is signed on.
- Blandy Farm will host its Mother's Day Gardening Show there again this year.
- The Steam Show hosted their two-day toy show there and will host their annual Steam Show event later this year.

I continue to write blogs for state, regional and local use.

Clarke County hosted space at the Virginia Welcome Center in Clear Brook, VA for the month of March – in partnership with the Shenandoah Valley Travel Association. This marketing allows Clarke County to get in front of an average of 40,000 visitors.

We have expanded blog opportunities listings with the Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership (SVTP) and the Shenandoah Valley Travel Association (SVTA) and are sharing these with the Virginia Tourism Corporation (VTC).

I am working with representatives from Blandy and the Blue Ridge Wildlife to promote the "Take a Hike" in Clarke County. This would be a play off the existing flyer produced by the Clarke County Conservation group that showcases trails/paths in the Town/County.

Distribution of the ARPA funds through the Virginia Tourism Corporation (VTC) are still in the works. Discussions about new rack cards, ways to promote/improve the experience at the Clarke County Visitors Center and additional signage at the fairgrounds are topics of discussion. This is a work in progress while trying to work through VTC's new program.

I would (again) like to acknowledge the partnership between the Berryville Main Street Program and the Barns of Rose Hill. This partnership provides:

 An opportunity for Clarke County, Berryville Main Street and the Barns to reach a broader audience to disseminate information in a timelier manner.

- We already hosted our first Business Meet/Greet (two meetings) and had wonderful turnouts at both events.
- We just hosted our first New Comers meeting and had terrific turnout from new residents. Numerous non-profits had tables and were able to introduce themselves. At this meeting we handed out Welcome Bags filled with about 50 items from the Town of Berryville/Clarke County government and numerous local businesses and non-profits. Additional bags have been distributed to the Town of Berryville, the Commissioner's Office, the Barns of Rose Hill and with Berryville Main Street.
- We continue to explore the opportunity to become a WonderLOVE community through the Virginia Tourism Corporation. This statewide program that would give us another targeted audience.
- The Barns hosted their latest "Dinner and a Show" event and it was sold out. If an attendee provided a receipt from a local restaurant for dinner, they got a reduced rate to attend the show. We continue to push social media between the three of us and we helped distribute flyers and tent cards to numerous restaurants. See attached flyer.
- We are still in discussion about producing a "Restaurant Week" program during the year. This would allow us to highlight all that Berryville/Clarke County has to offer – both to locals and outsiders.
- We will be looking at the production of a new rack card incorporating businesses in the Town and the County.
- Work is in progress to develop a "Local Love" program/campaign
- Regionally, through our partnership in the Shenandoah Valley Tourism Partnership
  (SVTP) Clarke County is now a part of the Fields of Gold trail program. All farms
  (accepting visitors), farm markets, wineries, and agritourism businesses will be able to
  participate free of charge.

# Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Between The Town of Berryville and Clarke County Regarding Economic Development and Tourism

- WHEREAS, the Town of Berryville and Clarke County have previously entered into a MOU regarding economic development and tourism and now wish to update that document; and
- WHEREAS, the Town of Berryville and Clarke County over the past four decades have worked cooperatively to promote a unique and highly successful land use philosophy that focuses growth and development within the Town while preserving the County's natural, historical, and agricultural resources; and
- WHEREAS, the County's small land area, close proximity to four surrounding urban growth areas, and limited access to public water and sewer capacity make the sharing of Economic Development resources a necessity; and
- WHEREAS, the future of economic development including business, retail, industry, agriculture, and Tourism in Clarke County is dependent upon effective collaboration and cooperation between the Town and County;
- AND WHEREAS, the Town and the County recognize that combining resources and creating unified points of contact for Economic Development and Tourism will enable our communities to more efficiently address the needs of new and existing businesses, streamline regulations and regulatory processes, and more effectively market our unique assets.
- **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Town of Berryville and Clarke County agree to work cooperatively to implement the following action items:
- Joint Management of Economic Development and Tourism. The Town and County shall jointly manage the Economic Development and Tourism efforts in Clarke County and the Town of Berryville on an ongoing basis.
- 2. Single Points of Contact for Economic Development and Tourism. Both the Town and County agree that it would be best if the business community dealt with a single point of contact for Economic Development and Tourism. The point of contact will be the Clarke County Director of Economic Development & Tourism. The Town Director of Community Development will serve as the primary liaison to the County Director of Economic Development & Tourism for economic and tourism activities in the Town.
- 3. <u>Joint Committee for Economic Development and Tourism</u>. The Berryville/Clarke County Joint Committee for Economic Development and Tourism shall consist of two members of the Board of Supervisors and two members of the Town Council. The Committee shall elect a Chair and Vice Chair annually, rotating between the Town and County. For example, when the Chair position is held by an elected representative of the Town, the Vice Chair position shall be held by an elected official of the County. In the following year the Chair position would be held by an elected official of the County and the Vice Chair position held by an elected official of the Town. The Committee shall

meet as it determines necessary to conduct the business of the Committee as described in this MOU. The County Administrator and Town Manager (or designee) shall provide staff support to the Committee.

- 4. <u>Economic & Tourism Development Director.</u> The County will employ the director of economic development and tourism. This position will report to the County Administrator. A job description is attached as an appendix to this MOU. The funding for this position will be shared between the Town and County with the Town providing \$17,500 in FY 21, \$18,500 in FY 22, and \$19,500 in FY 23.
- 5. Goals. The Committee will annually set goals and priorities for economic development and tourism with clear direction on who is responsible for those goals and priorities. A status report on the progress of those goals will be provided annually to the Committee by those responsible for the achievement of the goals.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT it is expected that this Memorandum of Understanding will be modified as the Town and County learn from their experiences. This MOU shall renew automatically on July 1, 2021 and annually on July 1 thereafter, however either the Town or County may choose to request the opportunity to review or modify this MOU with provision of 60 days of notice to the other party. Either party may cancel this MOU with provision of written notice to the other party no later than May 1 of each year.
